EXPLANATORY NOTE

This bill seeks to declare the Agoo-Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape in the Municipalities of Agoo, Sto. Tomas and Rosario, La Union as a protected area.

The Agoo-Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape, which covers 10,649 hectares, bears unique and lush biological, geological and hydrological features. Aside from its rich terrestrial and aquatic vegetation, major rivers are located within the protected area which includes the Agoo river, Cupang river and Bani river. Also found in this area are no less than fifteen (15) species of birds and certain species of reptiles and fishes.

Recognizing its value, the area was established by virtue of Republic Act No. 4570 dated June 19. 1965 and later affirmed as Agoo-Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape by virtue of Presidential Proclamation No. 277, dated April 23, 2005.

This bill, therefore, seeks to declare the Agoo-Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape as a protected area in order to protect it from indiscriminate exploitation and to be able to maintain its ecological balance and preserve its source of water supply.

Given the importance of biodiversity, it is deemed crucial that we act on this now to ensure that our children and the succeeding generations will inherit a living earth with all of its bountiful natural resources and vibrant wildlife.

In view of the foregoing, the passage of this measure is earnestly urged.

AN ACT

ESTABLISHING THE AGOO-DAMORTIS PROTECTED SEASCAPE AND LANDSCAPE IN THE MUNICIPALITIES OF AGOO, STO. TOMAS AND ROSARIO, IN THE PROVINCE OF LA UNION AS A PROTECTED AREA, PROVIDING FOR ITS MANAGEMENT AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Title. - This Act shall be known as the "Agoo-Damortis Protected 1 Seascape and Landscape Act of 2010." 2

SEC. 2. Land Classification. - All lands of the public domain comprising the 3 Agoo-Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape shall fall under the classification of 4

National Park as provided for in the Philippine Constitution. 5

SEC. 3. Scope and Coverage. - The Agoo-Damortis Protected Seascape and 6 Landscape, located within the Municipalities of Agoo, Sto. Tomas and Rosario in the 7 Province of La Union is hereby declared a protected area and categorized as a 8 protected seascape and landscape pursuant to Republic Act No. 7586, otherwise 9 known as the National Integrated Protected Areas Act of 1992 or the NIPAS Act. 10

 (151.92) hectares, more or less, as buffer zone subject to ground verification.

The Agoo-Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape shall have a total aggregate area of approximately ten thousand six hundred twenty-nine and 22/100 (10,629.22) hectares, subject to actual ground survey.

The technical descriptions provided in this Act will be subject to ground survey and verification to be conducted by the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR). Any modification on this Act due to factors such as changing ecological situations, new scientific or discovery of traditional boundaries not previously taken into account shall be made through an act of Congress passed after full consultation with the affected public.

24 SEÇ. 4. *Definition of Terms.* – For purposes of this Act, the following terms are 25 defined as follows:

(a) "Biodiversity" refers to variety and variability among living organisms and the
 ecological complexes in which said organisms occur.

(b) "Biological resources" includes genetic resources, organisms or parts
 thereof, population, or any other biotic component of ecosystems with actual or
 potential use or value for humanity.

(c) "Bioprospecting" means the research, collection and utilization of biological
 and genetic resources for purposes of applying the knowledge derived therefrom solely
 for commercial purposes.

(d) "Buffer Zone" is the identified area outside the boundaries of Agoo-Damortis
 Protected Seascape and Landscape and immediately adjacent to designated protected
 area that need special development control in order to avoid or minimize harm to the
 Agoo-Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape.

(e) "By-product or derivatives" means any part taken or substance extracted
 from wildlife, in raw or in processed form. This includes stuffed animals and herbarium
 specimens.

4 (f) "Collection or collecting" is the act of gathering or harvesting wildlife, its by-5 products or derivatives.

(g) "Conservation" means sustainable utilization of wildlife, and/or maintenance,
 restoration and enhancement of the habitat.

(h) "Endangered species" refers to species or subspecies of flora and fauna that
 is not critically endangered but whose survival in the wild is unlikely if the causal factors
 continue operating.

(i) "Endemic species" means species or subspecies of flora and fauna which is
 naturally occurring and found only within specific areas in the country.

(j) "Exotic species" means species or subspecies of flora and fauna which do not
 naturally occur within the protected area at present or in historical time.

15 (k) "Habitat" means a place or type of environment where a species or 16 subspecies naturally occurs or has naturally established its population.

(I) "Hunting" refers to collection of wild fauna for food and/or recreational
 purposes with the use of weapons such as guns, bow and arrow, spear and the like.

(m) "Management plan" refers to the fundamental plan, strategy and/or scheme
 which shall guide all activities relating to the Agoo-Damortis Protected Seascape and
 Landscape in order to attain the objectives of this Act.

(n) "Mineral" refers to all naturally occurring inorganic substance in solid, gas,
 liquid, or any intermediate state including energy materials such as coal, petroleum,
 natural gas, radioactive materials, and geothermal energy;

(o) "Multiple-Use Zone" refers to an area where settlement, traditional and/or
 sustainable land use, including agriculture, agro-forestry, extraction activities and other
 income generating or livelihood activities, may be allowed to the extent prescribed in
 the IPAP/PAMP.

(p) "National Integrated Protected Areas System (NIPAS)" is the classification
 and administration of all designated protected areas to maintain essential ecological
 processes and life-support systems, to preserve genetic diversity, to ensure
 sustainable use of resources found therein, and to maintain their natural conditions to
 the greatest extent possible.

(q) "National Park" refers to the land of the public domain classified as such in
 the 1987 Constitution which include all areas under the National Integrated Protected
 Areas System (NIPAS) pursuant to R.A. 7586 primarily designated for the conservation
 of native plants and animals, their associated habitats and cultural diversity.

(r) "Non-government organization (NGO)" refers to an agency, institution,
 foundation or a group of persons whose purpose is to assist people's
 organizations/associations in various ways including, but not limited to, organizing,
 education, training, research and/or resource accessing.

(s) "People's organization" refers to a group of organized migrant communities
and or interested indigenous peoples which may be an association, cooperative,
federation, or other legal entity, established to undertake collective action to address
community concerns and needs, and mutually share the benefits of the endeavor.

9 (t) "Protected Area" refers to the identified portions of land and/or water set 10 aside by reason of their unique physical and biological significance, managed to 11 enhance biological diversity and protected against destructive human exploitation.

(u) "Protected Area Management Board (PAMB)" refers to the management
 body within the site, responsible for deciding the allocation for budget, and decisions
 on matters relating to planning, peripheral protection, and general administration of the
 Agoo-Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape in accordance with the General
 Management Plan.

(v) "Protected Landscape/Seascape" refers to an area of national significance
 which are characterized by the harmonious interaction of man and land while providing
 opportunities for public enjoyment through recreation and tourism within the normal
 lifestyle and economic activity of these areas.

21 (w) "Quarrying" means the process of extracting, removing and disposing quarry 22 resources found on or underneath the surface of private or public land.

(x) "Strict protection zone" is a natural area with high biodiversity value which shall be closed to all human activity except for scientific studies and/or ceremonial or religious use by the indígenous cultural communities/indigenous peoples; may include habitats of threatened species, or degraded areas that have been designated for restoration and subsequent protection, even if these areas are still in various stages of regeneration.

(y) "Sustainable use" means the use of components of biological diversity in a
 way and rate that does not lead to the long-term decline of biological diversity, thereby
 maintaining its potential to meet the needs and aspirations of present and future
 generations.

(z) "Tenured migrant" refers to occupants who have actually and continuously
 occupied a portion of the Agoo-Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape and is
 solely dependent therein for subsistence. An Agoo-Damortis Protected Seascape and
 Landscape occupant is understood to be "solely dependent for subsistence" when
 everything indispensable for survival for the household, including food, clothing, shelter

and health, comes only from the utilization of resources from the Agoo-Damortis
 Protected Seascape and Landscape.

(aa) "Wildlife" means wild forms and varieties of flora and fauna, in all
 developmental stages, including those which are in captivity or are being bred or
 propagated.

6 SEC. 5. *Management of Agoo-Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape*. – 7 There is hereby created a Protected Area Management Board (PAMB) which shall 8 have jurisdiction, power and authority over the Agoo- Damortis Protected Seascape 9 and Landscape for all matters that may affect biodiversity conservation, protection and 10 sustainable development. The members of the PAMB are as follows:

(a) The DENR Regional Executive Director (RED) of Region II, as chairperson;

(b) The Provincial Planning and Development Officer (PPDO) of the Provinceof La Union;

(c) The Mayors of the Municipalities of Agoo, Sto. Tomas and Rosario in the
 Province of La Union, or their duly designated representatives;

(d) One representative from each of the Agoo-Damortis Protected Seascapeand Landscape;

(e) At least two (2) representatives from local POs with stakes in the Agoo Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape, chosen among themselves;

(f) At least three (3) representatives from the local NGOs with stakes in the
 Agoo-Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape, chosen from among themselves;
 and

(g) One representative from each government agency involved in the Agoo Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape.

Each member of the PAMB shall serve for a term of five (5) years and shall be considered to represent his or her sector and deemed to carry the vote of such sector in all matters. In the case of members who are government officials, their appointment shall be co-terminus with their term of office.

The members of the PAMB shall be appointed by the Secretary of the DENR in conformity with the provisions of the NIPAS Act. As a transitory provision, the initial members of the PAMB shall be nominated from the current members of the interim PAMB of the Agoo-Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape. Their nominations shall be conducted in a joint meeting of the current members of the interim PAMB duly called for the purpose: *Provided*, That at least one- third (1/3) of the members shall be women.

In the selection of the representatives of POs and NGOs, preference shall be accorded to those organizations that are involved in the conservation, protection and development of the Agoo-Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape.

Representation shall be by institution and shall aim to achieve balance in
 representation by geographic location or areas.

The representatives from the Local Government Units (LGUs) and national agencies in the PAMB shall include among their duty to inform their respective constituents, office or sector of PAMB approved or other relevant policies, rules, regulations, programs and projects and to ensure that the provisions of this Act is are observed, complied with, and used as reference and framework in their respective plans, policies, programs and projects. Failure to comply with the foregoing shall subject such representative to disciplinary action as the PAMB may provide.

The members of the Board shall not receive any salary but shall be entitled to reimbursements for actual and necessary expenses incurred, either in their attendance in meetings of the Board or in connection with other official business authorized by a resolution of the Board, subject to existing rules and regulations.

14 SEC. 6. *Powers and Functions of the PAMB.* – The PAMB of the Agoo-15 Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape, which shall decide by consensus or 16 majority vote, shall have the following duties and functions in addition to those provided 17 in the NIPAS Act and its Implementing Rules and Regulations:

(a) Issue rules and regulations to prohibit acts that may be prejudicial to the
 Agoo-Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape and to the declaration of policy set
 forth under the NIPAS;

(b) Issue rules and regulations for the resolution of conflicts through
 appropriate and effective means;

(c) Adopt rules and procedures in the conduct of business, including the
 creation of committees to which its powers may be delegated;

(d) Approve the management plan and oversee the office of the Protected
 Area Superintendent (PASu);

(e) Establish criteria and set fees for the issuance of permits for activities
 regulated by this Act or the management plan;

(f) Recommend the deputization of appropriate individuals for the enforcement
 of the laws, rules and regulations governing the conduct or management of the Agoo Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape;

(g) Approve fees and charges in accordance with DAO 51, Series of 2000 and
 raise funds for the Agoo-Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape;

(h) Manage the allocation of the Agoo-Damortis Protected Seascape and
 Landscape Fund, and other funds for the Agoo-Damortis Protected Seascape and
 Landscape, ensure their proper administration and render accounting; and

(i) Recommend appropriate policy changes to the DENR and other governmentauthorities.

The DENR, through the Regional Executive Director (RED) shall ensure that the 1 2 PAMB acts within the scope of its powers and functions. In case of conflict between the administrative orders issued by the DENR pursuant to the NIPAS Act and the 3 resolutions issued by the PAMB, such conflict shall be referred by PAMB to the DENR 4 Secretary who shall decide whether to apply the rule or withdraw its application from 5 the Agoo- Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape. 6

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SEC. 7. The Protected Area Superintendent (PASu) Office. - There is hereby established a Protected Area Superintendent (PASu) Office in charge of the 8 implementation of the projects, programs and policies for the management, protection 9 and administration of the Agoo-Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape. It will be 10 headed by a Protected Area Superintendent (PASu) and shall be supported by the 11 existing personnel of the DENR. The PASu shall be the Chief Operating DENR Officer 12 of the Agoo-Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape and shall be accountable to 13 the RED of the DENR-Region I and the PAMB. 14

15 The PASu shall have full responsibility for the protection of land, water, wildlife, and other natural physical and biological resources within the Agoo-Damortis Protected 16 Seascape and Landscape, As such, the PASu shall have the following duties and 17 responsibilities in addition to those provided under NIPAS and its Implementing Rules 18 19 and Regulations:

(a) Establish, operate and maintain a database management system as 20 decision support tool; 21

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(b) Prepare the management plans as herein defined;

(c) Provide a secretariat for the PAMB and supply the PAMB with all the 23 necessary information to make appropriate decisions for the implementation of this Act; 24

(d) Enforce the laws, rules and regulations relevant to the Agoo-Damortis 25 Protected Seascape and Landscape, institute and file legal action independently or in 26 collaboration with other governmental agencies or organizations and assist in the 27 prosecution of offenses committed in violation of this Act; 28

(e) Monitor all activities within the Agoo-Damortis Protected Seascape and 29 Landscape to ensure its conformity with the management plan; 30

(f) Recommend the issuance of permits based on terms, conditions and criteria 31 32 established by the PAMB; and

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(g) Perform such other functions as the PAMB may delegate.

The PASu shall be supported by a sufficient number of personnel who shall be 34 performing day to day management, protection and administration of Agoo-Damortis 35 Protected Seascape and Landscape. Upon recommendation of the PAMB, the DENR 36 Regional Director shall deputize local community leaders and environment and natural 37 38 resource officers.

SEC. 8. Special Prosecutor and Retained Counsel. - Within thirty (30) days 1 from the effectivity of this Act, the Department of Justice (DOJ) shall appoint a special 2 prosecutor to whom all cases of violation of laws, rules and regulations in the Agoo-3 Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape shall be assigned. Such Special 4 Prosecutor shall coordinate with the PAMB and the PASu in the performance of his/her 5 duties and assist in the training of wardens and rangers in arrest and criminal 6 procedures. The PAMB may retain the services of a counsel to prosecute and/or assist 7 in the prosecution of cases under the direct control and supervision of the regular or 8 special prosecutor and to defend the members of the PAMB, the PASu and the staff, 9 or any person assisting in the protection, conservation and sustainable development of 10 the Agoo-Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape, against any legal action 11 12 related to their powers, functions and responsibilities as provided in this Act or as delegated or tasked by the PAMB. 13

SEC. 9. Agoo-Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape Fund. - There is 14 hereby established a trust fund to be known as the Agoo- Damortis Protected 15 Seascape and Landscape Fund for purposes of financing projects of the Agoo-16 Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape. Seventy- five percent (75%) income 17 generated from the operation of the Agoo- Damortis Protected Seascape and 18 Landscape or management of wild flora and fauna in the Agoo- Damortis shall accrue 19 to the Fund. The remaining twenty- five percent (25%) shall go to the Integrated 20 Protected Areas Fund (IPAF) as established in the NIPAS Act of 1992. 21

Income shall be derived from visitors/ tourists fee, fees from permitted sale and export of flora and fauna and other resources from the Agoo- Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape, proceeds from the registration and lease of multiple-use areas, including tourism concessions, fees, proceeds, and contributions from industries and facilities directly benefiting from the protected seascape and landscape; and such other fees and incomes derived from the operation of the protected seascape and landscape.

The Agoo- Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape Fund may be augmented by grants, donations, endowment from various sources, domestic or foreign, for purposes related to their functions: *Provided*, That disbursements therefrom shall be made solely for the protection, maintenance, administration and management of the system, and duly approved projects endorsed by the PAMB in accordance with existing accounting and budgeting rules and regulations: *Provided*, *further*, That the Fund shall not be used to cover personal services expenditures.

The LGUs shall continue to impose and collect all other fees not enumerated herein which they have traditionally collected, such as business permits and rentals of LGUs facilities. *Provided, That* the LGU shall not impose property tax and issue tax

declaration for areas or properties located in timberland areas or areas previously classified as National Parks. Furthermore, LGUs may charge add-ons to fees imposed by the PAMB provided that such add-ons shall be based on the contribution of the LGUs in the maintenance and protection of the Agoo- Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape.

6 SEC. 10. Existing Facilities Within the Agoo- Damortis Protected Seascape and 7 Landscape. – Within sixty (60) days from the effectivity of this Act, major existing 8 facilities such as roads, buildings, water systems, transmission lines, communication 9 facilities, heavy equipment, and irrigation facilities existing within the boundaries of the 10 Agoo- Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape shall submit project description to 11 the PAMB through the PASu.

12 The PAMB, with the assistance of the DENR, shall determine whether the existence of such facility and its future plan and operations will be detrimental to the 13 Agoo- Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape or whether conditions for its 14 operation shall be imposed. If any such conditions are violated, the owner of the facility 15 shall be liable to pay a fine of Five Thousand Pesos (P5,000.00) for every violation. 16 Upon reaching a total fine of Five Hundred Thousand Pesos (P500,000.00), the PAMB 17 through the PASu and deputizing other government entities, shall cause the cessation 18 and demolition of the facility at the cost of its owner. 19

Existing facilities allowed to remain within the Agoo- Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape may be charged a reasonable royalty by the DENR. All income from such royalty shall accrue to the Agoo-Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape Fund.

SEC. 11. Utilization of Resources. ~ Any exploitation of or utilization of 24 nonrenewable resources within the Agoo- Damortis Protected Seascape and 25 Landscape shall not be allowed. Energy projects within the Agoo-Damortis Protected 26 Seascape and Landscape shall be permitted only through an act of Congress, except 27 energy from wind, sun, and water sources and not more than one (1) megawatt 28 capacity for mini-hydro power; Provided, that these renewable energy projects are 29 established outside the strict protection zone, adopt reduced impact technologies and 30 undergo the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) system as provided by law and: 31 Provided, Further, that the PAMB endorsement of the project has been obtained. 32

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SEC. 12. Tenured Migrants and Other Agoo- Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape Occupants. –

Tenured migrants shall be eligible to become stewards of portions of lands within allowable zones. The PAMB shall identify, verify and review all tenurial instruments, land claims and issuances of permits for resource use within the Agoo-Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape and recommend the issuance of the appropriate tenurial instrument consistent with the zoning provided in the management
 plan and its successor plans.

Should areas occupied by tenured migrants be designated as zones in which no occupation or other activities are allowed pursuant to the attainment of sustainable development, provision for their transfer of said tenured migrants to multiple-use zones or buffer zones shall be accomplished through just and humane means.

- In the event of termination of a tenurial instrument for cause or by voluntary surrender of rights, the PASu shall take immediate steps to rehabilitate the area in order to return it to its natural state prior to the cultivation or other act by the tenured migrant.
- 11 SEC. 13. *Appropriations*. The Secretary of the DENR shall immediately 12 include in the Department's program the implementation of this Act, the funding of 13 which shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act.

SEC. 14. *Reporting Responsibility*. – The PASu, through the PAMB, shall be responsible in the preparation of accomplishment reports on all activities undertaken in the Agoo- Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape for submission to the DENR Secretary.

18 SEC. 15. *Prohibited Acts and Penalties.* – The following prohibitions and 19 penalties are applicable to the Agoo- Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape, in 20 addition to the prohibited acts as provided in the NIPAS Act and its Implementing Rules 21 and Regulations:

(A) The penalties in Articles 309 and 310 of the Revised Penal Code,
 depending on the value of the resources involved in connection with the prohibited act,
 shall be imposed upon any person who:

(a) Takes, destroys, collects, disturbs or possesses any wild terrestrial or
aquatic plants, animals, flora or fauna, sand, rocks or by-products derived within
particularly identified regulated or prohibited areas zones in the Agoo- Damortis
Protected Seascape and Landscape including private lands without a the necessary
permit, authorization or exemption: *Provided*: That hunting of animals shall be
absolutely prohibited except for scientific research;

(b) Cuts, gathers, removes or collects timber or any forest products, within
 particularly identified regulated or prohibited areas or zones in the Agoo- Damortis
 Protected Seascape and Landscape including private lands without necessary permit,
 authorization or exemption;

(c) Possesses, transports within or outside the Agoo- Damortis Protected
 Seascape, and Landscape any timber, forest products, wild terrestrial or aquatic plants,
 animals; flora or fauna, or by- product derived therefrom which is ascertained to have
 been taken from the protected area.

(d) Undertakes mineral exploration or extraction within the Agoo- Damortis
 Protected Seascape and Landscape;

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(e) Engages in quarrying of sand, gravel, guano, limestone or any material
 within the Agoo- Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape;

(f) Hunts, collects, removes or destroys any endangered or protected species,
except when collection or removal is for scientific research and exempted from the
prohibition by the PAMB;

(g) Conducts bioprospecting within the Agoo- Damortis Protected Seascape and
 Landscape without prior PAMB approval in accordance with existing guidelines; and

(h) Establishes or introduces exotic species within the Agoo- Damortis Protected
 Seascape and Landscape which are detrimental to endemic species or without prior
 PAMB approval.

(B) A fine of not less than Five thousand pesos (P5,000.00) nor more than Five
 hundred thousand pesos (P500,000.00) and/or imprisonment from one (1) year but not
 more than six (6) years shall be imposed upon any person who:

(a) Violates any rules and regulations in the management plan or by the PAMB
 or agreements reached before the PAMB in the exercise of adjudicative functions;

(b) Erects any structure on land or on water for any purposes outside the management plan, duly allowed by the PAMB: *Provided*, That large-scale private infrastructure and other projects such as medium to high density residential subdivisions, medium to large commercial and industrial establishments, golf-courses, heavily mechanized commercial and non-traditional farming, and other activities that cause increased in-migration, pollution and resource degradation are absolutely prohibited;

(c) Possesses a chainsaw, hacksaw and other mechanized equipment within
 the without a permit;

(d) Throws, dumps or causes to be dumped into the Agoo- Damortis
 Protected Seascape and Landscape any non-biodegradable material or waste whether
 liquid, solid or gas;

(e) Uses, dumps, places or causes to be placed into the Agoo- Damortis
 Protected Seascape and Landscape toxic chemicals, including pesticides and other
 hazardous substances, unless the same is expressly allowed in the management plan;

(f) Prospects, hunts or otherwise locates hidden treasures within the Agoo Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape;

(g) Informally occupies or dwells in any land within the Agoo- Damortis
 Protected Seascape and Landscape without clearance from the PAMB;

(h) Possesses or uses blasting caps or explosives anywhere within the Agoo- Damortis
 Protected Seascape and Landscape;

(h) Destroys, excavates, vandalizes or, in any manner, damages any natural 1 formation on land, religious, spiritual, historical sites, artifacts and other objects of 2 natural or scenic value: 3

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(i) Alters, removes, or destroys any boundary markers, or signs;

(j) Engages in kaingin, or, in any manner, causing forest fires inside the Agoo-5 Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape; or 6

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(k) Purchases, or sells, mortgages, or leases lands or other portions of the Agoo- Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape which are covered by any tenurial 8 instrument. 9

10 Valuation of the damage for this Act shall take into account biodiversity and conservation considerations as well as aesthetic and scenic value. Valuation assessed 11 12 by the DENR or the concerned government agency shall be presumed correct unless otherwise proven by preponderant evidence. 13

14 Any person who shall induce another or conspire to commit any of the illegal acts prohibited in this Act or suffer their workers to commit any of the same shall be 15 liable in the same manner as the one actually performing the act. 16

17 All conveyances, vessels, equipments, paraphernalia, implements, gears, tools and similar devices shall be subject to immediate and administrative confiscation, 18 19 independent of the judicial proceedings by the PASu Office upon apprehension, subject however to due process and substantial evidence requirements. When legal 20 action is however filed in the regular courts, the said conveyances, vessels, 21 equipments, paraphernalia, implements, gears, tools and similar devices, independent 22 of the administrative proceedings, shall not be released until after judgment has been 23 rendered. Proceeds of the sale of all objects administratively or judicially confiscated 24 pursuant hereto shall accrue to the Agoo- Damortis Protected Seascape and 25 Landscape Fund. Procedure for the sale thereof shall be promulgated by the PAMB. 26 However, in no case shall any confiscated or rescued protected animal species be sold 27 or in any manner disposed of but shall be immediately turned over to the PASu Office 28 for release in its natural habitat, subject to existing regulations. However, in no case 29 shall any confiscated or rescued protected animal species be sold or in any manner 30 disposed of but shall be immediately turned over to the PASU Office for release in its 31 natural habitat, subject to existing regulations. 32

The penalties specified in this Section will be in addition to the penalties 33 contained in RA 9072 (National Caves and Cave Resources Management and 34 Protection Act), RA 9147 (Wildlife Resources Conservation and Protection Act), and 35 other related laws. 36

Conviction for any offense under this Act, of a public officer or officer of the law 37 shall carry the accessory penalty of perpetual disqualification from public office. 38

SEC. 16. Construction and Suppletory Application of Existing Laws. The provisions of this Act shall be construed liberally in favor of achieving biodiversity conservation, protection and sustainable development. Provisions of Republic Act No. 7586, otherwise known as the National Integrated Protected Areas Management Act of 1992 and existing forestry laws, and their corresponding rules and regulations not inconsistent hereto shall have the suppletory effect in the implementation of this Act.

SEC. 17. *Transitory Provision.-* In order to ensure the recovery and restoration of biological diversity and to develop sustainable livelihood opportunities for tenured migrants, the DENR shall henceforth cease to issue concessions, licenses, permits, clearances, compliance documents or any other instrument that allows exploitation and utilization of resources within the Agoo-Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape until the management plan shall have been put into effect.

All existing land use and resource use permits within the Agoo- Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape shall be reviewed and shall not be reviewed upon their expiration unless consistent with the management plan and approved by the PAMB.

17 SEC. 18. Separability Clause. – If, for any reason, any part or section of this Act 18 is declared unconstitutional or invalid, such other parts or not affected thereby shall 19 remain in full force and effect

20 SEC. 19. *Repealing Clause.* – All laws, decrees, proclamations, rules and 21 regulations inconsistent with any provisions of this Act are hereby repealed or modified 22 accordingly.

23 SEC. 20. *Effectivity Clause*. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its 24 complete publication in the *Official Gazette* or in a national newspaper of general 25 circulation available in the Agoo- Damortis Protected Seascape and Landscape.
