## EXPLANATORY NOTE

There is an urgent need to provide protection and security to witnesses and/or resource persons who attend legislative investigations in aid of legislation conducted by the Congress of the Philippines. The present law should be amended in order to improve the conditions and procedures for providing protection and assistance to a witness in legislative investigations when reasonable fear exists that testifying for the purpose of giving evidence and/or testimony during the investigation on criminal offenses in connection with which the protection may be provided under the present Jaw, would expose the witness to severe danger to his/her life, health, freedom, corporal inviolability or property, where other measures do not suffice. The object of this bill is to ensure that the due administration of justice in legislative investigations is not prejudiced by witnesses not being given protection relative to his/her testimony in said proceedings. The paramount consideration is to provide for the safety and well-being of witnesses in legislative investigations who, unless protected, may not give evidence for fear of death, violence or serious injury by criminal interests likely to be affected by the proceedings, and for related purposes.

In view of the foregoing, the approval of this bill is earnestly sought.

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## SENATE S.B. NO. 2173

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Introduced by Senator Francis N. Pangilinan

## AN ACT AMENDING REPUBLIC ACT NO. 6981 OTHERWISE KNOWN AS AN ACT PROVIDING FOR A WITNESS PROTECTION, SECURITY AND BENEFIT PROGRAM AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 SECTION 1. Section 4 of Republic Act No. 6981 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 4. Witness in Legislative Investigations. - In case of legislative 2 investigations in aid of legislation, THE SENATE OF THE PHILIPPINES OR 3 THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, AS THE CASE MAY BE, 4 SHALL PROVIDE FOR A SEPARATE "WITNESS **PROTECTION.** 5 SECURITY AND BENEFIT PROGRAM" FOR THE RESOURCE 6 PERSONS AND/OR WITNESSES. The witness and/or resource persons, with 7 his express consent, may be admitted into the Program upon the recommendation 8 of the legislative committee where his testimony is needed when in its judgment there 9 is pressing necessity therefor: Provided, That such recommendation is approved by 10 11 the President of the Senate or the Speaker of the House of Representatives, as the case 12 may be.

THE SENATE OF THE PHILIPPINES OR THE HOUSE OF 13 REPRESENTATIVES, AS THE CASE MAY BE, SHALL HAVE 14 PRIMARY JURISDICTION AS TO THE ADMINISTRATION AND 15 IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROGRAM. THE CONGRESS MAY 16 REQUEST THE NECESSARY ASSISTANCE FROM 17 ANY DEPARTMENT, BUREAU, OFFICE OR ANY OTHER EXECUTIVE 18 TO ASSIST IN THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE 19 AGENCY 20 PROGRAM.

HOWEVER, THE PROGRAM SHALL BE IMPLEMENTED BY 1 2 THE **SENATE** OR THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES INDEPENDENT FROM ANY OTHER ANY DEPARTMENT, BUREAU, 3 OFFICE OR ANY OTHER EXECUTIVE AGENCY WHEN IT IS APPARENT 4 THAT THE INVESTIGATION MIGHT BE PREJUDICED AND/OR WHEN 5 SAFETY OF THE WITNESS MIGHT BE **JEOPARDIZED** 6 THE ESPECIALLY THE PUBLIC **OFFICIALS** ARE 7 WHEN INVOLVED. CONGRESS MAY PROMULGATE ITS **OWN** RULES 8 AND **REGULATIONS FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS PROVISION."** 9

SEC. 2. All laws, executive orders, decrees, instructions, rules and 10 11 regulations contrary or inconsistent with the provision of this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly. 12

13 SEC. 3. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its complete publication in the Official Gazette or in at least two (2) national newspaper of general circulation 14 15 whichever comes first.
