EXPLANATORY NOTE

Good nutrition and a balanced diet are important to help children grow up healthy. Nutrition plays a major role in children's health and also affects their performance in school. Children's peak performance at school can be attributed much to good nutrition and eating habits. Eating a nutritious meal has an effect *on* cognition, strength, attitudes and endurance at school. Hungry, weak children are not alert and are less active in class.

It is important to improve the standard of health of children through proper nutrition education and good health practices, particularly a good diet. This Act aims to provide supplementary food to public elementary school students to improve their general health and help them reach better scholastic achievements.¹

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR FREE MEALS FOR STUDENTS OF PUBLIC ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS
Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:
SECTION 1. Short title This Act shall be known as the "Healthy Students Act."
SECTION 2. Declaration of Policy It is hereby declared the policy of the State to
promote good health among the youth. The State shall promote programs that will improve the
nutrition value of meals given to children by providing free meals for students of public
elementary schools.
SECTION 3. Definition of Terms
