EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Constitution, Article 2, Section 13, provides:

The State recognizes the vital role of the youth in nation-building and shall promote and protect their physical, moral, spiritual, intellectual and social wellbeing. It shall inculcate in the youth patriotism and nationalism, and encourage their involvement in public and civic affairs.

It is vitally important for school systems to ensure that their students understand, care about, and act upon ethical values, such as honesty, fairness, responsibility, and respect for self and others.

Schools adopting intentional comprehensive approaches to character education develop moral and ethical values in their students and promote a more compassionate and responsible society. Students are less prone to violence and substance abuse, and are more community minded, and often more committed and successful academically when character education programs have been implemented.

An increasing number of schools and districts are taking steps to incorporate character education into their classrooms and school cultures. They need information on best practices, effective curricula, quality programs, criteria for assessing programs, and cost-effective opportunities to network nationally with each other, especially through electronic means.

This bill seeks to establish a National Clearinghouse for Character Education.¹

SECTION 1. Short Title This Act shall be known as the "Commitment to Kids	and
Character Act."	
SECTION 2. Definition of Terms The following terms as used in this Act shall	-be
defined as follows:	
(1) "Clearinghouse" refers to the National Clearinghouse for Character Education, as	
defined in Section 3 (b) of this Act;	
(2) "Organization" refers to the organization described in Section 30 (E) of the Nationa	ા
Internal Revenue Code of the Philippines and exempt from tax under Section 30 of st	ach
Code;	
(3) "Secretary" refers to the Secretary of the Department of Education (DepEd).	
SECTION 3. Establishment.	
(a) Grant - The Secretary is authorized to provide a grant to an organizati	on,
which has:	
(1) demonstrated expertise on a National level in providing comprehens	ive
and objective information services and assistance regarding character educat	ion
policies, programs, models of curricula, research and assessment;	
(2) a membership representative of individuals and groups committed to	,

providing character education; and

3	(b) Establishment of Center - The Organization shall establish and support the
4	operation of a National Clearinghouse for Character Education to synthesize and

14	implementation of this Act shall be taken from the current appropriations of the Department of
15	Education (DepEd). Thereafter, the fund necessary to carry out the provisions of this Act shall be
16	included in the annual General Appropriations Act.
17	SECTION 7. Separability Clause If any provision of this Act is held invalid or
18	unconstitutional, the remainder of the Act or the provision not otherwise affected shall remain
19	valid and subsisting.

20	SECTION 8. Repealing Clause Any law, presidential decree or issuance, executive
21	order, letter of instruction, administrative rule or regulation contrary to or inconsistent with the
22	provisions of this Act is hereby repealed, modified or amended accordingly.
23	SECTION 9. Effectivity Clause This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its
24	publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
