

# Senate Disposal Committee

# **Accomplishment Report for CY 2017**

### **Major Accomplishments**

- ✓ Disposed of unserviceable Senate equipment, supplies and materials and vehicles worth about P 13,954,788.55 for the period from January 1 to December 31, 2017 (Please see attached copy of the report prepared by Ms. Cielo Ordaneza of the Legislative Accounting Service, marked as Annex "A" hereof)
- ✓ In coordination with the Property and Procurement Service (PPS) and the Legislative Accounting Service (LAS), SDC facilitated the dropping from the Senate books of account items that were disposed of through donation/transfer to other agencies in the total amount of more or less P 13,954,788.55 as of December 31, 2017.
- The Senate, through the SDC, donated various unserviceable properties to a total of 29 government offices broken down as follows: 17 local government units(LGUs), 10 government schools, a military office and an office in the executive branch of government. (SDC actually made 32 donations but 2 LGUs received more than one donation; hence, the total number of beneficiaries is only 29.)
- ✓ The disposal of unserviceable properties had helped decongest the PPS Warehouse and provided space for items that were returned by Senate Offices.
- ✓ From 1995 until 2017, the Senate was able to dispose of a total of more or less P 206,763,706.90 worth of unserviceable properties.

Note: The P13,954,788.55 worth of donated items that was dropped from the Senate books of account only covers items that were actually picked up by the respective donees as of December 31, 2017. Due to the Christmas holidays, some items approved for donation and covered by SDC resolutions have not yet been picked up from the Senate and dropped from the Senate Books of Account as of December 31, 2017.

# The Senate Disposal Committee (SDC)


