

Senate Disposal Committee

Accomplishment Report for CY2014

Major accomplishments/highlights:

- ➤ The Committee had seven (7) meetings in 2015 and was able to pass eleven (11) resolutions for the disposal/donation of various unserviceable equipment, supplies and materials and vehicles to a total of 35 beneficiaries from 25 LGUs, 8 public schools and 2 military offices in 5 regions all over the country.
- Facilitated the dropping from the Senate books of account, items that were donated/disposed of from 1997 to December 31, 2014 worth about P164,092,487.12, per attached copy of the report submitted by the Legislative Accounting Service (LAS) marked as Annex "A" hereof.
- As of December 31, 2014, SDC facilitated the disposal/donation of about P21, 105,793.30 worth of unserviceable Senate properties to various government agencies and its subsequent dropping from the Senate books of account. The amount includes some items that were disposed of in 2013 and covered by SDC Resolution Nos. 2013-002, 2013-003 and 2013-005.
- Ms. Cielo Ordaneza, a staff of the Legislative Accounting Service (LAS) became a member of the SDC Secretariat pursuant to Special Order (OSEC) No. 2014-052 (OSP) dated August 26, 2014. In coordination with PPS staff, she was able to facilitate the dropping from the books of account of items that were disposed of through the SDC at the end of the calendar year.

Dropping from the books of account of donated items

The Senate Disposal Committee (SDC) had seven (7) meetings in 2014. It passed eleven (11) resolutions duly approved by the Office of the Senate President (OSP). Seven (7) of the resolutions passed were for the donation/disposal of various unserviceable equipment, supplies and materials; three (3) for the donation of vehicles; one (1) for the disposal through ceremonial burning of unserviceable items; and one resolution for the cancellation of unclaimed one (1) unit vehicle that was approved for donation to Brgy. Numero, Mabitac, Laguna. The approved beneficiary communicated to the Committee and the Secretariat that they were no longer interested in the vehicle.

From 1997 until December 31, 2014 the total worth of items disposed of/donated to other agencies based on acquisition cost is about P 164,092,487.12. The same amount was dropped from the Senate books of account by the LAS per report submitted to the SDC as of December 31, 2014 (copy attached marked as Annex "A" hereof).

The dropping from the books of account of all donated items was through the efforts of PPS and LAS. They also facilitated the reconciliation of property records specifically with regard to the cost of the items that were disposed of through the SDC.



A total of 35 government offices and agencies were beneficiaries of various items that were disposed of by the Senate through the SDC. Majority of the agencies were from the thirteen towns and cities in the National Capital Region (NCR). But the most number of LGU beneficiaries were from Region IV-A (CALABARZON).

In the allocation of items, the Committee takes into consideration the cost for transporting the donated items from the Senate to the respective offices of the donees as this is borne by the latter. In some instances, however, upon the request of the beneficiaries and if circumstances so warrant, the Senate assists or facilitates the delivery of donated items within Metro Manila.

Closing

After disposing of unserviceable items that are no longer needed, the Committee, in coordination with LAS and PPS, facilitate the dropping from the Senate books of account of all items that were disposed of/donated to other agencies at the end of the calendar year. This is necessary inorder to reflect the actual net worth of the Senate.
