# Accomplishment Report CY2015




## Major accomplishments/highlights:

 The Committee had **seven (7) meetings** in 2015. It passed **twelve (12) resolutions** for the disposal/donation of various unserviceable equipment, supplies and materials and vehicles to a total of **43 beneficiaries** from 24 LGUs, 17 public schools and 2 offices/agencies in the executive branch in **8 regions** all over the country as reflected in the table below:

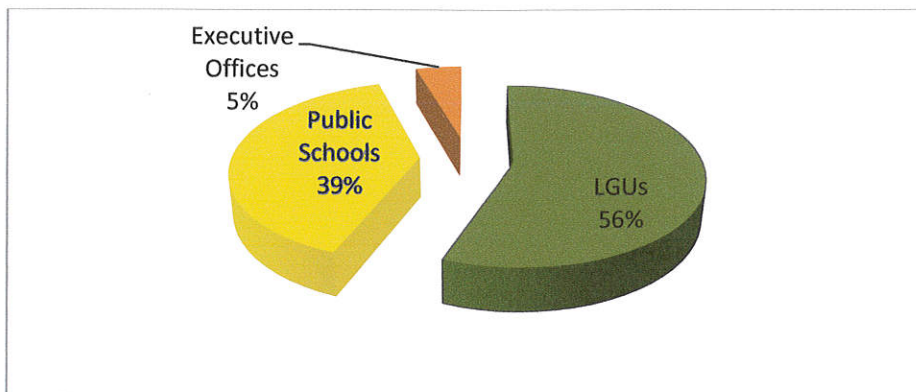
