RESOLUTION NO. 115

RESOLUTION CONGRATULATING AND COMMENDING
THE NINE RECIPIENTS OF THE GAWAD SA
MANLILIKHA NG BAYAN (GAMABA) AWARD OR
THE NATIONAL LIVING TREASURES AWARD FOR
2023 FOR THEIR EXEMPLARY CONTRIBUTIONS TO
THE PROMOTION AND SAFEGUARDING OF OUR
PHILIPPINE CULTURAL HERITAGE

WHEREAS, Article XIV, Section 15 of the Constitution provides that arts and letters shall enjoy the patronage of the State and that the State shall conserve, promote, and popularize the nation's historical and cultural heritage and resources, as well as artistic creations;

WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 7355, also known as the Manlilikha ng Bayan Act, was enacted to ensure the continuity of Philippine traditions through the promotion and preservation of artistic practices. It defines a "Manlilikha ng Bayan" as a "citizen or a group of citizens engaged in any traditional art uniquely Filipino, whose distinctive skills have reached such a high level of technical and artistic excellence and have been

passed on to and widely practiced by the present generation in his/her community with the same degree of technical and artistic competence”;

WHEREAS, through Proclamation No. 427, s. 2023, signed on December 15, 2023, President Ferdinand Marcos Jr. declared the following individuals as recipients of the Gawad sa Manlilikha ng Bayan (GAMABA) for 2023:

1. Adelita Romualdo Bagcal – Ilocano master of oral traditions from Banna, Ilocos Norte, recognized for her commitment to safeguarding and promoting the *dallot* and other Ilocano oral traditions;
2. Abina Tawide Coguit – Agusan Manobo embroiderer from La Paz, Agusan del Sur, recognized for her commitment to safeguarding and promoting the Agusan Manobo *suyam* (embroidery) tradition;
3. Sakinur-ain Mugong Delasas – Sama master of traditional dance from Bongao, Tawi-Tawi; recognized for her commitment to safeguarding and promoting the Sama *Igal* (dance) tradition;
4. Bundos Bansil Fara – T’boli brasscaster from Lake Sebu, South Cotabato, recognized for his commitment to safeguarding and promoting the T’boli *temwel* (brasscasting) tradition;
5. Marife Ravidas Ganahon – Higaonon mat weaver from Malaybalay, Bukidnon, recognized for her commitment to safeguarding and promoting the Higaonon *ikam* (mat weaving) tradition;
6. Amparo Balansi Mabanag – Ga’dang embroiderer from Paracelis, Mountain Province, recognized for her commitment to safeguarding and promoting the Ga’dang *manu’bak* and *ameru* (beadworks and embroidery) traditions;
7. Samporonia Pagsac Madanlo – Mandaya *ikat* weaver from Caraga, Davao Oriental, recognized for her commitment to safeguarding and promoting the Mandaya *dagmay* (*ikat* weaving) tradition;


8. Barbara Kibed Ofong – T'boli *ikat* weaver from Lake Sebu, South Cotabato, recognized for her commitment to safeguarding and promoting the T'boli *t'nalak* (*ikat* weaving) tradition; and

9. Rosie Godwino Sula – T'boli chanter from Lake Sebu, South Cotabato, recognized for her commitment to safeguarding and promoting the T'boli *lingon* (chanting) tradition;


