RESOLUTION No. 191

RESOLUTION CONGRATULATING AND COMMENDING THE PROVINCE OF KALINGA FOR BAGGING THE GUINNESS WORLD RECORDS FOR THE LARGEST GONG ENSEMBLE AND THE LARGEST BANGA DANCE THROUGH THE PERFORMANCE OF ITS CONSTITUENTS DUBBED AS "AWONG CHI GANGSA, AGTU'N CHI BANG" OR "THE CALL OF A THOUSAND GONGS, DANCE OF A THOUSAND POTS" DURING THE CELEBRATION OF THE 28TH FOUNDING ANNIVERSARY OF THE PROVINCE OF KALINGA ON 15 FEBRUARY 2023

WHEREAS, the Philippine Senate has consistently recognized outstanding Filipinos who bring honor and glory to the nation through their remarkable feats and prestigious awards;

WHEREAS, Article XIV Section 14 of the Constitution states that "The State shall foster the preservation, enrichment, and dynamic evolution of a Filipino national culture based on the principle of unity in diversity in a climate of free artistic and intellectual expression";

WHEREAS, Article XIV Section 17 of the Constitution also states that "The State shall recognize, respect, and protect the rights of indigenous cultural communities to preserve and develop their cultures, traditions, and institutions";

WHEREAS, on 15 February 2023, during the celebration of the 28th Founding Anniversary of the Province of Kalinga, the province bagged the Guinness World Record for the largest gong ensemble and the largest banga (pot) dance for the "Awong Chi Gangsa, Agtu'n Chi Banga" or "The Call of a Thousand Gongs, Dance of a Thousand Pots". The performance comprised 3,440 Kalinga male gong beaters and 4,681 Kalinga female banga dancers;

WHEREAS, creating melodies and ushering performances under the beat or sound of various gong or "gangsa", a hand-held smooth-surfaced circular piece of metal that is usually beaten with a padded stick, have always served as a significant part of the Cordillera people's culture that has been passed on from one generation to another;

WHEREAS, the banga dance dramatized through graceful moves. The interaction between fierce warriors and local maidens balancing banga or heavy earthen pots on their heads to the beat of the "gangsa". The dance illustrates their daily tasks such as fetching water with the banga;

WHEREAS, the "Awong Chi Gangsa, Agtu'n Chi Banga" or "The Call of a Thousand Gongs, Dance of a Thousand Pots" is a symbolic show of peace among the different tribes of Kalinga;

WHEREAS, after the performance, Guinness World Records Official Adjudicator Mr. Kazuyoshi Kirimura immediately announced that the Province of Kalinga bagged two Guinness World Records for the largest gong ensemble and the largest banga dance performances;

WHEREAS, these are the first World Records of their kinds, a unique historic record for the Province of Kalinga and for the Philippines as a whole;

WHEREAS, the observance of the Filipino traditions and festivities is instrumental in preserving our cultural heritage and in strengthening our national identity as Filipinos: Now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the Senate of the Philippines, To congratulate and commend the Province of Kalinga for bagging the Guinness World Records for the Largest Gong Ensemble and the Largest Banga Dance through the performance of its constituents dubbed as "Awong Chi Gangsa, Agtu'n Chi Banga" or "The Call of a Thousand Gongs, Dance of a Thousand Pots" during the celebration of the 28th Founding Anniversary of the Province of Kalinga on 15 February 2023.
