RESOLUTION NO. 29

RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING AND CONGRATULATING
ALEIA AIELLE AGUILAR FOR HER
OUTSTANDING PERFORMANCE AT THE ABU
DHABI WORLD JIU-JITSU CHAMPIONSHIPS

WHEREAS, on November 13, 2022, five-year-old Aleia Aielle Aguilar became the Philippines' youngest world champion in Brazilian jiu-jitsu after conquering the Kids 1 under 16 kg event at the 2022 Abu Dhabi World Jiu-Jitsu Championships;


WHEREAS, Aleia Aielle Aguilar won the gold medal after defeating Gabriela Vercosa of Brazil in the final match at the Jiu-Jitsu Arena, Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates (UAE);

WHEREAS, Aleia Aielle Aguilar is the daughter of Maybelline Masuda, the first Filipino jiu-jitsu world champion in 2009 and a gold medalist at the 2014 Asian Beach Games, and Alvin Aguilar, a gold medalist at the Asian Jiu-Jitsu Championship and considered the father of mixed martial arts in the Philippines as well as the president and founder of the Universal Reality Combat Championship (URCC);

WHEREAS, Aleia Aielle Aguilar's victory is testament that Jiu-Jitsu runs in the family and her becoming the youngest Jiu-Jitsu world champion brings pride and honor to the Philippines: Now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the Senate of the Philippines, To recognize and commend Aleia Aielle Aguilar for her outstanding performance at the Abu Dhabi World Jiu-Jitsu Championship.
