**EXPLANATORY NOTE** 

The 1987 Constitution, Article II, Section 12 provides,

Section 12. The State recognizes the sanctity of family life and shall protect and strengthen the family as a basic autonomous social institution. It shall equally protect the life of the mother and the life of the unborn from conception.

Stillbirths is a common tragic occurrence which can strike any pregnant woman from the lowest to the highest income bracket, from the educated to the less educated strata of society. In the Philippines, one in forty (1/40) pregnancies results in stillbirths and early neonatal deaths. This is relatively high compared to countries like the United States which records one stillbirth in one hundred fifteen deliveries (1/115).

There is a dearth of information available which can explain the occurrence of stillbirths which can happen even in seemingly normal and healthy pregnancies. This compounds the anguish caused by stillbirths to expecting parents and their family members who had no warning that such a tragedy would occur.

This bill directs the proper government agency to collect information on stillbirths on a national level and provides for information dissemination and research program for . the formulation of risk reduction measures.

9	SECTION 1. Short Title This Act shall be known as the "Stillbirth Awareness
10	and Research Act of 2009."
11	· SECTION 2. Declaration of Policy
12	(a) Statistics available from the National Statistics Office on stillbirths and early
13	neonatal deaths show that approximately one (1) in every forty (40) pregnancies
14	result in stillbirths. While there can be various possible causes of stillbirths such
15	as cord accidents, infections, genetic anomalies, among others, the incidence of
16	stillbirth remains unpredictable and occurs for no determinable medical reason.
17	Presently, risk reduction measures are not in place so as to protect expecting
18	parents from the emotional anguish caused by stillbirths and early neonatal
19	deaths.
20	(b) Therefore, a repository of data collected in a standard manner can provide useful
21	information for the study and analysis of stillbirths and for the formulation of
22	effective risk reduction measures.
23	(c) This act shall be in accord with the State policy to recognize the sanctity of family
24	life and to protect and strengthen the family as a basic autonomous social

4	SECTION 3. Definition of Terms For purposes of this Act, the following terms
5	are defined:
6	(1) "DOH" - shall refer to the Department of Health.
7	(2) "PIA" – Philippine Information Agency
8	(3) "Stillbirth" - Stillbirths are fetal deaths in pregnancies lasting seven or more
9	months
10	SECTION 4. National Stillbirth Registry - The State shall establish a National
11	Stillbirth Registry, the custodian of which shall be the proper government agency
12	competent and able to maintain such national registry.
13	The National Stillbirth Registry shall serve the following purposes:
14	1. To provide a national repository for reporting and maintaining in a
15	standardized manner data on stillbirths;
16	2. To make such data available for research on the causes and prevention of
17	stillbirths;
18	3. The registry shall include information on the stillborn fetus and
19	information on the mother's health and pregnancy condition.
20	<ul><li>4. Determination of standard stillbirth definition and protocol.</li></ul>
21	a. The Department of Health (DOH) shall provide for the standard
22	definition of stillbirth and a standard protocol for stillbirth data
23	collection.
24	b. The Department of Health shall ensure that the standard definition
25	of stillbirth and the standard protocol described above are

I	developed in a manner that ensures consultations with
2	representatives from health care organizations, local government,
3	and other interested parties.
4	SECTION 5. National Public Awareness Campaign
5	The Department of Health (DOH) in cooperation with the Philippine Information
6	Agency (PIA) shall carry out a national campaign to increase public awareness and
7	knowledge of stillbirths.
8	Activities under the national campaign shall include:
9	1. The dissemination of information on measures for mothers to maintain a
10	healthy pregnancy and assess fetal health;
11	2. The dissemination of information on good prenatal care practices such as
12	not drinking alcohol or smoking; and
13	3. The promotion of fetal movement awareness and taking proactive steps to
14	monitor a baby's movement beginning at approximately 28 weeks into the
15	pregnancy.
16	SECTION 6. Appropriations. – The amount necessary to carry out the provisions
17	of this Act, are hereby authorized to be appropriated from the National Treasury.
18	SECTION 7. Separability Clause. – If any provision or part hereof, is held invalid
19	or unconstitutional, the remainder of the Act or the provision not otherwise affected shall
20	remain valid and subsisting.
21	SECTION 8. Repealing Clause Any law, presidential decree or issuance
22	executive order, letter of instruction, administrative order, rule or regulation contrary to
23	or inconsistent with the provisions of this Act is hereby repealed, modified or amended
24	accordingly.

- 1 SECTION 9. Effectivity Clause. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days
- 2 after its publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
