AN ACT,
DECRIMINALIZING VAGRANCY AMENDING FOR THIS
PURPOSE ARTICLE 202 OF ACT NO. 3815, AS AMENDED,
OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE REVISED PENALCODE

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 SECTION 1. Article 202 of the Revised Penal Code is hereby amended to
2 read as follows:

4 "Article 202. [Vagrants and p] Prostitutes; *penalty*. - [The following are
5 vagrants:

- 6 1. Any person having no apparent means of subsistence, who has the
- 7 physical ability to work and who neglects to apply himself or herself to
- 8 some lawful calling;
- 9 2. Any person found loitering about public or semi-public buildings or
- 10 places or tramping or wandering about the country or the streets
- 11 without visible means of support;
- 12 3. Any idle or dissolute person who lodges in houses of ill-fame;
- 13 ruffians or pimps and those who habitually associate with prostitutes;
- 14 4. Any person who, not being included in the provisions of other
- 15 articles of this Code, shall be found loitering in any inhabited or
- 16 uninhabited place belong to another without any lawful or justifiable
- 17 purpose;
- 18 5. prostitutes.]

20 For the purposes of this article, women who, for money or
21 profit, habitually indulge in sexual intercourse or lascivious conduct,
22 are deemed to be prostitutes.

23
24 Any person found guilty of any of the offenses covered by this
25 article shall be punished by *arresto menor* or a fine not exceeding 200
26 pesos, and in case of recidivism, by *arresto mayor* in its medium period

1 to *prision correccional* in its minimum period or a fine ranging from 200
2 to 2,000 pesos, or both, in the discretion of the court.

3
4 **SEC. 2. *Effect on Pending Cases.*** All pending cases under the provisions of
5 Article 202 of the Revised Penal Code on Vagrancy prior to its amendment by this
6 Act shall be dismissed upon effectivity of this Act.

7
8 **SEC. 3. *Immediate Release of Convicted Persons.*** All persons serving sentence for
9 violation of the provisions of Article 202 of the Revised Penal Code on Vagrancy
10 prior to its amendment by this Act shall be immediately released upon effectivity of
11 this Act, provided that they are not serving sentence or detained for any other
12 offense or felony.

13
14 **SEC. 4. *Repealing Clause.*** All laws, presidential decrees, executive orders, rules
15 and regulations, and other issuances, or any parts thereof, inconsistent with this Act,
16 are hereby repealed, modified or amended accordingly.

18 **SEC. 5. *Effectivity Clause.*** This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its
19 publication in the Official Gazette or in at least two (2) newspapers of general
20 circulation.
