AN ACT

REGULATING THE USE OF MOBILE PHONE WHILE DRIVING, PROVIDING PENALTIES IN VIOLATION THEREOF AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress, assembled:

Section 1. Declaration of Policy. – It is the policy of the State to maintain peace and order, protect life, liberty and property, and promote the general welfare of the people.

While the State recognizes the vital role of communication and information in nation-building, the State puts premium on the life and safety of its citizens by regulating the use of communication gadgets.

- **Sec. 2.** Definition of Terms. As used in this Act, the following terms shall mean:
 - a) Cellular Phone is a portable electronic device used for mobile voice or data communication over a network of specialized base stations known as cell sites. In addition to the standard voice function of a cellular phone, current mobile phones may support many additional services and accessories, such as SMS for text messaging, email, pachet switching for access to the internet, gaming, bluetoots, infrared, camera with video recorder and MMS for sending and receiving photos and videos.
 - b) **Text Messages** Means the use of message sending by pressing the keypad of the cellular

1	phone in composing a message and sending it
2	through the phone;
3	c) Accessories - means the devise or apparatus that
4	can be connected to the cellular phone such as,
5	but not limited to earphones, microphones, jacks,
6	which are capable of sending, receiving, storing
7	or otherwise processing messages from other
8	modes of communication.
9	Sec. 3. Use of Cellular Phone While Driving To carry out the above-
10	mentioned policy, the use of mobile phones for text messaging and/or for
11	dial-up communication shall be allowed while driving all types of vehicles,
12	provided, that, different hands-free accessories shall be connected therein";
13	"This section does not apply to a person using a wireless telephone for
14	emergency purposes, including but not limited to, an emergency call to a law
15	enforcement agency, health ca re provider, fire department, or other
16	emergency services agency or entity.
17	"This section does not also apply to emergency services professional
18	using a wireless telephone while operating an authorized emergency vehicle,
19	in the course and scope of his/her duties".
20	Sec. 4. Penal Provision – Violation of this Act shall be punishable by:
21	(a) First Offence – fine of Three Thousand Pesos (P 3,000.00)
22	(b) Second Offense – fine of Five Thousand Pesos (P 5,000.00)
23	(c) Third and succeeding Offenses - a fine of not less than Five
24	Thousand Pesos (P 5,000.00) but not more than Ten Thousand
25	Pesos (P 10,000.00) and/or imprisonment of not more than one
26	(1) year at the discretion of the Court.
27	Sec. 5. Separability Clause If any part, section, or provision of this
28	Act shall be held invalid or unconstitutional, the other provisions shall not be
29	affected thereby.
30	Sec. 6. Repealing Clause All laws, decrees, orders, issuances, rules
31	and regulations or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are
32	hereby repealed, amended, or modified accordingly.
33	Sec. 7. Effectivity This Act shall take effect (15) days after its
34	complete publication in at least two (2) newspapers of national circulation.
