- AN ACT CONVERTING THE SULTAN KUDARAT POLYTECHNIC STATE COLLEGE (SKPSC) IN THE CITY OF TACURONG AND ITS DESIGNATED CAMPUSES IN THE MUNICIPALITIES OF LUTAYAN, KALAMANSIG, PALIMBANG AND ISULAN, ALL LOCATED IN THE PROVINCE OF SULTAN KUDARAT INTO A STATE UNIVERSITY TO BE KNOWN AS THE SULTAN KUDARAT STATE UNIVERSITY (SKSU) AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 SECTION 1. Conversion. – The Sultan Kudarat Polytechnic State 2 College (SKPSC) in the City of Tacurong, together with its duly designated 3 campuses in the municipalities of Lutayan, Kalamansig, Palimbang and Isulan, 4 all located in the Province of Sultan Kudarat, is hereby converted into a state 5 university to be known as the Sultan Kudarat State University (SKSU), 6 hereinafter referred to as the University. The main campus of the University 7 shall be in the City of Tacurong. 1 SEC. 2. General Mandate. – The University shall primarily provide 2 advanced instruction and professional training in science and technology, 3 agriculture, fisheries, education and other relevant fields of study. It shall also 4 undertake research and extension services, and provide progressive leadership 5 in its areas of specialization.

6 SEC. 3. Curricular Offerings. – The University shall offer 7 undergraduate and graduate courses in science and technology, agriculture, 8 fisheries, education and other related fields of study within its areas of 9 specialization and according to its capabilities as the Board of Regents may 10 deem necessary to carry out its objectives, in order to meet the needs of the 11 Province of Sultan Kudarat and Region XII.

12 The existing high schools shall be transferred to the jurisdiction and 13 supervision of the Department of Education (DepEd): *Provided*, That the high 14 schools shall be allowed to remain and operate within the campus of the 15 University until the students, who are currently enrolled, shall have completed 16 their high school education: *Provided*, *further*, That the University may 17 operate a reasonably-sized laboratory school, if it has a College of Education.

18 SEC. 4. Administration. – The University shall have the general powers 19 of a corporation set forth in Batas Pambansa Blg. 68, as amended, otherwise 20 known as "The Corporation Code of the Philippines". The administration of 21 the University and the exercise of its corporate powers shall be vested 22 exclusively in the Board of Regents and the President of the University.

SEC. 5. The Governing Board. - The governing board of the
University shall be the Board of Regents, hereinafter referred to as the Board,
which shall be composed of the following:

26 (a) The Chairperson of the Commission on Higher Education (CHED),27 Chairperson;

(b) The President of the University, Vice Chairperson; 1 (c) The Chairperson of the Committee on Education, Arts and Culture of 2 3 the Senate, member; (d) The Chairperson of the Committee on Higher and Technical 4 Education of the House of Representatives, member; 5 6 (e) The Regional Director of the National Economic and Development 7 Authority (NEDA), member; (f) The Regional Director of the Department of Science and Technology 8 (DOST), member; 9 (g) The President of the federation of faculty associations of the 10 11 University, member; (h) The President of the federation of student councils of the University, 12 13 member: (i) The President of the federation of alumni associations of the 14 15 University, member; and 16 (i) Two (2) prominent citizens from the private sector who have distinguished themselves in their profession or fields of specialization of the 17 University, members. 18 The Board shall appoint the two (2) prominent citizens from among a list 19 20 of at least five (5) qualified persons in the Province of Sultan Kudarat, as recommended by the search committee constituted by the University President, 21

in consultation with the Chairperson of the CHED and the other members of theBoard, based on the normal standards and qualifications for the position.

The term of office of the President of the federation of faculty associations, the President of the federation of student councils and the President of the federation of alumni associations shall be coterminous with

1 their respective terms of office, as set forth in their respective constitutions and 2 bylaws.

- 3 The two (2) prominent citizens shall serve for a term of two (2) years 4 from the date of appointment.

5 SEC. 6. Promulgation and Implementation of Policies. - The Board 6 shall promulgate and implement policies in accordance with the declared State policies on education and other pertinent provisions of the Philippine 7 8 Constitution on education, agriculture, science and technology, as well as the policies, standards and thrusts of the CHED under Republic Act No. 7722, 9 10 otherwise known as the "Higher Education Act of 1994".

SEC. 7. Powers and Duties of the Board of Regents. - The Board shall 11 have the following specific powers and duties, in addition to its general powers 12 13 of administration and the exercise of all the powers granted to the board of 14 directors of a corporation under existing laws:

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15 (a) To promulgate rules and regulations not contrary to law as may be necessary to carry out the purposes and functions of the University; 16

17 (b) To receive and appropriate all sums as may be provided, for the support of the University in the manner it may determine in its discretion, in 18 19 order to carry out the purposes and functions of the University;

20 (c) To import duty-free economic, technical and cultural books and/or 21 publications, upon certification by the CHED that such imported books and/or publications are for economic, technical, vocational, scientific, philosophical, 22 historical or cultural purposes, in accordance with the provisions of the Tariff 23 and Customs Code of the Philippines, as amended; 24

(d) To receive in trust legacies, gifts and donations of real properties of 25 all kinds and to administer and dispose of the same when necessary for the 26

benefit of the University and, subject to the limitations, directions and
 instructions of the donor, if any.

3 Such donations shall be exempt from the donor's tax and the same shall 4 be considered as allowable deductions from the gross income in the 5 computation of the income tax of the donor, in accordance with the provisions 6 of the National Internal Revenue Code (NIRC) of 1997, as amended: *Provided*, 7 That such donations shall not be disposed of, transferred or sold;

8 (e) To fix the tuition fees and other necessary school charges such as, 9 but not limited to, matriculation fees, graduation fees and laboratory fees, as the 10 Board may deem proper to impose, after due consultations with the involved 11 sectors.

Such fees and charges, including government subsidies and other income generated by the University, shall constitute special trust funds and shall be deposited in any authorized government depository bank, and all interests that shall accrue therefrom shall form part of the same funds for the use of the University.

Any provision of existing laws, rules and regulations to the contrary notwithstanding, any income generated by the University from tuition fees and other charges, as well as from the operation of auxiliary services and land grants, shall be retained by the University and may be disbursed by the Board for instruction, research, extension or other programs/projects of the University: *Provided*, That all fiduciary fees shall be disbursed for the specific purpose for which these are collected.

If, for reasons beyond its control, the University shall not be able to pursue any project for which funds have been appropriated and allocated under its approved program of expenditures, the Board may authorize the use of said

funds for any reasonable purpose which, in its discretion, may be necessary and
 urgent for the attainment of the objectives and goals of the University;

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 (f) To adopt and implement a socialized scheme of tuition and other school fees for greater access to poor but deserving students;

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5 (g) To authorize the construction or repair of its buildings, machinery, 6 equipment and other facilities, and the purchase and acquisition of real and 7 personal properties, including necessary supplies, materials and equipment;

8 (h) To appoint, upon recommendation of the President of the University,
9 Vice Presidents, deans, directors, heads of departments, faculty members and
10 other officials and employees of the University;

(i) To fix and adjust salaries of faculty members and administrative 11 12 officials and employees, subject to the provisions of the Revised Compensation 13 and Position Classification System and other pertinent budget and compensation laws governing hours of service and such other duties and conditions as it may 14 15 deem proper; to grant them, at its discretion, leaves of absence under such 16 regulations as it may promulgate, any provision of existing law to the contrary notwithstanding; and to remove them for cause in accordance with the 17 requirements of due process of law; 18

(j) To approve the curricula, instructional programs and rules of
 discipline drawn by the Administrative and Academic Councils as herein
 provided;

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(k) To set policies on admission and graduation of students;

(1) To award honorary degrees upon persons in recognition of their
outstanding contribution in the fields of agriculture, public service, arts, science
and technology, education or in any field of specialization within the academic
competence of the University; and to authorize the awarding of certificates of
completion of nondegree and nontraditional courses;

(m) To establish and absorb nonchartered tertiary institutions within the 1 Province of Sultan Kudarat as branches and extension centers of the University, 2 in coordination with the CHED and in consultation with the Department of 3 Budget and Management (DBM), and to offer therein programs or courses to 4 promote and carry out equal and greater access to educational opportunities as 5 6 mandated by the Constitution;

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(n) To establish research and extension centers of the University where such will promote the development of the latter; 8

(o) To establish professorial chairs in the University and to provide 9 fellowships for qualified faculty members and scholarships to deserving 10 11 students;

(p) To delegate any of its powers and duties provided for hereinabove to 12 the President or Officer-in-Charge and/or other officials of the University as it 13 may deem appropriate, so as to expedite the administration of the affairs of the 14 15 University;

(q) To authorize an external management audit of the University, to be 16 financed by the CHED, subject to the rules and regulations of the Commission 17 on Audit (COA); and to institute reforms, including academic and structural 18 19 changes on the basis of the audit results and recommendations;

(r) To collaborate with other governing boards of state universities and 20 colleges within the Province of Sultan Kudarat or Region XII, under the 21 supervision of the CHED and in consultation with the DBM, and work towards 22 the restructuring of the University to become more efficient, relevant, 23 24 productive and competitive;

(s) To enter into joint ventures with business and industry for the 25 profitable development and management of the economic assets of the 26

1 University, the proceeds from which shall be used for the development and 2 strengthening of the same;

3 (t) To develop consortia and other forms of linkages with local 4 government units (LGUs), institutions and agencies, both public and private, 5 local and foreign, in furtherance of the purposes and objectives of the 6 University;

7 (u) To develop academic arrangements for institutional capability 8 building with appropriate institutions and agencies, public and private, local and 9 foreign, and to appoint experts/specialists as consultants, part-time or visiting or 10 exchange professors, scholars or researchers, as the case may be;

(v) To set up the adoption of modern and innovative modes of
transmitting knowledge such as the use of information technology, the dual
learning system, open learning or distance education and community laboratory
for the promotion of greater access to higher education and graduate studies, as
the case may be;

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16 (w) To establish policy guidelines and procedures for participative17 decision-making and transparency within the University;

(x) To privatize, where most advantageous to the University, the
 management of nonacademic services such as health, food, building, grounds or
 property maintenance and such other similar activities; and

(y) To extend the term of the President of the University beyond the age
of retirement but not beyond the age of seventy (70), whose performance has
been unanimously rated by the Board as outstanding, based on the guidelines,
qualifications and/or standards set by the Board, after unanimous
recommendation by the search committee.

SEC. 8. Meetings of the Board. - The Board shall regularly convene at
least once every quarter. However, the Chairperson of the Board may, upon

three (3)-days' prior written notice, call a maximum of two (2) special meetings
 whenever necessary.

3 A quorum of the Board shall consist of majority of all its members 4 holding office at the time of the meeting: *Provided, however*, That the 5 Chairperson of the Board or the President of the University is among those 6 present in the meeting.

7 In the absence of the Chairperson of the CHED, a Commissioner of the 8 CHED, duly designated by him/her, shall represent him/her in the meeting with 9 all the rights and responsibilities of a regular member: Provided, however, 10 That during this meeting, the President of the University as Vice Chairperson 11 shall be the Presiding Officer: Provided, further, That this proviso 12 notwithstanding, the Chairperson of the CHED is hereby authorized to designate 13 a CHED Commissioner as the regular Chair of the Board, in which case said 14 CHED Commissioner shall act as the Presiding Officer.

15 In case the Chairpersons of the Congressional Committees on Education 16 shall not be able to attend the Board meeting, they may duly designate their 17 respective representatives to attend the said meeting, who shall have the same 18 rights and responsibilities as a regular member of the Board.

The members of the Board shall not receive any salary but shall be entitled to reimbursements for actual and necessary expenses incurred, either in their attendance to meetings of the Board or in connection with other official business authorized by resolution of the Board, subject to existing laws and regulations.

SEC. 9. *The University President.* – The University shall be headed by a
President, who shall render full-time service. He/She shall be appointed by the
Board, subject to the guidelines, qualifications and/or standards set by the
Board, upon recommendation of a duly constituted search committee. He/She

shall have a term of four (4) years and shall be eligible for reappointment for 1 2 another term: Provided. That in order to effect a smooth transition to a state 3 university, the incumbent President of the Sultan Kudarat Polytechnic State College, if qualified, shall serve as the first President of the University. 4

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Within six (6) months before the expiration of the term of office of the incumbent President of the University, the Board shall constitute the Search 6 Committee for the Presidency (SCP). 7

In case of vacancy in the Office of the President by reason of death, 8 compulsory retirement, resignation, removal for cause or incapacity of the 9 10 President to perform the functions of his/her office, the Board shall designate 11 an Officer-in-Charge of the University within six (6) months from the date of 12 vacancy, pending the appointment of a new President.

In case of vacancy in the Office of the President as mentioned in the 13 immediately preceding paragraph, his/her successor or the Officer-in-Charge 14 15 shall serve only the unexpired portion of the term.

The powers and duties of the President of the University, in addition to 16 those specifically provided in this Act, shall be those usually pertaining to the 17 Office of the President of similar universities, and those delegated by the Board. 18

The salary of the President of the University shall be in accordance with 19 the Revised Compensation and Position Classification System and shall be 20 comparable to that being received by the presidents of similar educational 21 22 institutions.

The President of the University shall be assisted by a Vice President for 23 24 Academic Affairs and a Vice President for Administration, who shall be 25 appointed by the Board upon the recommendation of the President.

26 SEC. 10. Heads of University Campuses. - Campus Directors shall head the University campuses and they shall render full-time service. They shall be 27

appointed by the Board upon recommendation of the search committee and the
 University President, subject to the guidelines, qualifications and/or standards
 set by the Board: *Provided*, That the incumbent college administrators of the
 extension campuses shall serve as Campus Directors of their respective
 campuses.

6 SEC. 11. *The Administrative Council.* – There shall be an Administrative 7 Council consisting of the President of the University as Chairperson, Vice 8 Presidents, deans, directors and other officials of equal rank as members, whose 9 duty is to review and recommend to the Board the policies governing the 10 administration, management and development of the University for appropriate 11 action.

SEC. 12. The Academic Council. - There shall be an Academic Council
to be composed of the President of the University, who shall act as Chairperson,
and all academic staff with the rank of at least an assistant professor, as
members.

16 The Academic Council shall have the power to review and recommend 17 the curricular offerings and rules of discipline of the University, subject to the 18 appropriate action by the Board. It shall fix the requirements for the admission 19 of students, as well as for their graduation and conferment of degrees, subject to 20 review and/or approval by the Board through the President of the University. It 21 shall have the disciplinary power over students of the University and shall 22 formulate academic policies and rules and regulations on discipline, subject to 23 the approval of the Board.

SEC. 13. *The Secretary of the University.* – The Board shall appoint a secretary, who shall serve as such for both the Board and the University and shall keep all records and proceedings of the Board. He/She shall serve upon each member of the Board the appropriate notice of the Board meetings. SEC. 14. The Treasurer of the University. - The Treasurer of the
 Philippines shall be the ex officio treasurer of the University.

3 SEC. 15. *The Faculty.* – No religious opinion or affiliation shall be a 4 matter of inquiry in the appointment of faculty members of the University: 5 *Provided*, That said appointment shall be subject to the guidelines, 6 qualifications and/or standards set by the Board: *Provided, further,* That no 7 member of the faculty shall teach for or against any particular church or 8 religious sect.

9 SEC. 16. Scholarship Program/Admission. – The University shall 10 provide a scholarship program and other affirmative action programs to assist 11 poor but deserving students who qualify for admission to the University.

No student shall be denied admission to the University by reason of sex,religion, cultural or community affiliation or ethnic origin.

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SEC. 17. Academic Freedom and Institutional Autonomy. - The
University shall enjoy academic freedom and institutional autonomy, pursuant
to paragraph 2, Section 5 of Article XIV of the Constitution of the Republic of
the Philippines.

SEC. 18. Authority to Loan or Transfer Apparatus/Equipment/Supplies 18 and Detail of Personnel. - The heads of the bureaus and offices of the national 19 government are hereby authorized to loan or transfer, upon the request of the 20 President of the University, such apparatus, equipment or supplies as may be 21 needed by the University, and to detail employees for duty therein when, in the 22 judgment of the head of bureau or office, such apparatus, equipment, supplies or 23 services of such employees can be spared without serious detriment to the 24 25 public service.

1 The employees so detailed shall perform such duties as required of them 2 by the President of the University, and the time so employed shall be counted as 3 part of their regular services.

4 SEC. 19. Assets, Liabilities and Personnel. – All assets, fixed and 5 movable, personnel and records of the Sultan Kudarat Polytechnic State 6 College, as well as liabilities or obligations, are hereby transferred to the 7 University: *Provided, however*, That the positions, rights and security of tenure 8 of faculty members and personnel therein employed under existing laws prior to 9 the conversion into a University shall be respected.

All parcels of land belonging to the government and occupied by the Sultan Kudarat Polytechnic State College are hereby declared to be property of the University, and shall be titled under that name: *Provided*, That should the University cease to exist or be abolished, or should such parcels of land aforementioned be no longer needed by the University, the same shall revert to the LGUs concerned.

16 SEC. 20. *Appropriations.* – The amount necessary to carry out the 17 provisions of this Act shall be charged against the current year's appropriations 18 of the Sultan Kudarat Polytechnic State College, except the sums needed to 19 continue the operations of the existing high schools. Thereafter, such sums as 20 may be necessary for the continued operation and maintenance of the Sultan 21 Kudarat State University shall be included in the annual General Appropriations 22 Act.

23 SEC. 21. Development Plan, Management Audit, Organizational/
24 Administrative/Academic Structure. – Within the period of one hundred twenty
25 (120) days after the approval of this Act, the University shall accomplish the
26 following:

(a) Submit a five (5)-year development plan, including its corresponding
 program budget to the CHED, for corresponding recommendation to the DBM;

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(b) Undergo a management audit in cooperation with the CHED; and

4 (c) Accordingly set up its organizational, administrative as well as
5 academic structure, including the appointment of the key officials of the
6 University.

SEC. 22. Filing of Report. - On or before the fifteenth (15th) day of the
second (2nd) month after the opening of the regular classes each year, the Board
shall file with the Office of the President of the Philippines, through the
Chairperson of the CHED and with both Houses of Congress, a detailed report
on the progress, conditions and needs of the University.

SEC. 23. Suppletory Application. - The provisions of Republic Act No.
8292, otherwise known as the "Higher Education Modernization Act of 1997",
shall be an integral part of this Act and shall serve as part of the Governing
Charter of the University.

SEC. 24. Parity Clause. - All other powers, functions and privileges,
 responsibilities and limitations to state universities and/or their officials under
 existing laws shall be deemed granted to or imposed upon the University and/or
 its officials, whenever appropriate.

SEC. 25. Implementing Rules and Regulations. - The Board, in
consultation with the CHED, shall formulate the guidelines to fully implement
the provisions of this Act.

SEC. 26. Separability Clause. - If, for any reason, any part or provision
 of this Act is declared invalid or unconstitutional, the remaining parts or
 provisions not affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.

SEC. 27. Repealing Clause. - All laws, presidential decrees, executive
 orders, rules and regulations contrary to or inconsistent with the provisions of
 this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

4 SEC. 28. *Effectivity.* – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after 5 its publication in two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
