has considered the same and has the honor to report it back to the Senate with the recommendation that it be approved without amendment.







AN ACT RENAMING THE SOUTHERN PHILIPPINES AGRI-BUSINESS  
AND MARINE AND AQUATIC SCHOOL OF TECHNOLOGY  
(SPAMAST) IN THE PROVINCE OF DAVAO DEL SUR AS THE  
DAVAO DEL SUR STATE COLLEGE (DSSC)

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in  
Congress assembled:*

1           SECTION 1. The Southern Philippines Agri-Business and Marine and  
2   Aquatic School of Technology (SPAMAST) in the Province of Davao del Sur  
3   is hereby renamed as the Davao del Sur State College.

4           SEC. 2. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication  
5   in two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
