Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. December 2 of every year is hereby declared as a special
nonworking holiday in Pasay City to be known as the "Foundation Day of
Pasay City".

4 SEC. 2. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication

5 in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation. Approved,
