



AN ACT

AMENDING ARTICLE 183 OF ACT NO. 3815, AS AMENDED, DECLARING THE FILING OF FALSE COMPLAINTS AGAINST PUBLIC OFFICERS AS AN AGGRAVATING CIRCUMSTANCE OF PERJURY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Article 183 of Act No. 3815, as amended, is further amended to read

as follows:

"Art. 183. False testimony in other cases and perjury in solemn affirmation. The

penalty of arresto mayor in its maximum period to prision correctional in its minimum

period shall be imposed upon any person who, knowingly make untruthful statements

and not being included in the provisions of the next preceding articles, shall testify

under oath, or make an affidavit, upon any material matter before a competent person

authorized to administer an oath in cases in which the law so requires.

Any person who, in case of a solemn affirmation made in lieu of an oath, shall

Any person who, in case of a solemn affirmation made in lieu of an oath, shall commit any of the falsehoods mentioned made in this and the three preceding articles of this section, shall suffer the respective penalties provided therein.

A PERSON WHO KNOWINGLY FILES A FALSE COMPLAINT AGAINST A
PUBLIC OFFICER OF A GOVERNMENT AGENCY OR ANY OF ITS
SUBSIDIARIES INCLUDING LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNITS SHALL SUFFER
THE PENALTY OF PRISION MAYOR IN ITS MINIMUM TO ITS MEDIUM

- 1 PERIOD AND PAY A FINE OF FIFTY THOUSAND PESOS (P50,000.00) OR BOTH
- 2 AT THE DISCRETION OF THE COURT.
- 3 IF DURING THE COURSE OF THE INVESTIGATION OR TRIAL IT IS
- 4 PROVEN THAT THE FALSE COMPLAINT WAS USED BY THE ACCUSER AS A
- 5 LEVERAGE AGAINST THE PUBLIC OFFICER IN ORDER TO GAIN
- 6 ADVANTAGE IN A GOVERNMENT CONTRACT OR TO RECEIVE A
- 7 FAVORABLE DECISION OR RESOLUTION IN AN ONGOING DISPUTE,
- 8 CONTROVERSY OR MATTER WHERE THE LATTER IS THE GOVERNING
- 9 AUTHORITY, THE FORMER SHALL SUFFER A PENALTY OF PRISION MAYOR
- 10 IN ITS MINIMUM TO ITS MAXIMUM PERIOD AND PAY A FINE OF ONE
- 11 HUNDRED THOUSAND PESOS (P100,000.00) OR BOTH AT THE DISCRETION
- 12 OF THE COURT.

- SEC. 2. *Definition of Terms.* As used in this Act:
- 15 (a) "Public Officer" refers to a person whose duties, not being of a clerical or
- manual nature, involves the exercise of discretion in the performance of the
- functions of the government. When used with reference to a person having
- authority to do a particular act or perform a particular function in the
- 19 exercise of government power, "officers" includes any government
- 20 employee, agent or body having authority to do the act or exercise that
- 21 function.
- 22 (b) "Government" refers to the corporate governmental entity through which the
- 23 functions of the government are exercised throughout the Philippines,
- including, save as the contrary appears from the context, the various arms
- 25 through which political authority is made effective in the Philippines,
- 26 whether pertaining to the autonomous regions, the provincial, city,
- 27 municipal or barangay subdivisions or other forms of local government.

1	(c) "Complaint" shall refer to a sworn statement in writing executed by any
2	person for the purpose of charging a public officer with a fabricated or
3	untruthful or false offense.

5	SEC. 3. Separability Clause If any portion or provision of this Act is declared
6	void or unconstitutional, the remaining portions or provisions hereof shall not be
7	affected by such declaration.
8	
9	SEC. 4. Repealing Clause All laws, decrees, orders, rules and regulations, other
10	executive issuances, or parts thereof inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are
11	hereby repealed and modified accordingly.
12	
13	SEC. 5. Effectivity This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its complete
14	publication in the Official Gazette or at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
