AN ACT REAPPORTIONING THE PROVINCE OF PALAWAN INTO THREE (3) LEGISLATIVE DISTRICTS

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- SECTION 1. The Province of Palawan is hereby reapportioned into three (3) legislative districts to commence in the next national and local elections after the effectivity of this Act, each district to be composed of the following:
 - (a) First Legislative District. The municipalities that comprise the current First Legislative District of the Province of Palawan shall remain without any change in its composition, to wit:
- 8 (1) Agutaya;
- 9 (2) Araceli;
- 10 (3) Busuanga;
- 11 (4) Cagayancillo;
- 12 (5) Coron;
