

## Introduced by Senator Miriam Defensor Santiago

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#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Constitution, Article 2, Section 15 provides: "The State shall protect and promote the right to health of the people and instill health consciousness among them.

Acquired bone marrow failure diseases reportedly have a debilitating and often fatal impact on those diagnosed with these diseases. While some treatments for acquired bone marrow failure diseases can prolong and improve the quality of patients' lives, there is no single cure for these diseases.

In the United States, the National Marrow Donor Program Registry has made significant contributions to the fight against bone marrow failure diseases by connecting millions of potential marrow donors with individuals and families suffering from these conditions.

Thus, this bills directs the Secretary of Health to establish a National Acquired Bone Marrow Failure Disease Registry on acquired bone marrow failure diseases.

AN ACT ESTABLISHING A NATIONAL ACQUIRED BONE MARROW FAILURE DISEASE REGISTRY ON ACQUIRED BONE MARROW FAILURE DISEASES
Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congres. ssembled:
SECTION 1. Short Title This Act shall be known as the "Bone Marrow Failure
isease Research Act."
SECTION 2. Definition of Terms For purposes of this Act, the term "acquired bond
arrow failure disease" means:
(A) myelodysplastic syndromes (MDS);
(B) aplastic anemia;
(C) paroxysmal nocturnal hemoglobinuria (PNH);
(D) pure red cell aplasia;
(E) acute myeloid leukemia that progressed from myelodysplastic syndromes; or
(F) large granular lymphocytic leukemia.
SECTION 3. National Acquired Bone Marrow Failure Disease Registry. –
(A) Establishment of Registry –
(1) In General. – Not later than six (6) months after the date of effectivity o
this Act, the Secretary of Health (here called the "Secretary") shall:
(i) develop a system to collect data on acquired bone marrow failure

diseases; and

1	(ii) establish and maintain a national and publicly available registry, to
2	be known as the National Acquired Bone Marrow Failure Disease Registry, in
3	accordance with paragraph (C).
4	(2) Recommendations of Advisory Committee. – In carrying out this Act, the
5	Secretary shall take into consideration the recommendations of the Advisory Committee
6	on Acquired Bone Marrow Failure Diseases.
7	(3) Purposes of Registry. – The National Acquired Bone Marrow Failure
8	Disease Registry shall:
9	(i) identify the incidence and prevalence of acquired bone marrow
10	failure diseases in the Philippines;
11	(ii) be used to collect and store data on acquired bone marrow failure
12	diseases, including data concerning:
13	(a) the age, race or ethnicity, general geographic location, sex,
14	and family history of individuals who are diagnosed with acquired bone
15	marrow failure diseases, and any other characteristics of such individuals
16	determined appropriate by the Secretary;
17	(b) the genetic and environmental factors that may be
18	associated with developing acquired bone marrow failure diseases;
19	(c) treatment approaches for dealing with acquired bone
20	marrow failure diseases;
21	(d) outcomes for individuals treated for acquired bone marrow
22	failure diseases; and
23	(e) any other factors pertaining to acquired bone marrow
24	failure diseases determined appropriate by the Secretary; and
25	(iii) be made available:
26	(a) to the general public; and
27	(b) to researchers to facilitate further research into the causes
28	of, and treatments for, acquired bone marrow failure diseases in

1	accordance with standard practices of the Centers for Disease Control and
2	Preventions.
3	(B) Advisory Committee. –
4	(1) <i>Establishment.</i> – Not later than six (6) months after the date of effectivity
5	of this Act, the Secretary shall establish an advisory committee to be known as the
6	Advisory Committee on Acquired Bone Marrow Failure Diseases.
7	(2) <i>Members.</i> – The members of the Advisory Committee on Acquired Bone
8	Marrow Failure Diseases shall be appointed by the Secretary, and shall include at least
9	one representative from each of the following:
10	(i) A national patient advocacy organization with experience
11	advocating on behalf of patients suffering from acquired bone marrow failure
12	diseases.
13	(ii) The centers for Disease Control and Prevention.
14	(iii) Clinicians with experience in diagnosing or treating acquired bone
15	marrow failure diseases; and medical data registries.
16	(iv) Epidemiologists who have experience with data registries.
17	(v) Publicly or privately funded researchers who have experience
18	researching acquired bone marrow failure diseases.
19	(3) <i>Responsibilities.</i> – The Advisory Committee on Acquired Bone Marrow
20	Failure Diseases shall provide recommendations to the Secretary on the establishment
21	and maintenance of the National Acquired Bone Marrow Failure Disease Registry,
22	including recommendations on the collection, maintenance, and dissemination of data.
23	(4) <i>Public Availability.</i> – The Secretary shall make the recommendations of
24	the Advisory Committee on Acquired Bone Marrow Failure Disease publicly available.
25	(c) Grants The Secretary may award grants to, and enter into contracts and
26	cooperative agreements with, public or private nonprofit entities for the management of, as well
27	as the collection, analysis, and reporting of data to be included in, the National Acquired Bone
28	Marrow Failure Disease Registry.

1	SECTION 4. Authorization of Appropriations To carry out the provisions of this Act,
2	there are authorized to be appropriated such sums as may be necessary for each fiscal year.
3	SECTION 5. Separability Clause If any provision of this Act shall be declared
4	unconstitutional, any other provision not affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.
5	SECTION 6. Repealing Clause All laws, decrees, orders, rules and regulations, or
6	parts thereof inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed or amended accordingly.
7	SECTION 7. Effectivity. – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication
8	in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
