EXPLANATORY NOTE

In the 1993 case of Oposa v. Factoran¹ the Supreme Court recognized the concept of *inter-generational equity*, upholding the rights of minors to sue for the judicious management of our country's forests and the necessity of maintaining a sound ecological balance and protecting and enhancing the quality of the environment in accordance with Sections 15 and 16, Article II of the 1987 Constitution.

Recognizing that a system of inter-generational equity involving both rights and responsibilities may be substantially more effective in achieving the twin goals of environment protection and sustainable development, this bill seeks to impose a positive duty upon all graduating elementary, high school and college students to plant at least ten (10) trees as a prerequisite for graduation. These trees shall be their legacy to the environment and to future generations.

Indeed, while we recognize the right of the youth to a balance and healthful ecology, as proclaimed in the 1987 Constitution, there is no reason why they cannot be made to contribute in order to ensure that this would be an actual reality.

With over 12 Million students graduation from elementary and nearly 5 Million students graduation from high school² and almost $500,000^3$ graduating from college each year, this initiative, if properly implemented, will ensure that at least 175 Million new trees would be planted each year. In the course of one generation⁴, no less than 5.25 Billion trees can be planted under this initiative. Even with a survival rate of on ten percent (10%), this would mean an additional 525 Million trees would be available for the youth to enjoy, when they assume the mantle of leadership in the future.

This bill also aims to complement Executive Order No. 26, Series of 2011, issued by his Excellency, President Benigno S. Aquino III, which aims to mobilize students and government employees to plant 1.5 Billion trees over a period of six (6) years, from 2011 to 2016.

In view of the foregoing, immediate passage of this bill is earnestly requested.

AN ACT

REQUIRING ALL GRADUATING ELEMENTARY, HIGH SCHOOL AND COLLEGE STUDENTS TO PLANT AT LEAST TEN (10) TREES EACH AS A PREREQUISITE FOR GRADUATION AND FOR OTHER RELATED PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled;

1 SECTION 1. Short Title. - This act shall be known as the "Graduation Legacy 2 for the Environment Act of 2012".

SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy. - It is hereby declared the policy of the State to 4 promote and pursue environmental protection and sustainable development for poverty 5 reduction, food security, biodiversity conservation, and climate change mitigation and 6 adaptation. 7

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SEC. 3. Tree-planting as a Mandatory Requisite for Graduation. - Pursuant to 9 the policy of the state to promote and pursue environmental protection and sustainable 10 development, all graduating grade-school or primary education (Grade 6 or 7) students, 11 high school or secondary education (4th Year High School) students, as well as all college 12 or university students shall be required to plant at least ten (10) trees as a mandatory 13 Said trees shall be their living legacy to the prerequisite for their graduation. 14 environment and to future generations of Filipinos. 15

SEC. 4. Location. - The trees to be planted under this Act shall be located in any 17 18 of the following:

- 4.1 Forestlands 19

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1 SEC. 6. *Implementing Rules and Regulations*. The DepEd and the CHed, in 2 consultation with the participating agencies/institutions, shall promulgate and issue the 3 Implementing Rules and Regulations of this Act within sixty (60) days from the 4 effectivity hereof.

6 SEC. 7. *Funding Mechanisms*. Funds needed for the implementation of this Act 7 for the current year shall be provided by the DBM and funding for the succeeding years 8 shall be incorporated in the regular appropriation of participating agencies.

9

10 SEC. 8. Separability Clause. Any portion or provision of this Act that maybe 11 declared unconstitutional shall not have the effect of nullifying other provisions hereof, 12 as long as such remaining portions can still subsist and can be given effect in their 13 entirety.

SEC. 9. *Repealing Clause*. All rules and regulations and other issuances or parts
 thereof, which are inconsistent with this Act are hereby amended, repealed or modified
 accordingly.

SEC. 10. *Effectivity*. This Act shall take effect within sixty (60) days upon its
publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation of the Official Gazette.
