## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

In Article, XIV, Sec.5 (5), the 1987 Philippine Constitution aptly recognizes, "The State shall assign the highest budgetary priority to education and ensure that teaching will attract and retain its rightful share of the best available talents through adequate remuneration and other means of job satisfaction and fulfillment." (emphasis supplied)

Education is an essential key in the country's global competitiveness and one way of preparing people for this competition, we should provide them good, quality and accessible education. Through quality education, we can look forward to better opportunities for our people. Thus, we need the best and the brightest teachers in the teaching profession to produce responsible and productive citizens.

But in our present situation some of our best and brightest teachers are now teaching abroad, due to the fact that in our country teachers are not accorded with due respect and importance; at most overworked and underpaid. Their sacrifice and dedication in molding our students to make them efficient and better citizens of our society are not given much attention and credence. Most have no choice but to leave the country in search for greener pastures.

In view of the foregoing, the only way to attract and retain exceptional and dedicated teachers in the country is to raise their salaries.

Thus, approval of this bill is earnestly sought.

## Introduced by SENATOR MANNY VILLAR

## AN ACT PROVIDING FOR ADDITIONAL SUPPORT AND COMPENSATION FOR EDUCATORS IN BASIC EDUCATION AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Declaration of policy. - It is hereby declared the policy of the State to promote the welfare and economic well-being of public school teachers and personnel in basic education.

SECTION 2. Definition of terms. - For purposes of this Act, the following terms shall be defined as:

- a. Basic Education shall refer to early childhood, elementary, secondary, alternative learning system (ALS), and education for those with special needs;
- b. Locally-Funded Teacher shall refer to a public school teacher who is hired and paid for, fully or partially, by a local government unit or any other local entity in accordance with the rules and regulations issued by the Department of Education (DepEd);
- c. Non-Teaching Personnel shall refer to a person engaged in: (1) teaching in alternative learning system (ALS); (2) teaching and nonteaching employment with the Philippine Science High School System; and (3) school-based supervisory, managerial, administrative and/or technical functions in public basic education.

SECTION 3. Beneficiaries. - The additional Support and Compensation provided for in this Act shall cover the following: (1) public school teachers hired and employed by the DepEd (2) locally-funded teachers, (3) Philippine Science High School System teaching and non-teaching personnel, and (4) non-teaching personnel employed by DepEd, excluding those occupying positions from salary grade level 30, under the DepEd schedule of salaries, and/or Assistant Secretary upwards.

**SECTION 4. Additional Compensation.** – An amount of SIX THOUSAND PESOS (Php6, 000.00) per month shall be granted to those mentioned in SECTION 3 of this Act as additional compensation to their existing salary and benefits: Provided, That said amount shall be paid in three (3) equal tranches, as follows:

> First Year P2, 000.00 per month;

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Second Year P2, 000.00 per month;
Third Year P2, 000.00 per month
Provided further, that in succeeding years, said s
be continuously paid in full to the beneficiaries: Provided

Provided further, that in succeeding years, said support compensation shall be continuously paid in full to the beneficiaries: Provided furthermore, that said additional compensation shall be considered as part of the basic salary for the purpose of computing retirement pays. That the support granted under this Act shall be without prejudice to future increases in the basic pay of the herein beneficiaries.

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**SECTION 5. Appropriation.** – To immediately implement the provisions of this Act, the initial funding shall be sourced from the savings of the Executive branch of the government and other possible sources as may be determined by the Office of the President, and subsequent funds needed shall be included in the General Appropriation Act for the year following the approval of this Act.

 **SECTION 6. Transitory Provision.** – Notwithstanding Section 2 (b) of this Act, all locally-funded teachers shall enjoy the benefits herein granted: Provided, That within three (3) years from the approval of this Act, locally-funded teachers who fail to comply with said Section 2(b) shall cease to be covered by this Act.

**SECTION 7. Separability Clause** – Should any provision herein be declared unconstitutional, the same shall not affect the validity of the other provisions of this Act.

**SECTION 8.** Repealing Clause. – All laws, decrees, orders, rules, and regulations or other issuances or parts inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

**SECTION 9. Effectivity.** - This Act shall take effect immediately after its publication in the Official Gazette or in any newspaper of general circulation in the Philippines.
