## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

The highest drop out rates in our basic education system are due to the lack of support from 0 to 6 years old, cited by experts as the most critical years of learning. Experts suggest that 50 percent of a person's ability to learn is developed at age 4, while learning pathways in the brain are formed from 0 to 6 years. And yet, during this stage, our Filipino children are not reared and made ready to enter Grade 1. Instead, 1.2 million are in play centers not fit to prepare them for school while 2.5 million children of school age are not enrolled.

Any efforts in improving the higher years of education is bound to fail if we do not build a strong foundation for the development and learning of our children.

While children of middle and upper class families enjoy at least 1 or 2 years of education before entering primary school, the ordinary Filipino who could not afford to pay for pre-school begin schooling by Grade 1 when they are not school ready. On the other hand, the better-off send their young to private pre-schools.

The Early Years Act seeks to remedy this flaw in our education system, making it a national responsibility to equalize opportunities available to Filipino children by refocusing the 49,712 day care centers in the 47,000 baranggays all over the country from a playroom to a learning center by rationalizing and restructuring the day care into an early childhood education center.

In his veto message of Senate Bill 2802 or The Early Years Act, President Aquino cited efforts to streamline bureaucracy, possible overlap in agency accountability, budgetary constraints, and fears of displacement of baranggay health workers under the new bill.

Responding to these concerns, this amended bill contains the following changes:

- 1. Recognizing the Early Years as the foundation of the learning continuum, it places the ECCD Council under the Department of Education as an attached agency, instead of the Office of the President or the Department of Social Welfare and Development.
- 2. On the possible overlap among agencies, the original arrangement provided by R.A. 8980 since 2000 with the DepED, DSWD, DOH and NNC will remain similar under the new bill. Said agencies will annually meet to prepare the ECCD's work and financial plan to detail extent and scope of participation.
- 3. As a state policy, the National Government will contribute P500 Million for every year for five years to ensure achievement of universal coverage of ECCD benefits to all children from zero (0) to age four (4), supported by Local Government Units (LGU) through their Special Education Funds.


In line with budgetary constraints, the bill in fact proposes to make use of existing infrastructures to save on government expense. Further, said amount is a small price to pay in ensuring the readiness of the Filipino youth and lessening the drop out rates currently plaguing our students and achieving universal coverage of children from zero (0) to six (6) years.

4. Further, there will be no displacement of existing daycare workers, but in fact a professionalization of those currently employed through professional development programs in line with the National ECCD System.


For the following reasons, the swift approval of this bill is earnestly sought.

## AN ACT

RECOGNIZING THE EARLY YEARS FROM ZERO (0) TO AGE FOUR (4) AS THE FIRST CRUCIAL STAGE OF EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT, STRENGTHENING THE EARLY CHILDHOOD CARE AND DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL, AND RENAMING THE DAY CARE CENTER AS CHILD DEVELOPMENT CENTER AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Short Title. - This Act shall be known as the "Early Years Act (EYA) of 2012".

SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy. - It is hereby declared the policy of the State to promote the rights of children to survival, development and special protection with full recognition of the nature of childhood and as well as the need to provide developmentally appropriate experiences to address their needs; and to support parents in their roles as primary caregivers and as their children's first teachers.

The State shall institutionalize a National System for Early Childhood Care and Development (ECCD) that is comprehensive, integrative and sustainable, that involves multi-sectoral and inter-agency collaboration at the national and local levels among government; among service providers, families and communities, and among the public and private sectors, nongovernment organizations; professional associations, and academic institutions.

This System shall promote the inclusion of children with special needs, and advocate respect for cultural and linguistic diversity. It shall be anchored on complementary strategies for ECCD that include service delivery for children from zero (0) to age four (4), educating parents and caregivers, encouraging the active involvement of parents and communities in ECCD programs, raising awareness about the important efforts that improve the quality of life for young children and families.

It shall also be the policy of the State to recognize the years from zero (0) to age four (4) as the first crucial stage of educational development.

SEC. 3. Objectives. - The objectives of the National ECCD System are:

a) To achieve improved infant and child survival rates by ensuring that adequate health and nutrition programs are accessible to young children and their parents, from the prenatal period throughout the early childhood years;

b) To enhance the physical-motor, socio-emotional, cognitive, language, psychological and spiritual development of young children;

- c) To facilitate a smooth transition from care and education provided at home to community or school-based setting and to Kindergarten;

  d) To ensure that young children are adequately prepared for the formal learning system that begins at Kindergarten;

  e) To establish an efficient system for early identification, prevention, referral and
  - e) To establish an efficient system for early identification, prevention, referral and intervention for the wide range of children with special needs from zero (0) to age four (4);
  - f) To upgrade and update the capabilities of service providers and their supervisors to comply with quality standards for various ECCD programs;
  - g) To reinforce the role of parents and other caregivers as the primary caregivers and educators of their children especially from zero (0) to age four (4);
  - h) To enhance and sustain the efforts of communities to promote ECCD programs and ensure that special support is provided for poor, disadvantaged and linguistic minority communities; and
  - i) To improve the quality standards of public and private ECCD programs through, but not limited to, a registration and credential system for ECCD service providers and facilities.

## SEC. 4. Definitions. - For purposes of this Act:

a) Early Childhood Care and Development (ECCD) System shall refer to the full range of health, nutrition, early education and social services development programs that provide for the basic holistic needs of young children from zero (0) to age four (4), and to promote their optimum growth and development.

## These programs shall include:

- 1) Center-based programs, such as the day care service established under Republic Act No. 6972, hereinafter referred to as the child development service, community or church-based early childhood education programs initiated by nongovernment organizations or people's organizations, workplace-related child care and education programs, child-minding centers, health centers and stations; and;
- 2) Home-based programs, such as the neighborhood-based play groups, family child care programs, parent education and home visiting programs.
- b) ECCD Service Providers shall include the various professionals, paraprofessionals and volunteer caregivers who are directly responsible for the care and education of young children from zero (0) to age four (4) through the various center and home-based programs. They include, but are not limited to, day care workers hereinafter referred to as child development workers, child development teachers, teacher-aides, rural health midwives, social workers, community health workers, barangay nutrition scholars, parent effectiveness service volunteers, and family day care providers.
- c) ECCD Curriculum shall refer to the developmentally appropriate educational objectives and practices, programs of activities, organized learning experiences, recommended learning materials and appropriate assessment for children from zero (0) to age four (4) that are implemented by service providers through center and home-based programs. It shall consist of national program goals and guidelines, instructional

objectives, and content outlines that are age-appropriate, individually appropriate and culturally-relevant.

d) Parent Education shall refer to the various formal and alternative means of providing parents with information, skills, and support systems to assist them in their roles as their children's primary caregivers and educators. These include public and private parent education programs linked to center, home and media-based childcare and education programs.

SEC. 5. System Framework and Components. – The ECCD System shall ensure that the National ECCD Program is implemented in accordance with quality standards for accreditation and for this purpose there shall be established a National ECCD Monitoring & Evaluation Framework. The ECCD System shall include the following components:

a) ECCD Curriculum. - Focuses on children's total development and takes into account age, individual and socio-cultural appropriateness. It shall promote the delivery of complementary and integrative services for health, nutrition, early childhood education, sanitation and cultural activities. It shall use the child's first language as the medium of instruction.

b) Parent Education and Involvement, Advocacy and Mobilization of Communities. - Harness and develop parents' strengths as providers of ECCD programs at home, as active partners of other stakeholders, as advocates for community concerns that affect children, and as pillars of support for local and national ECCD programs through community organization efforts

c) Human Resource Development Program. - Establishes mechanisms for the systematic professionalization of ECCD service providers, through enrolment in educational programs in site-based or distance education modes, through preservice or in-service training including continuing education programs, whereby a registration and credential system shall be developed in the ECCD System.

d) ECCD Management. - Focuses on a continuing process of planning, implementation, supervision, financial management, monitoring, evaluation and reporting to persons concerned. It shall encourage the active involvement and build the capabilities of service providers, parents and local government officials to sustain the program.

SEC. 6. Expanding the ECCD System. - The National ECCD System shall be expanded to all provinces, cities/municipalities and barangays as may be determined by the ECCD Council to achieve universal ECCD coverage for all children from zero (0) to age four (4).

SEC. 7. Implementing Arrangements and Operational Structures. – the implementation of the National ECCD System shall be the responsibility of the ECCD Council.

 a) Responsibilities of the ECCD Council. - The ECCD Council shall be responsible for establishing national standards, developing policies and programs, ensuring compliance thereof, providing technical assistance and support to the ECCD service providers in consultation with coordinating committees at the provincial, city/municipal and barangay levels.

The ECCD Council, The Department of Education (DepED), the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), the Department of Health (DOH), the National Nutrition Council (NNC) and the Union of Local Authorities of the Philippines (ULAP) shall meet in an annual workshop to prepare work and financial plans incorporating the financial and technical support of said entities as

The Council shall be attached to the DepED.

Sec.11. Financing ECCD Programs - ECCD programs shall be financed through a combination of public and private funds. All public ECCD program providers shall prioritize children from zero (0) to age four (4) from families who are in greatest need and who can least afford private ECCD programs.

1) Perform such other functions as the ECCD Council may deem necessary.

a) The DepEd, DSWD, DOH, NNC and ULAP shall support the implementation of the National ECCD System and shall include in their respective annual general appropriation beginning the fiscal year following the approval of this Act the necessary funding to achieve the goal of universal coverage of ECCD programs to all children from zero (0) to age four (4) and sustain the Program from thereon.

 b) Support for ECCD Programs - The government shall support public ECCD programs that shall involve the LGUs, and funds from the national government agencies for technical assistance and support. Additional funds may be generated from intergovernmental donors and financial institutions by the appropriate government agencies through the NEDA to support the public programs in all municipalities including the urban poor.

There shall be established a fund for an ECCD Program Contracting Scheme with accredited private providers at the community levels.

c) Fees and Contributions - Fees and contributions collected for both public and private ECCD programs shall be monitored by the ECCD Council to ensure that these are affordable and within reasonable limits. Families are encouraged to volunteer their time and services to support the ECCD programs.

 Sec. 12. Appropriations. - For the implementation of this Act the amount of Five Hundred Million Pesos (Php 500,000,000.00) per year for five (5) years is hereby appropriated for the National ECCD Program, effective upon approval of this Act. Said amount shall be funded from the gross income of the Philippine Amusement and Gaming Corporation and shall be directly remitted in four (4) quarterly instalments to a special account of the ECCD Council.

Funds for the operations of the Council as an attached agency of the DepEd shall be included in the General Appropriations Act.

Financial and technical support packages provided by the DepEd, DSWD, DOH and NNC for ECCD Programs shall be specified as separate line items in their respective annual budgets in the General Appropriations Act.

 Sec. 13. Annual Report. - The ECCD Council shall, at the close of each calendar year, submit an annual report to Congress, giving a detailed account of its proceedings and accomplishments during the year, making recommendations for the adoption of measures that will improve the National ECCD System and ensuring achievement of universal coverage of ECCD benefits to all children from zero (0) to age four (4) within a period of five (5) years.

SEC. 14. Implementing Rules and Regulations. - The Council, in consultation with appropriate government agencies and nongovernment organizations, shall formulate and issue the necessary rules and regulations for the implementation of this Act within thirty (30) days after the effectivity of this Act.

 SEC. 15. Repealing Clause. - Republic Act No. 8980, otherwise known as "An Act Promulgating A Comprehensive Policy And A National System For Early Childhood Care And Development (ECCD), Providing Funds Therefore And For Other Purposes" is hereby repealed. Pertinent provisions of all laws, decrees, executive orders, presidential proclamations, rules and regulations or parts thereof contrary to or inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

13 SEC. 16. Separability Clause. - If any provision of this Act is declared unconstitutional, the same shall not affect the validity and effectivity of the other provisions hereof.

16 SEC. 17. Effectivity Clause. - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
