Senate Bill No. 3205

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The country's banking and financial sector belong to the most important institutions that act as engines of national development. Not only must it remain strong and steadfast so as the nation may continue to enjoy a sound economic environment, it should more importantly stay committed to its promise of being safe havens to client's hard earned money.

However, recent experiences revealed several cracks in existing policies regarding banking that economic saboteurs capitalize on schemes calculated to plunder outrageous amounts of deposits in banks. Worse, most of the victims are depositors of rural and thrift banks that belong to the poorer sector of society. Much worst is the fact that it is the government through the Philippine Deposit and Insurance Commission (PDIC) which is forced to be subrogated to the obligation to return the deposits within the amounts insured.

This treacherous act of plundering must end but efforts to address this menace seem to lack the efficacy to do just that. Thus, this measure is proposing the revision of the law now existing to underscore the need to equate a severe punishment to this dastardly act of raiding the coffers of unsuspecting depositors. Not only does this measure insulate the depositors from these plunderers cum economic saboteurs but likewise it will help maintain the confidence and trust of the people to the nation's banking sector.

Early passage of this bill is earnestly sought.

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
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AN ACT

EXPANDING THE SCOPE OF THE CRIME OF ECONOMIC SABOTAGE

AMENDING FOR THAT PURPOSE PRESIDENTIAL DECREE NO. 1689

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress

assembled:

follows:

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Section 1. Section 1 of Presidential Decree No. 1689 is hereby amended to read as

"Section 1. Any person [or persons] who, BY HIMSELF OR IN CONNIVANCE WITH MEMBERS OF HIS FAMILY, RELATIVES BY OR CONSANGUINITY, **BUSINESS** ASSOCIATES, SUBORDINATES OR OTHER PERSONS, shall DEFRAUD OR MISAPPROPRIATE MONEY CONTRIBUTED BY STOCKHOLDERS, OR MEMBERS OF RURAL BANKS, COOPERATIVE, "SAMAHANG NAYON(S)", OR FARMERS ASSOCIATION, OR OF FUNDS SOLICITED BY CORPORATIONS/ASSOCIATIONS FROM THE GENERAL PUBLIC THROUGH AN ACT OR ACTS CONSTITUTING estafa or other forms of swindling as defined in Article 315 and 316 of the Revised Penal Code, as amended, shall be punished by life imprisonment to death. [if the swindling (estafa) is committed by a syndicate consisting of five or more persons formed with the intention of carrying out the unlawful or illegal act, transaction, enterprise or scheme, and the defraudation results in the misappropriation of money contributed by stockholders, or members of rural banks, cooperative, "samahang nayon(s)", or farmers association, or of funds solicited by corporations/associations from the general public.]

| 16 | consistent with any provision of this Act is hereby amended, repealed or modified |

| 19 | Sec. 4. Effectivity Clause This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its complete |
