"AN ACT ALLOWING EARLY VOTING IN NATIONAL AND LOCAL ELECTIONS"

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. *Title.* This Act shall be known as the Early Voting Act of 2010.

2 SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy. It is hereby declared a policy of the State to protect, 3 promote and secure the will of the sovereign. Toward this end, the State shall ensure

4 that laws are in place for its constituents to be able to exercise their right to suffrage

5 freely, orderly and peacefully with the end in view of ensuring their choice of

leadership in government.

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SEC. 3. *Coverage.* This Act shall cover the conduct of early voting, counting and canvassing in municipalities, cities, and/or provinces as determined by the COMELEC pursuant to the provisions of this Act.

SEC. 4. Early Voting. The Commission on Elections (COMELEC), motu propio or upon a verified petition, after due notice and hearing, may authorize the conduct of early voting in political subdivision/s as may be determined by it not later than March 10, 2010 for the May 10, 2010 elections, and one hundred fifty (150) days before the regular election day in succeeding elections.

Provided, that said political subdivision/s shall be determined only where there is a history of election violence or terrorism and analogous causes of such nature that would endanger the holding of free, orderly, honest, peaceful and credible elections.

1	Provided further, that the total number of registered voters in said political
2	subdivision/s does not exceed ten percent (10%) of the total number of registered
3	voters nationwide.
4	Provided finally, that the early voting shall be conducted not earlier than
5	one month but not later than ten (10) days before the date of the elections.

7	SEC. 5. Early Voting for certain sectors. The COMELEC shall likewise authorize
8	the conduct of early voting under RA No. 9189 and EO No. 157 series of 1987 for sectors
9	mentioned therein, members of the media, detainees/inmates and uniformed personnel
10	of the BJMP.
11	SEC. 6. Early Voting Day - The COMELEC shall ensure the participation of all
12	registered voters in political subdivisions where early voting shall be conducted.
13	SEC. 7. Implementing Rules and Regulations The COMELEC shall, within ten
14	(10) days from the effectivity of this Act, promulgate the necessary implementing rules
15	and regulations for the effective implementation of this Act in time for the May 10, 2010
16	elections.
17	SEC. 8. Repealing Clause. All laws, decrees, orders, rules and regulations and
18	other issuances or parts thereof which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Act
19	are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.
20	SEC. 9. Separability Clause. In the event that any provision of this Act is declared
21	unconstitutional, the validity of the other provisions shall not be affected by such
22 .	declaration.
23	SEC. 10. Effectivity Clause. This Act shall effect immediately following its
24	publication in the Official Gazette or in at least two newspapers of general circulation.
