AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE LIABILITY OF THE ABSOLUTE COMMUNITY OR CONJUGAL PARTNERSHIP FOR AN OBLIGATION OF A SPOUSE WHO PRACTICES A PROFESSION AND THE CAPABILITY OF EITHER SPOUSE TO DISPOSE OF AN EXCLUSIVE PROPERTY WITHOUT THE CONSENT OF THE OTHER SPOUSE, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE ARTICLES 73 AND-111 OF EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 209, ALSO KNOWN AS THE FAMILY CODE OF THE PHILIPPINES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1	SECTION 1. Article 73 of the Family Code, as amended, is hereby					
2	further amended to read as follows:					
3	"Art. 73. Either spouse may exercise any legitimate					
4	profession, occupation, business or activity without the consent of					
5	the other. The latter may object only on valid, serious, and moral					
6	grounds.					
7	"In case of disagreement, the court shall decide whether or not:					
8	"(1) The objection is proper, and					
9	"(2) Benefit has accrued to the family prior to the objection					
10	or thereafter. If the benefit accrued prior to the objection the					

1	resulting obligation shall be enforced against THE COMMUNITY					
2	PROPERTY. IF THE BENEFIT ACCRUED THEREAFTER, SUCH					
3	OBLIGATION SHALL BE ENFORCED AGAINST the separate property					
4	of the spouse who has not obtained consent.					
5	"The foregoing provisions shall not prejudice the rights of					
6	creditors who acted in good faith."					
7	SEC. 2. Article 111 of the Family Code, as amended, is hereby further					
8	amended to read as follows:					
9	"Art. 111. [A spouse of age] EITHER SPOUSE may mortgage,					
10	encumber, alienate or otherwise dispose of his or her exclusive					
11	property[, without the consent of the other spouse, and appear					
12	alone in court to litigate with regard to the same]."					
13	SEC. 3. Separability Clause If any provision or part hereof is					
14	held invalid or unconstitutional, the remainder of the law or the provision not					
15	otherwise affected shall remain valid and subsisting.					
16	SEC. 4. Repealing Clause Any law, presidential decree or					
17	issuance, executive order, letter of instruction, administrative order, rule or					
18	regulation contrary to or inconsistent with the provisions of this Act is hereby					
19	repealed, modified or amended accordingly.					
20	SEC. 5. Effectivity Clause This Act shall take effect fifteen (15)					
21	days after its publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation
