AN ACT ENSURING THE ACCESSIBILITY OF THE ELECTORAL PROCESSES TO PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES (PWDs) and SENIOR CITIZENS (SCs)

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 SECTION 1. Short Title. - This Act shall be known as the "Electoral Processes

2 Accessibility Act of 2012."

- SECTION 2. *Declaration of Policy.* The State shall ensure that persons with disabilities (PWDs) and senior citizens (SCs) are able to exercise their right to political participation without discrimination or restrictions. Towards this end, the State shall design systems and procedures that will enable PWDs and SCs to register and vote by themselves.
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SECTION 3. Definition of Terms. - As used in this Act, the term:

a) "Persons with Disabilities (PWDs)" refer to qualified voters who have long-term
physical, mental, intellectual, or sensory impairments, which in interaction with various
barriers may hinder their full and effective participation in the electoral processes on an equal
basis with others.

b) "Senior Citizens (SCs)" refer to qualified voters who are sixty (60) years or older.

c) "Electoral Processes" refer to election-related activities and proceedings including
registration, candidacy, campaign, voter education, and casting of vote.

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d) "Assistance" refers to any support or aid that may be extended to PWDs and SCs for them to meaningfully and effectively participate in the electoral processes.

e) "Discrimination on the basis of disability" means any distinction, exclusion, or
restriction on the basis of disability which has the effect of impairing or nullifying the
recognition, enjoyment, or exercise, on an equal basis with others, of all human rights and
fundamental freedoms, including denial of reasonable accommodation.

f) "Reasonable accommodation" means necessary and appropriate modification and
adjustments not imposing a disproportionate or undue burden to PWDs and SCs, to ensure
the enjoyment or exercise on an equal basis with others of all human rights and fundamental
freedoms.

14 g) "Universal design" means the design of products, environments, programs and 15 services, including assistive devices, to be used by all persons, without the need for 16 adaptation or specialized design.

h) "Satellite registration" refers to registration conducted by an Election Officer (EO)
in established satellite offices located in a public place within his/her area of jurisdiction. It
accepts applications for registration, transfer/transfer with reactivation, reactivation of
registration records, change/correction of entries and validation of registration from all
registrants or voters residing within the EO's territorial jurisdiction.

i) "Special registration" refers to registration conducted in established satellite office
by a special registration team (SRT) designated by Commission on Elections (Comelec). It

exclusively caters to first time PWD and SC registrants residing outside the area of
jurisdiction of the regular EO conducting the satellite registration.

j) "Accessible polling place" refers to the venue where the Board of Election
Inspectors (BEIs) conduct election related proceedings and where the voters cast their votes.
The polling place shall be located at the ground floor, preferably near the entrance of the
building, and is free of any physical barriers and provided with necessary services, including
assistive devices.

8 SECTION 4. *Right to Participation in Electoral Processes.* - The State shall 9 guarantee the political rights of PWDs and SCs, in line with the concepts of reasonable 10 accommodation and universal design, by:

a) Ensuring that voting procedures, facilities and materials are appropriate, accessible,
and easy to understand and use;

b) Protecting the right of PWDs and SCs to vote by secret ballot in elections without
intimidation, facilitating the use of assistive and new technologies where appropriate;

c) Guaranteeing the free expression, in the exercise of the right of suffrage, of PWDs
and SCs, allowing assistance in voting by a person of their own choice;

17 SECTION 5. Duty of the Commission on Elections (Comelec) to render Assistance to 18 *PWDs and SCs.* - It shall be the duty of the Comelec to render appropriate assistance to 19 PWDs and SCs in coordination with Government Agencies and Civil Society Organizations.

SECTION 6. *Record of PWDs and SCs.* - Comelec shall keep an updated record of PWDs and SCs who are registered as voters, indicating the types of disability and the assistance they need, to assist it in determining policy directions for more inclusive and accessible electoral processes. The record shall be made accessible to concerned government

offices, accredited citizen's arms, civil society monitoring groups and other organizations
which promote the rights of the PWDs and SCs, subject to specific guidelines the Comelec
may promulgate to protect the privacy of the individuals concerned.

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4 SECTION 7. *Registration and Updating of Records.* – In designing the forms, 5 Comelec must ensure that PWDs and SCs applying for registration, reactivation, transfer, or 6 correction of entry may indicate the type(s) of impairment, as well as the form(s) of 7 assistance needed.

8 PWDs and SCs who have previously registered but have not indicated the type of 9 disability, or who may have developed/manifested such disability after having been 10 registered, shall be allowed, during the periods to file applications for registration, to update 11 their registration records, and to indicate the type of assistance they may need during election 12 day. Comelec may design registration forms specifically for PWDs and SCs, or issue 13 supplemental forms for the said purposes, and provide for procedures to be followed by those 14 who need to update their registration records.

SECTION 8. Assistance in the accomplishment of application form. - A PWD or SC who cannot by himself/herself accomplish an application for registration, by reason of illiteracy or physical disability, shall be assisted by the Election Officer (EO) in the preparation of his/her application form, or by any member of an accredited citizen's arm, or a relative within the fourth civil degree of consanguinity or affinity, or if he/she has none present, by any person on his/her confidence who belongs to the same household.

21 SECTION 9. *Satellite and Special Registration.* - Comelec, in coordination with 22 national government agencies and local government units, PWD and SC organizations, and

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other cause-oriented groups, shall conduct satellite and/or special registration for PWDs and
SCs in places accessible to the PWDs and the SCs.

3 SECTION 10. *Accessible Polling Places.* - Comelec shall designate accessible polling 4 places where PWDs and SCs may be able to cast their votes on election day and be provided 5 with the necessary forms of assistance. The polling place shall be located at the ground floor 6 of each voting center preferably near the entrance of the building.

Pursuant to the foregoing, the Comelec may: (1) maintain the existing precinct
assignment of the PWDs and SCs voters; or (2) establish a separate precinct for PWDs and
SCs; or (3) combine them with other voters in an existing precinct assigned on the ground
floor, and upon consultation with PWD and SC sectors.

11 SECTION 11. *Ballot Design.* - In designing the ballot, Comelec, shall ensure 12 reasonable accommodation to PWDs and SCs to enable them to accomplish the ballots by 13 themselves.

14 SECTION 12. Assistance in the Accomplishment of the Ballot. - A PWD or SC who is 15 illiterate or physically unable to prepare the ballot by himself or herself may be assisted in 16 the preparation of his or her ballot by a relative by affinity or consanguinity within the fourth 17 civil degree, or if he or she has none, by any person of his or her confidence who belong to 18 the same household, or by any member of the board of election inspectors. For this purpose, 19 the person who usually assists the PWD or SC, such as a personal assistant, a caregiver, or a 20 nurse shall be considered a member of his or her household.

No voter shall be allowed to have an assistor on the basis of illiteracy or physical disability unless it is so indicated in his or her registration record. Nevertheless, if the physical inability to prepare the ballot is manifest, obvious, or visible, said voter shall be

allowed to be assisted in accomplishing the ballot by a qualified assistor, even if not stated or
indicated in the registration record.

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Except the members of the board of election inspectors, in no case shall an assistor assist more than three times. The person thus chosen shall prepare the ballot for the PWD or SC voter inside the voting booth. The person assisting shall bind himself or herself in a formal document under oath to fill out the ballot strictly in accordance with the instructions of the voter and not to reveal the contents of the ballot prepared by him or her. Violation of this provision shall constitute an election offense punishable under Section 262 of the Omnibus Election Code.

10 SECTION 13. *Pool of Expert Services.* - Comelec, in coordination with the National 11 Council on Disability Affairs (NCDA), shall ensure that a pool of expert services including 12 sign language interpreters, Braille translators and such other technical support would assist 13 PWDs and SCs during the registration period and election day subject to the rules to be 14 promulgated by Comelec.

15 SECTION 14. *Sensitivity Training Program.* -- Comelec, in coordination with the 16 NCDA, the Commission on Human Rights (CHR), and PWD and SC organizations, shall 17 organize, design, and implement sensitivity trainings to persons performing electoral duties, 18 including Comelec field officers, members of the BEIs, and accredited citizens' arms to 19 familiarize with the needs of the PWDs and SCs.

20 SECTION 15. *Information Materials.* -- Comelec shall ensure that information 21 materials relating to the electoral processes are appropriate and accessible to PWDs and SCs.

22 SECTION 16. *Appropriations*. - The initial funding of this Act shall be charged 23 against the current year's appropriations or from any available savings of the Comelec.

Thereafter, such amount as may be necessary for the continued implementation of this Act
shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act.

3 Section 17. *Implementing Rules and Regulations*. - Within sixty (60) days from the 4 effectivity of this Act, the Comelec, shall promulgate the rules and regulations for the 5 implementation of this Act.

6 SECTION 18. *Separability Clause*. - Should any provision of this Act be declared 7 invalid or unconstitutional, the validity or constitutionality of the other provisions shall not 8 be affected thereby.

9 Section 19. *Repealing Clause*. - All laws, decrees, letters of instructions, resolutions,
10 orders, ordinances or parts thereof which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, are
11 hereby repealed, amended, or modified accordingly.

Section 20. *Effectivity Clause.* - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its
publication in two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
