EXPLANATORY NOTE


The Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PCSO) is considered the "principal government agency for raising and providing funds for health programs, medical assistance and services, and charities of national character"⁷ The heart and soul of the PCSO is its charitable pursuit.

The PCSO Charter allocates 30% of its net receipts to the Charity Fund. As a result of regular mandatory contributions imposed upon the PCSO by virtue of several laws and executive orders, the Charity Fund is greatly diminished. An overview of these decrees will reveal that most of the intended recipients, be it a government agency, or the implementation of a government program, does not in any way pertain to health or medical concerns. These mandatory contributions should therefore be discontinued to increased and thereby enhance PCSO's Charity Fund.

To emphasize, the heart and soul of PCSO is its charitable pursuit. If we set aside funds for extraneous mandatory contributions prior to allocating funds for charity, then this will negate the very existence of PCSO.

PCSO's mandatory contribution pursuant to R.A. 9165 or the "Comprehensive Dangerous Drugs Act of 2002" should therefore be abolished.

In view of the foregoing, the immediate enactment of this measure is earnestly sought.

AN ACT
ABOLISHING REGULAR MANDATORY CONTRIBUTIONS IMPOSED ON THE
PHILIPPINE CHARITY SWEEPSTAKES OFFICE (PCSO), MODIFYING FOR THE
PURPOSE SEC. 87 OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 9165

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 **SECTION 1. *Statement of Policy.*** - It is hereby declared the policy of the State to
2 guarantee that the Charity Fund of the Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PCSO) shall
3 achieve its maximum potential to better serve its intended beneficiaries.

5 **SECTION 2. *Abolition of Regular Mandatory Contributions of PCSO.*** - The
6 mandatory contribution of PCSO as found in Sec. 87 of R.A. 9165 or the "Comprehensive
7 Dangerous Drugs Act of 2002" described specifically as "Ten percent (10%) of all unclaimed
8 and forfeited sweepstakes and lotto prizes but not less than twelve million pesos
9 (P12,000,000.00) per year from the Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PCSO)" is
10 hereinafter abolished.

11 **SECTION 3. SECTION 20. *Effectivity.*** - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days
12 after its complete publication in the Official Gazette or in at least two (2) national newspapers of
13 general circulation.
