CALL TO ORDER

At 3:03 p.m., the Senate President, Hon. Franklin M. Drilon, called the session to order.

Senator Cayetano (A) said that the designation of the vice chair would be left to the committee chair.

Moreover, he explained that the committee will have 15 members, 11 from the Majority and four from the Minority following the Majority to Minority ratio of 75%:25%...

MANIFESTATION OF SENATOR SOTTO

Senator Sotto requested that the Minority be given a day or two to discuss among themselves their membership to the different committees.

CLARIFICATION OF SENATOR CAYETANO (A)

Senator Cayetano (A) stated that the Senate President Pro Tempore, the Majority Leader and the Minority leader are *ex-officio* members of all the committees. He explained that if the Committee on Education, Arts and Culture, for instance, is allowed to have 15 members including the chair, that number would not include the *ex-officio* members; thus, following the Majority to Minority ratio of 75%:25% for the said committee, the Majority would have 11 members and the Minority would have four members. He added that the ratio allows for a little liberality because it is not possible to have a half or one-third or 75/100 of a human being.
