EXPLANATORY NOTE

The 1987 Constitution mandates the State to "establish, maintain, and support a complete, adequate, and integrated system of education relevant to the people and society." (Sec. 2 [I], *Art* XIV).

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AN ACT

TO INCLUDE THE TEACHING OF COMPUTER SUBJECT AS PART OF THE ELEMENTARY AND HIGH SCHOOL CURRICULA BOTH IN PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SCHOOLS

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. The teaching of computer subject is hereby mandatorily included as an additional subject for all students in elementary and high school both in public and private schools.

SECTION 2. The Department of Education shall promulgate the necessary rules and regulations to implement this Act.

SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days following its complete publication in the Official Gazette or in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
