RESOLUTION
DIRECTING THE PROPER SENATE COMMITTEE TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY,
IN AID OF LEGISLATION, ON THE REPORTED DESECRATION OF BURIAL
SITES IN SAGADA

WHEREAS, Article 14, Section 16 of the Constitution states that "All the country's artistic and historic wealth constitutes the cultural treasure of the nation and shall be under the protection of the State which may regulate its disposition";

WHEREAS, according past news reports, burial caves in Sagada need more watchdogs to prevent desecration;

WHEREAS, it was reported that the Lumiang Cave is a popular tourist destination known for its numerous piled hanging coffins made from old pinewood, and is allegedly flocked by 10,000 foreign and local tourists yearly;

WHEREAS, the Sagada Tourist Environment Association (STEA) officials said that some tourists tend to become irresponsible, leading to the desecration of Sagada's traditional caves;

WHEREAS, because of this development, STEA had to become more vigilant, eventually banning tourists from coming near or touching the coffins;

WHEREAS, it was reported that tourists are now required to register and they must be accompanied by tourism officers so they can be easily traced;

WHEREAS, the rightful preservation of the hanging coffins in Lumiang Cave should be implemented;

WHEREAS, Congress should take measures and implement stricter guidelines or laws that will see to the preservation of historical sites;

WHEREAS, it is imperative that the government attends to the preservation of historical sites not only because these generate revenue from tourism, but especially because these sites are testimonials of and provide insights into Philippine culture and heritage;

WHEREFORE, be it hereby resolved by the Philippine Senate to direct the proper Senate committee to conduct an inquiry, in aid of legislation, on the reported desecration of burial sites in Sagada.
