#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

Tourism is a fast-growing industry in the Philippines. In fact, as of 2013, tourism is being eyed as one of the forerunners for the country's economic growth. It is expected to generate a significant number of local employment opportunities. As such, there is a need to strengthen tourism safeguards set forth in Republic Act No. 9593, otherwise known as the "Tourism Act of 2009."

One of the concerns raised by local government units where tourism is a significant industry is the lack of a permanent position for a tourism officer. Section 42 of R.A. 9593 explicitly mandates that a permanent position for tourism officers be created in local government units where tourism is a significant industry. However, Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the "Local Government Code of 1991," contains no such provision in its exclusive list of officers for every local government unit.

The lack of a specific amendatory clause in R.A. 9593 resulted in the failure to establish a permanent position for tourism officers despite the need therefor, as stated by local government units. The proposed legislation intends to address this issue by amending the relevant provisions of R.A. 7160. The present bill will promote the growth of the tourism industry by strengthening grass-root regulation and promotion of tourism in the country.

In view of the foregoing, the immediate passage of this bill is earnestly sought.

## AN ACT AMENDING SECTIONS 443, 454, and 463 OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7160, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE OF 1991"

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Sections 443 of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the 1 "Local Government Code of 1991" is hereby amended to read as follows: 2 3 Sec. 443. Repealing Clause. All laws, presidential decrees, executive orders, rules, and regulations, or portions thereof, inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed or 38 modified accordingly. 39 40 SEC. 6. Separability Clause. If any part of provision of this Act shall be held 41

unconstitutional or invalid, other provisions hereof which are not affected thereby shall

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continue to be in full force and effect.

- SEC. 7. Effectivity. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its
- 2 publication in the Official Gazette or in two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
