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### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This bill seeks to declare the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park in Misamis Oriental as a protected area.

The Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park, which covers 8,423.569 hectares, bears a unique and lush biological and hydrological features. It holds substantial major rivers such as Maanas river, Maayam, Gatub, Magiskis, Samay, Agay-ayan, and Anahaw, Paytabian, Kihangad, Dumpilayan, Kiuneng, Samay and Hinupolan rivers. These major rivers play a vital role in the water supply throughout the area of Northern Mindanao particularly in the eastern part of Misamis Oriental. The Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park also houses important fauna such as the Wild pig, Deer, Wild chicken, Wild dove, Pigeon, Wood pecker, Civet cat, Phil. deer, Tausi, Monkey, Owl; and flora such as the Almaciga, White lauan, Red lauan, Nato, Tanguile, Narig, Makaasim, Kalingag, Baliti, Apitong, Maltibig, Mayapis, Marang Banguhan, Bayanti, Gmelina, Baliti, Bayok, Almon, and Egim.

This bill, therefore, seeks to declare the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park as protected in order to protect it from indiscriminate exploitation and to be able to maintain its ecological balance and preserve its source of water supply.

Given the importance of biodiversity, it is deemed crucial that we act on this now to ensure that our children and the succeeding generations will inherit a living earth with all of its bountiful natural resources and vibrant wildlife.


In view of the foregoing, the passage of this measure is earnestly urged.

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**AN ACT**

**ESTABLISHING THE MT. BALATUKAN RANGE LOCATED IN THE CITY OF GINGOOG AND IN THE MUNICIPALITIES OF CLAVERIA, MEDINA, AND BALINGASAG, ALL IN THE PROVINCE OF MISAMIS ORIENTAL, AS A PROTECTED AREA, UNDER THE CATEGORY OF PROTECTED LANDSCAPE, PROVIDING FOR ITS MANAGEMENT, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:*

1           **SECTION 1. Title.** – This Act shall be known as the “Mt. Balatukan Range  
2 Natural Park Act of 2013.”

3           **SEC. 2. Land Classification.** – All lands of the public domain comprising  
4 the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park shall fall under the classification of National  
5 Park as provided for in the Philippine Constitution.

6           **SEC. 3. Scope and Coverage.** – The Mt. Balatukan Range, which falls  
7 under the category of Natural Park as defined therein, shall cover lands of the  
8 public domain located in the City of Gingoog and the Municipalities of Claveria,  
9 Medina, and Balingasag, all within the Province of Misamis Oriental. It shall have  
10 the following boundaries: Beginning at a corner marked “1” which is located at  
11 124°57'21” E and 8°47'35” N near the junction at Kihangad River and a branch  
12 creek S 75°22'45” E, 950.79 m.

30 (1,222) hectares, more or less, subject to actual ground survey and delineation to  
31 be conducted by the DENR.

32 The technical descriptions provided in this Act will be subject to ground  
33 survey and verification to be conducted by the Department of Environment and  
34 Natural Resources.

35 Any modification of the coverage of this Act due to such factors as changing  
36 ecological situations, new scientific or archeological findings, or discovery of  
37 traditional boundaries not previously taken into account shall be made through an

1 act of Congress, after consultation with the affected public and concerned  
2 government agencies.

3 **SEC. 4. Definition of Terms.** – The following terms are hereby defined for  
4 the purpose of this Act:

5 a. “Ancestral Domain” refers to all areas generally belonging to Indigenous  
6 Cultural Communities or Indigenous People (ICCs/IPs) comprising lands, inland  
7 waters, coastal areas, and natural resources therein, held under a claim of  
8 ownership, occupied or possessed by the ICCs/IPs, by themselves or thru their  
9 ancestors, communally or individually since time immemorial, continuously to the  
10 present except if interrupted by war, *force majeure* or displacement by force,  
11 deceit, stealth or as a consequence of government projects or any other voluntary  
12 dealings entered into by government or public individuals/corporations, and which  
13 are necessary to ensure their economic, social and cultural welfare. It shall  
14 include ancestral lands, forests, pasture, residential, agricultural, and other lands  
15 individually owned whether alienable and disposable or otherwise, hunting  
16 grounds, burial grounds, worship areas, bodies of water, mineral and other natural  
17 resources, and lands which may no longer be exclusively occupied by ICCs/IPs  
18 but from which they traditionally had access to for their subsistence and traditional  
19 activities, particularly the home ranges of ICCs/IPs who are still nomadic and/or  
20 shifting cultivators.

21 b. “Biodiversity” refers to variety and variability among living organisms and  
22 the ecological complexes in which said organisms occur.

23 c. “Biological resources” refers to genetic resources, organisms or parts  
24 thereof, population, or any other biotic component of ecosystems with actual or  
25 potential use or value for humanity.

26 d. “Bioprospecting” means the research, collection and utilization of  
27 biological and genetic resources for purposes of applying the knowledge derived  
28 therefrom solely for commercial purposes.

29 e. “Buffer Zone” refers to the identified area outside the boundaries of and  
30 immediately adjacent to the designated Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park that  
31 need special development control in order to avoid or minimize harm to the Mt.  
32 Balatukan Range Natural Park.

33 f. “By-products or derivatives” refers to any part taken or substance  
34 extracted from wildlife, in raw or in processed form. This includes stuffed animals  
35 and herbarium specimens.

36 g. “Collection or collecting” refers to the act of gathering or harvesting  
37 wildlife, its by-products or derivatives.

- 1 h. "Conservation" refers to the sustainable utilization of wildlife, and/or  
2 maintenance, restoration and enhancement of the habitat.
- 3 i. "Ecosystem" refers to the dynamic complex of plant, animal and micro-  
4 organism communities and their non-living environment interacting as a functional  
5 unit.
- 6 j. "Endangered species" refers to species or subspecies of flora and fauna  
7 that is not critically endangered but whose survival in the wild is unlikely if the  
8 causal factors continue operating.
- 9 k. "Endemic species" refers to species or subspecies of flora and fauna  
10 which is naturally occurring and found only within specific areas in the country.
- 11 l. "Exotic species" refers to species or subspecies of flora and fauna which  
12 do not naturally occur within the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park at present or  
13 in historical time.
- 14 m. "Habitat" refers to a place or type of environment where a species or  
15 subspecies naturally occur or has naturally established its population.
- 16 n. "Hunting" refers to collection of wild fauna for food and/or recreational  
17 purposes with the use of weapons such as guns, bow and arrow, spear and the  
18 like.
- 19 o. "Indigenous Cultural Communities or Indigenous People (ICC/IPs)"  
20 refers to a group of people or homogenous societies identified by self-ascription  
21 and ascription by others, who have continuously lived as organized community on  
22 communally bounded and defined territory, and who have, under claims of  
23 ownership since time immemorial, occupied, possessed and utilized such  
24 territories, sharing common bonds of language, customs, traditions and other  
25 distinctive cultural traits, or who have, through resistance to political, social and  
26 cultural inroads of colonization, non-indigenous religions and cultures, became  
27 historically differentiated from the majority of Filipinos. IPs shall likewise include  
28 peoples who are regarded as indigenous on account of their descent from the  
29 populations which inhabited the Country, at the time of conquest or colonization,  
30 or at the time of inroads of non-indigenous religions and cultures, or the  
31 establishment of present state boundaries, who retain some or all of their own  
32 social, economic, cultural and political institutions, but who may have been  
33 displaced from their traditional domains or who may have resettled outside their  
34 ancestral domains.
- 35 p. "Management plan" refers to the fundamental plan, strategy and/or  
36 scheme which shall guide all activities relating to the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural  
37 Park in order to attain the objectives of this Act.

1 q. "Mineral" refers to all naturally occurring inorganic substance in solid,  
2 gas, liquid, or any intermediate state including energy materials such as coal,  
3 petroleum, natural gas, radioactive materials, and geothermal energy.

4 r. "Multiple-Use Zone" refers to the area where settlement, traditional  
5 and/or sustainable land use, including agriculture, agro-forestry, extraction  
6 activities and other income generating or livelihood activities, may be allowed to  
7 the extent prescribed in the management plan.

8 s. "National Integrated Protected Areas System (NIPAS)" refers to the  
9 classification and administration of all designated protected areas to maintain  
10 essential ecological processes and life-support systems, to preserve genetic  
11 diversity, to ensure sustainable use of resources found therein, and to maintain  
12 their natural conditions to the greatest extent possible;

13 t. "National Park" refers to the land of the public domain classified as such  
14 in the 1987 Constitution which include all areas under the National Integrated  
15 Protected Areas System (NIPAS) pursuant to R.A. 7586 primarily designated for  
16 the conservation of native plants and animals, their associated habitats and  
17 cultural diversity.

18 u. "Natural Park" refers to a relatively large area not materially altered by  
19 human activity where extractive resource uses are not allowed and maintained to  
20 protect outstanding natural and scenic areas of national or international  
21 significance for scientific, education and recreational use.

22 v. "NIPAS Act" refers to the National Integrated Protected Areas System  
23 Act of 1992 or Republic Act No. 7586, and its pertinent rules and regulations.

24 w. "Non-governmental organization (NGO)" refers to an agency, institution,  
25 foundation or a group of persons whose purpose is to assist peoples  
26 organizations/associations in various ways including, but not limited to, organizing,  
27 education, training, research and/or resource accessing;

28 x. "People's Organization (PO)" refers to a group of organized migrant  
29 communities and or interested indigenous peoples which may be an association,  
30 cooperative, federation, or other legal entity, established to undertake collective  
31 action to address community concerns and needs, and mutually share the  
32 benefits of the endeavor;

33 y. "Protected Area" refers to the identified portions of land and/or water set  
34 aside by reason of their unique physical and biological significance, managed to  
35 enhance biological diversity and protected against destructive human exploitation;

1 z. "Protected Area Management Board (PAMB)" refers to a multi-sectoral  
2 policy-making body for protected areas created in accordance with RA 7586 or the  
3 NIPAS Act of 1992;

4 aa. "Protected species" refers to any individual species of plants and  
5 animals that is or shall be declared as protected under Philippine laws, rules and  
6 regulations issued by the DENR, species listed as protected against trade, hunting  
7 and harvest under international conventions to which the Philippines is or will  
8 become a signatory such as, but not limited to, the Convention on International  
9 Trade of Endangered Species (CITES). These include species, which may be  
10 restricted for use under regulations issued by the Protected Area Management  
11 Board (PAMB) or the DENR, and those particularly mentioned in the management  
12 plan;

13 bb. "Quarrying" means the process of extracting, removing and disposing  
14 quarry resources found on or underneath the surface of private or public land.

15 cc. "Strict protection zone" refers to a natural area with high biodiversity  
16 value which shall be closed to all human activity except for scientific studies  
17 and/or ceremonial or religious use by the indigenous cultural  
18 communities/indigenous peoples; may include habitats of threatened species, or  
19 degraded areas that have been designated for restoration and subsequent  
20 protection, even if these areas are still in various stages of regeneration.

21 dd. "Sustainable use" refers to the use of components of biological diversity  
22 in a way and rate that does not lead to the long-term decline of biological diversity,  
23 thereby maintaining its potential to meet the needs and aspirations of present and  
24 future generations; and

25 ee. "Tenured Migrants" refers to occupants who have actually and  
26 continuously occupied a portion of the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park and is  
27 solely dependent therein for subsistence. A Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park  
28 occupant is understood to be "solely dependent for subsistence" when everything  
29 indispensable for survival for the household, including food, clothing, shelter and  
30 health, comes only from the utilization of resources from the Mt. Balatukan Range  
31 Natural Park.

32 **SEC. 5. Management of the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park.** – There  
33 is hereby created a PAMB which shall have jurisdiction, power and authority over  
34 the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park for all matters that may affect biodiversity  
35 conservation, protection and sustainable development. It shall be composed of:

36 (1) The Regional Executive Director (RED) of DENR Region X as  
37 chairperson;



1 (2) The Provincial Planning and Development Officer (PPDO) of the Province  
2 of Misamis Oriental;

3 (3) The City Mayor of Gingoog and the Municipal Mayors of Claveria,  
4 Medina, and Balingasag in the Province of Misamis Oriental, or their duly  
5 designated representatives;

6 (4) One representative from each barangay with territory inside the Mt.  
7 Balatukan Range Natural Park;

8 (5) One representative from each indigenous cultural community residing  
9 within the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park;

10 (6) One representative from each department or national government agency  
11 directly involved in the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park or has long term  
12 projects or permanent facility located therein;

13 (7) At least three (3) representatives from accredited NGOs operating within  
14 the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park; and

15 (8) At least two (2) representatives from accredited POs operating within the  
16 Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park.

17 Each member of the PAMB shall serve for a term of five (5) years and shall  
18 be considered to represent his or her sector and deemed to carry the vote of such  
19 sector in all matters. In the case of members who are government officials, their  
20 appointment shall be co-terminus with their term of office.

21 The members of the PAMB shall be appointed by the Secretary of the DENR  
22 in conformity with the provisions of the NIPAS Act. As a transitory provision, the  
23 initial members of the PAMB shall be nominated from the current members of the  
24 interim PAMBs of the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park. Their nominations shall  
25 be conducted in a joint meeting of the current members of the interim PAMBs duly  
26 called for the purpose: *Provided*, That at least one- third (1/3) of the members  
27 shall be women.

28 In the selection of the representatives of POs and NGOs, preference shall be  
29 accorded to those organizations that are involved in the conservation, protection  
30 and development of the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park. Representation shall  
31 be by institution and shall aim to achieve balance in representation by geographic  
32 location or areas.

33 The representatives from the local government units (LGUs) and national  
34 agencies in the PAMB shall include among their duties to inform their respective  
35 constituents, office or sector, of PAMB approved or other relevant policies, rules,  
36 regulations, programs, and projects, and to ensure that the provisions of this Act  
37 are observed, complied with, and used as reference and framework in their

1 respective plans, policies, programs and projects. Failure to comply with the  
2 foregoing shall subject such representative to *disciplinary action* as the PAMB  
3 may provide.

4 The members of the Board shall not receive any salary but shall be entitled  
5 to reimbursements for actual and necessary expenses incurred, either in their  
6 attendance in meetings of the Board or in connection with other official business  
7 authorized by a resolution of the Board, subject to existing rules and regulations.

8 **SEC. 6. Powers and Functions of the PAMB.** – The PAMB of the Mt.  
9 Balatukan Range Natural Park shall have the following powers and functions in  
10 addition to those provided under RA 7586 or the NIPAS Act of 1992 and its  
11 Implementing Rules and Regulations:

12 (1) Issue rules and regulations to prohibit acts that may be prejudicial to the  
13 Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park and to the *declaration of policy* set forth under  
14 the NIPAS;

15 (2) Issue rules and regulations for the resolution of conflicts through  
16 appropriate and effective means;

17 (3) Adopt rules and procedures in the conduct of business, including the  
18 creation of committees to which its powers may be delegated;

19 (4) Approve the management plan and oversee the office of the Protected  
20 Area Superintendent (PASu);

21 (5) Establish criteria and set fees for the issuance of permits for activities  
22 regulated by this Act or the management plan;

23 (6) Recommend the deputization of appropriate individuals for the  
24 enforcement of the laws, rules and regulations governing the conduct or  
25 management of the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park;

26 (7) Approve fees and charges in accordance with DAO 51, Series of 2000  
27 and raise funds for the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park;

28 (8) Manage the allocation of the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park Fund,  
29 and other funds for the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park, ensure their proper  
30 administration and render accounting; and

31 (9) Recommend appropriate policy changes to the DENR and other  
32 government authorities.

33 The DENR, through the Regional Executive Director of Region X, shall  
34 ensure that the PAMB acts within the scope of its powers and functions. In case of  
35 conflict between administrative orders issued by the DENR pursuant to the NIPAS  
36 Act and the resolutions issued by the PAMB, such conflict shall be referred by

1 PAMB to the Secretary of the DENR\_who shall decide whether to apply the rule or  
2 withdraw its application in the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park.

3 **SEC. 7. Protected Area Superintendent (PASu) Office.** – There is hereby  
4 established a PASu Office in charge of the implementation of the projects,  
5 programs and policies for the management, protection and administration of the  
6 Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park. It will be headed by a Protected Area  
7 Superintendent (PASu) and shall be supported by the existing personnel of the  
8 DENR. The PASu shall be the chief operating officer of the Mt. Balatukan Range  
9 Natural Park and shall be accountable to the RED of the DENR-Region X and the  
10 PAMB.

11 The PASu shall have full responsibility for the protection of land, water,  
12 wildlife and other natural physical and biological resources within Mt. Balatukan  
13 Range Natural Park. As such, the PASu shall have the following duties and  
14 responsibilities in addition to those provided under RA 7586 or the NIPAS Act of  
15 1992 and its implementing rules and regulations:

16 (1) Establish, operate and maintain a database management system as  
17 decision support tool;

18 (2) Prepare the management plan for the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park  
19 as herein defined;

20 (3) Provide a secretariat for the PAMB and supply the PAMB with all the  
21 information necessary to make appropriate decisions for the implementation of  
22 this Act;

23 (4) Enforce the laws, rules and regulations relevant to the Mt. Balatukan  
24 Range Natural Park, institute and file legal action independently or in collaboration  
25 with other government agencies or organizations and assist in the prosecution of  
26 offenses committed in violation of this Act;

27 (5) Monitor all activities within the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park to  
28 ensure its conformity with the management plan;

29 (6) Recommend the issuance of permits based on terms, conditions and  
30 criteria established by the PAMB;

31 (7) Ensure the integration of the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park  
32 management policies, regulations, programs and projects at all the concerned  
33 national and LGU levels; and

34 (8) Perform such other functions as the PAMB may assign.

35 The PASu shall be supported by a sufficient number of personnel who shall  
36 be performing day to day management, protection and administration of Mt.  
37 Balatukan Range Natural Park. Upon the recommendations of the PAMB, the

1 DENR RED shall deputize local community leaders and environment and natural  
2 resource officers.

3 **SEC. 8. *Indigenous People's Rights.*** – Ancestral domain and other  
4 customary rights and interests of indigenous communities within the Mt. Balatukan  
5 Range Natural Park shall be accorded due recognition. The preservation of  
6 ancestral domain and customary rights shall be considered as one of the  
7 management objectives. The maintenance, management and development of  
8 ancestral domains which are found to be necessary for protected areas will be  
9 pursuant to Section 58 of Republic Act No. 8371, otherwise known as the "The  
10 Indigenous Peoples Rights Act of 1997 (IPRA)".

11 The identification, delineation and recognition of ancestral domain claims  
12 within the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park shall be conducted by the National  
13 Commission on Indigenous Peoples (NCIP) pursuant to the provisions of the  
14 IPRA, and its implementing rules and regulations, in coordination with the PAMB.

15 **SEC. 9. *Tenured Migrants and Other Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park***  
16 ***Occupants.*** – Tenured migrants shall be eligible to become stewards of portions  
17 of lands within allowable zones. The PAMB shall identify, verify and review all  
18 tenurial instruments, land claims, and issuances of permits for resource use within  
19 the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park and recommend the issuance of the  
20 appropriate tenurial instrument consistent with the zoning provided in the  
21 management plan and its successor plans.

22 Should areas occupied by tenured migrants be designated as zones in which  
23 no occupation or other activities are allowed pursuant to the attainment of  
24 sustainable development, provision for the transfer of said tenured migrants to  
25 multiple use zones or buffer zones shall be accomplished through just and  
26 humane means.

27 In the event of termination of a tenurial instrument for cause or by voluntary  
28 surrender of rights, the PASu shall take immediate steps to rehabilitate the area in  
29 order to return it to its natural state prior to the cultivation or other act by the  
30 tenured migrant.

31 Other Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park occupants who do not qualify as  
32 tenured migrants shall be resettled outside the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park  
33 as determined by the PAMB. The PAMB shall determine, plan and implement a  
34 definite schedule for resettling them outside of the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural  
35 Park following the procedures set forth by existing law.

36 **SEC. 10. *Existing Facilities Within the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural***  
37 ***Park.*** – Within sixty (60) days from the effectivity of this Act, existing facilities such

1 as roads, buildings, water systems, transmission lines, communication facilities,  
2 heavy equipment, and irrigation facilities existing within the boundaries of the Mt.  
3 Balatukan Range Natural Park shall submit project description to the PAMB  
4 through the PASu.

5 The PAMB, with the assistance of the DENR, shall determine whether the  
6 existence of such facility and its future plan and operations will be detrimental to  
7 the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park or whether conditions for its operation shall  
8 be imposed. If any such conditions are violated, the owner of the facility shall be  
9 liable to pay a fine of Five thousand pesos (P5,000.00) for every violation. Upon  
10 reaching a total fine of Five hundred thousand pesos (P500,000.00), the PAMB  
11 through the PASu and deputizing other government entities, shall cause the  
12 cessation and demolition of the facility at the cost of its owner.

13 Existing facilities allowed to remain within the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural  
14 Park may be charged a reasonable royalty by the PAMB. All income from such  
15 royalty shall accrue to the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park Fund.

16 **SEC. 11. Utilization of Resources.** – Any exploitation of or utilization of  
17 nonrenewable resources within the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park shall not be  
18 allowed. Energy projects within the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park shall be  
19 allowed only through an act of Congress except energy from wind, sun, and water  
20 sources of not more than one (1) megawatt capacity for mini-hydro power.  
21 *Provided*, That these renewable energy projects are outside the strict protection  
22 zone, adopt reduced impact technologies, and undergo the Environmental Impact  
23 Assessment (EIA) system as provided by law and: *Provided, Further*, that the  
24 PAMB has endorsed the project.

25 **SEC. 12. Special Prosecutor and Retained Counsel.** – Within thirty (30)  
26 days from the effectivity of this Act, the Department of Justice (DOJ) shall appoint  
27 a special prosecutor to whom all cases of violation of laws, rules and regulations  
28 in the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park shall be assigned. Such Special  
29 Prosecutor shall coordinate with the PAMB and the PASu in the performance of  
30 his/her duties and assist in the training of wardens and rangers in arrest and  
31 criminal procedures. The PAMB may retain the services of a counsel to prosecute  
32 and/or assist in the prosecution of cases under the direct control and supervision  
33 of the regular or special prosecutor and to defend the members of the PAMB, the  
34 PASu and the staff, or any person assisting in the protection, conservation and  
35 sustainable development of the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park, against any  
36 legal action related to their powers, functions and responsibilities as provided in  
37 this Act or as delegated or tasked by the PAMB.

1           **SEC. 13. Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park Fund.** – There is hereby  
2 established a trust fund to be known as the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park  
3 Fund for purposes of financing projects of the Natural Park. Seventy-five percent  
4 (75%) of the income generated from the operation of the Mt. Balatukan Range  
5 Natural Park and/or management of wild flora and fauna in the Park shall accrue  
6 to the Fund. The remaining twenty-five percent (25%) shall be deposited to the  
7 Integrated Protected Areas Fund (IPAF) as established in the NIPAS Act of 1992.

8           Income shall be derived from visitor/tourist fees, fees from permitted sale and  
9 export of flora and fauna and other resources from the Mt. Balatukan Range  
10 Natural Park, proceeds from registration and lease of multiple-use areas, including  
11 tourism concessions, fees, proceeds and contributions from industries and  
12 facilities directly benefiting from the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park; and such  
13 other fees and income derived from the operation of the Mt. Balatukan Range  
14 Natural Park

15           The Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park Fund may be augmented by grants,  
16 donations, endowment from various sources, domestic or foreign, for purposes  
17 related to their functions: *Provided*, That disbursements therefrom shall be made  
18 solely for the protection, maintenance, administration and management of the  
19 system, and duly approved projects endorsed by the PAMB in accordance with  
20 existing accounting and budgeting rules and regulations: *Provided, further*, That  
21 the Fund shall not be used to cover personal services expenditures.

22           The LGUs shall continue to impose and collect all other fees not enumerated  
23 herein which they have traditionally collected, such as business permits, property  
24 tax and rentals of LGUs' facilities. *Provided*, That the LGUs shall not impose  
25 property tax and issue tax declaration for areas or properties located in timberland  
26 areas or areas previously classified as national parks. Furthermore, LGUs may  
27 charge add-ons to fees imposed by the PAMB: *Provided*, That such add-ons shall  
28 be determined based on the contribution of the LGUs in the maintenance and  
29 protection of the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park.

30           **SEC. 14. Prohibited Acts and Penalties.** – The following shall be the  
31 prohibitions and penalties applicable to the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park, in  
32 addition to the prohibited acts as provided in the NIPAS Act and its Implementing  
33 Rules and Regulations:

34           (A) The penalties in Articles 309 and 310 of the Revised Penal Code,  
35 depending on the value of the resources involved in connection with the prohibited  
36 act, shall be imposed upon any person who:

1 (1) Takes, destroys, collects, disturbs or possesses any wild terrestrial or  
2 aquatic plants or animals, flora or fauna, sand, rocks or by-products derived  
3 therefrom, within particularly identified regulated or prohibited areas zones in the  
4 Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park including private lands without the necessary  
5 permit, authorization or exemption: *Provided*, That the hunting of animals shall be  
6 absolutely prohibited except for scientific research and for traditional hunting by  
7 the IPs/ICCs;

8 (2) Cuts, gathers, removes or collects timber or any forest products, within  
9 particularly identified regulated or prohibited areas or zones in the Mt. Balatukan  
10 Range Natural Park including private lands without the necessary permit,  
11 authorization or exemption;

12 (3) Possesses or transports, within or outside the Mt. Balatukan Range  
13 Natural Park any timber, forest products, wild terrestrial or aquatic plants, animals,  
14 or by-product derived therefrom which is ascertained to have been taken from the  
15 Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park;

16 (4) Undertakes mineral exploration or extraction within the Mt. Balatukan  
17 Range Natural Park;

18 (5) Engages in quarrying of sand, gravel, guano, limestone or any material  
19 within the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park;

20 (6) Hunts, collects, removes or destroys any endangered or protected  
21 species, except when collection or removal is for scientific research and exempted  
22 from the prohibition by the PAMB;

23 (7) Conducts bioprospecting within the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park  
24 without the necessary permit; or

25 (8) Establishes or introduces any exotic species, within the Mt. Balatukan  
26 Range Natural Park, which are detrimental to endemic species and the ecosystem  
27 therein.

28 (B) A fine of not less than Five thousand pesos (P5,000.00) nor more than  
29 Five hundred thousand pesos (P500,000.00) and/or imprisonment from one (1)  
30 year but not more than six (6) years shall be imposed upon any person who:

31 (1) Violates any rules and regulations in the management plan or by the  
32 PAMB or agreements reached before the PAMB in the exercise of adjudicative  
33 functions;

34 (2) Erects any structure on land or on water for any purposes outside the  
35 management plan, duly allowed by the PAMB: *Provided*, That large-scale private  
36 infrastructure and other projects such as medium to high density residential  
37 subdivisions, medium to large commercial and industrial establishments, golf-

1 courses, heavily mechanized commercial and non-traditional farming, and other  
2 activities that cause increased in-migration and resource degradation are  
3 absolutely prohibited;

4 (3) Possesses a chainsaw, hacksaw and other mechanized equipment within  
5 the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park without a permit;

6 (4) Throws, dumps or causes to be dumped into the Mt. Balatukan Range  
7 Natural Park any non-biodegradable material or waste whether liquid, solid or gas;

8 (5) Uses, dumps, places or causes to be placed into the Mt. Balatukan  
9 Range Natural Park toxic chemicals, including pesticides and other hazardous  
10 substances, unless the same is expressly allowed in the management plan;

11 (6) Prospects, hunts or otherwise locates hidden treasures within the Mt.  
12 Balatukan Range Natural Park;

13 (7) Informally occupies or dwells in any land within the Mt. Balatukan Range  
14 Natural Park without clearance from the PAMB;

15 (8) Possesses or uses blasting caps or explosives anywhere within the Mt.  
16 Balatukan Range Natural Park;

17 (9) Destroys, excavates, vandalizes or, in any manner, damages any natural  
18 formation on land, religious, spiritual, historical sites, artifacts and other objects of  
19 natural or scenic value;

20 (10) Alters, removes or destroys boundary marks or signs;

21 (11) Engages in kaingin, or, in any manner, causing forest fires inside the Mt.  
22 Balatukan Range Natural Park; or

23 (12) Purchases, or sells, mortgages or leases lands or other portions of the  
24 Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park which are covered by any tenurial instrument.

25 Valuation of the damage for this Act shall take into account biodiversity and  
26 conservation considerations as well as aesthetic and scenic value. Valuation  
27 assessed by the DENR or the concerned government agency shall be presumed  
28 correct unless otherwise proven by a preponderance of evidence.

29 Any person who shall induce another or conspire to commit any of the illegal  
30 acts prohibited in this Act or suffer their workers to commit any of the same shall  
31 be liable in the same manner as the one actually performing the act.

32 All conveyances, vessels, equipments, paraphernalia, implements, gears,  
33 tools and similar devices shall be subject to immediate and administrative  
34 confiscation, independent of the judicial proceedings by the PASu Office upon  
35 apprehension, subject however to due process and substantial evidence  
36 requirements. When legal action is however filed in the regular courts, the said  
37 conveyances, vessels, equipments, paraphernalia, implements, gears, tools and



1 similar devices, independent of the administrative proceedings, shall not be  
2 released until after judgment has been rendered. Proceeds of the sale of all  
3 objects administratively or judicially confiscated pursuant hereto shall accrue to  
4 the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park Landscape Fund. Procedure for the sale  
5 thereof shall be promulgated by the PAMB. However, in no case shall any  
6 confiscated or rescued protected animal species be sold or in any manner  
7 disposed of but shall be immediately turned over to the PASu Office for release in  
8 its natural habitat, subject to existing regulations.

9 The penalties specified in this Section will be in addition to the penalties  
10 contained in RA 9072 (National Caves and Cave Resources Management and  
11 Protection Act), RA 9147 (Wildlife Resources Conservation and Protection Act),  
12 and other related laws.

13 Conviction for any offense under this Act, of a public officer or officer of the  
14 law shall carry the accessory penalty of perpetual disqualification from public  
15 office.

16 **SEC. 15. Reporting Responsibility.** – The PASu, through the PAMB, shall  
17 submit an annual accomplishment report to the Secretary of the DENR on the  
18 activities undertaken in the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park.

19 **SEC. 16. Appropriations.** – The Secretary shall immediately include in the  
20 DENR's program the implementation of this Act, the funding of which shall be  
21 included in the annual General Appropriations Act.

22 **SEC. 17. Construction and Suppletory Application of Existing Laws.** –  
23 The provisions of this Act shall be construed liberally in favor of achieving  
24 biodiversity conservation, protection and sustainable development. Provisions of  
25 Republic Act No. 7586, otherwise known as the National Integrated Protected  
26 Areas System Act of 1992 and existing forestry laws, and their corresponding  
27 rules and regulations not inconsistent hereto shall have the suppletory effect in the  
28 implementation of this Act.

29 **SEC. 18. Transitory Provision.** – In order to ensure the recovery and  
30 restoration of biological diversity and to develop sustainable livelihood  
31 opportunities for tenured migrants, the DENR shall henceforth cease to issue  
32 concessions, licenses, permits, clearances, compliance documents or any other  
33 instrument that allows exploitation and utilization of resources within the Mt.  
34 Balatukan Range Natural Park until the management plan shall have been put into  
35 effect.

36 All existing land use and resource use permits within the Mt. Balatukan  
37 Range Natural Park shall be reviewed and shall not be renewed upon their

1 expiration unless consistent with the management plan, as provided herein, and  
2 upon approval by the PAMB.

3 **SEC. 19. *Repealing Clause.*** –All laws, decrees, proclamations, rules and  
4 regulations inconsistent with this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

5 **SEC. 20. *Separability Clause.*** – If, for any reason, any part or section of  
6 this Act is declared unconstitutional or invalid, such other parts not affected  
7 thereby shall remain in full force and effect.

8 **SEC. 21. *Effectivity Clause.*** – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days  
9 after its complete publication in the *Official Gazette* or in a national newspaper of  
10 general circulation available in the Mt. Balatukan Range Natural Park.
