RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON JUSTICE AND OTHER APPROPRIATE SENATE COMMITTEES TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY ON THE ACTIONS UNDERTAKEN TOWARDS THE IMPLEMENTATION OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 9999 OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE FREE LEGAL ASSISTANCE ACT OF 2010 WITH THE END IN VIEW OF FINALLY AFFORDING FILIPINOS THE FULL BENEFITS ENVISIONED BY THE ACT

CHANGE OF REFERRAL

Upon motion of Senator Cayetano (A), there being no objection, the Chair approved to transfer the referral of the following Senate bills to the Committee on Trade, Commerce and Entrepreneurship as the primary committee, and to the Committee on Economic Affairs as the secondary committee:

- Senate Bill No. 106 (creating and accrediting micro-enterprise development institutions) introduced by Senator Legarda;
- Senate Bill No. 253 (promoting job generation by providing additional incentives to micro, small and medium enterprises) introduced by Senator Recto;

- Senate Bill No. 307 (creating and accrediting microenterprise development institutions) introduced by Senator Villar;
- Senate Bill No. 615 (expanding the coverage of micro enterprises as beneficiaries of the Magna Carta for Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises) introduced by Senator Recto; and
- Senate Bill No. 1254 (amending the Magna Carta for Small Enterprises) introduced by Senator Defensor Santiago.

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

Upon motion of Senator Cayetano (A), the session was suspended.

It was 3:24 p.m.

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

At 3:33 p.m., the session was resumed.

ANNOUNCEMENTS OF SENATOR CAYETANO (A)

Senator Cayetano (A) stated that the Body would resume consideration on Second Reading of Senate Bill No. 1186 (postponement of SK elections) on the next session day.

As regards the resolutions proposing to abolish the pork barrel or the PDAF, and taking note of the popular support the measure has gained among the members of the Body, he said that he and Senator Escudero and the rest of the authors have agreed to meet first to define the appropriate terms to be used in said legislative measure before discussing them in plenary, as he pointed out the difficulty of abolishing something that has not been properly defined.

On the Freedom of Information (FOI) bill, Senator Cayetano (A) informed the Body that Senator Poe would be conducting a second hearing on September 18, after which a committee report would be presented for plenary deliberation.

In compliance with the request of the Members of the Chamber during the previous caucus, Senator Cayetano (A) presented a list of bills which were approved either on second reading or on third reading during the Fifteenth Congress, among which were the following:

- The PAG-ASA modernization measure which was referred to the Committee on Science and Technology, and which is covered by Senate Bill Nos. 73, 572, 1039 and 1406 in the Fifteenth Congress, and Senate Bill Nos. 10, 842, 955 and 1160 in the Sixteenth Congress;
- The FOI measure, covered by Senate Bill Nos. 11, 25, 26, 149, 158, 162, 1254, 1440, 2086, 2189, 2283 and 2354 in the Fifteenth Congress, and Senate Bill Nos. 18, 36, 44, 74, 90, 217 and 514 in the Sixteenth Congress; and
- The NBI Modernization Act as well as the measure strengthening the Office of the Government Corporate Council, which will be tackled by the Committee on Justice and Human Rights.

Senator Cayetano (A) said that the bills would be looked at intently so that the committees concerned, if they so decide, could already prepare committee reports thereon considering that they were already passed either on second reading or on third reading during the Fifteenth Congress. He added that the Office of the Majority Leader and the Senate President are ready to offer any assistance as regards measures that any Member wants to fast-track.

ADJOURNMENT OF SESSION

Upon motion of Senator Cayetano (A), there being no objection, the Chair declared the session adjourned until three o'clock in the afternoon of the following day.
