INTRODUCED BY SENATOR PIA S. CAYETANO

It is the policy of the State to "recognize the vital role of the youth in nation-building" and to "promote and protect their physical, moral, spiritual, intellectual, and social wellbeing."

The Philippines has a pool of talented youth who have great potential in the field of sports. However, due to financial constraints, these talented youth are unable to fulfil their dreams of bringing home the gold for our country.

At present, there are no opportunities to obtain quality education with emphasis on sports development. It is therefore the objective of this bill to create and establish a national high school for sports which will give the impoverished yet talented youth the opportunity to develop and cultivate their talents, skills and knowledge in their preferred sport. It is also with the establishment of this high school for sports that we can finally get a gold medal in the Olympics as our talented athletes will not just be adequately trained but more importantly developed and prepared for international sporting events.

It is for these reasons that the immediate approval of this bill is earnestly sought.

"AN ACT CREATING AND ESTABLISHING THE PHILIPPINE HIGH SCHOOL FOR SPORTS"

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

Section 1. Short title. - This Act shall be known as "The Philippine High School for Sports (PHSS) Act."

Section 2. Declaration of Principles. – The Philippine Constitution recognizes the vital role of the youth in nation-building and shall promote and protect their physical, moral, spiritual, intellectual, and social well-being. It is likewise mandated that the State shall promote physical education and encourage sports programs, league competitions, and amateur sports, including training for international competitions, foster self-discipline, teamwork, and excellence for the development of a healthy and alert citizenry.

It is therefore declared the policy of the State to maximize the athletic abilities of students with the end in view of producing world-class athletes with solid academic background. In line with this, an educational system to foster the total development of the youth, with special emphasis on the enhancement and development of their skills in sports is hereby established.

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Section 3. Creation and Establishment of the Philippine High School for Sports. – There is hereby created and established a national high school to be known as the Philippine High School for Sports (PHSS). This shall be attached to the Department of Education (DepEd) which shall also coordinate with the Philippine Sports Commission (PSC) for policy and program formulation and implementation on subjects pertaining to sports.

Section 4. Purpose of the PHSS. - The PHSS shall offer, on a full or partial scholarship basis, a secondary course with special emphasis on developing the athletic

skills of the students through subjects pertaining to physical education and sports development, with the end in view of preparing its students who have shown their early potential of excelling in sports for a sports-related career while undergoing quality secondary education. The Board may agree to accept paying students based on the criteria for eligibility for scholarships as established.

Section 5. Director of the PHSS. – The PHSS shall be headed by a Director, who shall serve for a period of eight (8) years. He shall be appointed by the Board of Trustees, as created in Section 6. The Board shall also fix his compensation. His functions, powers and duties, in addition to those specifically provided for in this law, shall be those usually pertaining to the office of the principal of any high school in the Philippine educational system.

Section 6. Board of Trustees. – The exercise of the corporate powers of the PHSS is hereby vested exclusively in the Board of Trustees, hereinafter referred to as the Board, and in the Director, insofar as authorized by said Board.

The PHSS shall have a Board of Trustees, which shall be composed of the Secretary of the DepEd as Chair, the Chairperson of the PSC as Vice Chair, and the following members: the Director of the PHSS, one (1) representative each from the House of Representatives and the Senate, and four (4) representatives from accredited national sports associations to be nominated by the different sports associations and appointed by the Chairperson of the Board, *PROVIDED*, That there should always be a representative from track and field and aquatic sports. All members who are not receiving regular compensation from the government shall receive *per diem* per session of the Board.

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Section 7. Powers and Functions of the Board of Trustees. – The Board shall have all the powers and prerogatives of a board of directors of a private corporation. It shall also have the following powers, among others:

- (a) To fix the site of the PHSS;
- (b) To receive and appropriate for the ends herein specified such sums as may be provided by law for the support of the PHSS;
 - (c) To approve appointments made, and contracts entered into, by the Director in connection with the employment of teachers, lecturers and other employees of the school, to fix their compensation and other conditions of employment, and to remove them for cause after proper investigation;

2	(e) To fix the tuition fees and other necessary school charges, as the Board may
3	deem proper to impose, after due and comprehensive consultation with the
4	students concerned;
5	(f) To approve the grant of scholarships, stipends and such other allowances to
6	deserving students;
7	(g) To establish the criteria for the selection and admission of students which
8	shall include, among others, national competitive trials and examinations;
9	(h) To develop the athletic potential of every student together with a sound and
10	strong academic base;

12	(i) To provide a training program for students with the end goal of creating
13	athletes who are competitive in the national, South East Asian, Asian, and
14	Olympics level;
15	
16	(j) To approve the issuance of certificates or diplomas to successful candidates
17	for graduation;
18	(k) To receive, in trust, legacies, gifts, and donations of real and personal
19	property of all kinds and to administer the same for the benefit of the PHSS or for
20	aid to any of its students; and
21	(I) To perform any and all other acts incident to or required by virtue of its
22	creation.
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24	Section 8. Quorum of the Board of Trustees A quorum of the Board shall
25	consist of majority of all the members holding office at the time the meeting is called.

27	Section 9. Annual Report On or before the first of April of each year the
28	Board shall submit to the President of the Philippines a detailed report on the progress,
29	condition and needs of the PHSS.

31	Section 10. Executive Council There shall be an Executive Council
32	consisting of the Director, the Assistant Director, as provided in Section 11, the heads of
33	departments, and such other ranking faculty members or officials of the PHSS, as may
34	be determined by the Board.

(d) To provide and approve fellowships and trainings for faculty members;

The Council shall have the power to screen and select the students subject for admission, to select students who shall be recipients of scholarships, stipends and other allowances, and to develop the curricula, course or study, and rules of discipline. The Council shall implement and execute the policies laid down by the Board and exercise such other functions, powers and duties as the Board may prescribe.

Section 11. Assistant Director of the PHSS. – There shall be an Assistant Director who shall assist the Director. In the absence of the Director, he shall assume the administrative and supervisory functions of the Director. He shall be appointed by the Chairperson of the Board subject to the approval of the same Board, which shall also fix his compensation.

 Section 12. Registrar of the PHSS. - There shall be a Registrar of the School who shall also act as Secretary of the Board, to be appointed by the Director with the approval of the Board. He shall keep all records of the PHSS.

Section 13. Treasurer of the PHSS. - There shall be a Treasurer of the PHSS who shall be appointed by the Director, with the approval of the Board.

 All accounts and expenses of the PHSS are public in nature, and shall be subject to auditing by the Commission on Audit (COA).

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Section 14. Tax Exemptions of the PHSS. - The PHSS shall be exempt from payment of all taxes, fees, assessments and other charges of the Government, its branches and subdivisions.

It shall likewise be exempt from the payment of customs duties, taxes and tariffs on the importation of sportswear, equipment, books, supplies, instruments, materials and goods, including those donated to the PHSS, *PROVIDED*, That these are of international sports standards and are not available from local manufacturers, *PROVIDED*, *FURTHER*, That the importation shall only be in such numbers as may be required in the development of various sports and/or training of the students.

The PHSS shall also be exempt from withholding taxes on the honoraria or fees paid by the PHSS to visiting lecturers or professors from abroad.

Section 15. Tax Deduction or Exemption of Donations and Contributions. - All legacies, gifts and donations for the benefit of the PHSS, or for its support and maintenance, or for aid to any of its students shall be tax-exempt and shall be an allowable deduction from the gross-income of the donors.

Section 16. Sports High School Fund All incomes and donations to the
PHSS created under this Act shall be formed into a fund, to be known as the Sports
High School Fund, which the PHSS shall be authorized to retain, without need of a
separate approval from any government agency, and subject only to existing accounting
and auditing rules and regulations. This fund shall be expended as authorized by the
Board exclusively for the purpose of this Act.

Section 17. Funding. – To carry out the purposes of this Act the amount of One Hundred Million Pesos (Php 100,000,000.00) is hereby appropriated and shall be made available from the funds of the National Treasury not otherwise appropriated. Thereafter, this amount to be utilized for the expenses of the PHSS, for the purpose above described shall be provided in the yearly General Appropriation Act.

Section 18. Separability Clause. - If any part or provision of this Act shall be held unconstitutional or invalid, other provisions thereof which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

Section 19. Repealing Clause. — All other laws, decrees, executive order and other administrative issuances and parts thereof which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby modified, superseded or repealed accordingly.

Section 20. Effectivity. — This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days following its publication in the Official Gazette or in a major daily newspaper of national circulation in the Philippines.
