In line with the amendments of the Rules that were recently approved, upon motion of Senator Cayetano (A), there being no objection, the Body approved the transfer of the referrals of the following to the appropriate committees hereunder indicated:

- 1. From the Committee on Trade, Commerce and Entrepreneurship to the Committee on Agriculture and Food as the primary committee and the former as the secondary committee:
 - Proposed Senate Resolution No. 238 (inquiry on policies and practices on the importation of garlic and onions vis-à-vis claims of monopolization of the distribution of onions)
- 2. From the Committee on Constitutional Amendments and Revision of Codes to the Committee on Education, Arts and Culture:
 - Senate Bill No. 412 (declaring December 26 of every year as a national special nonworking holiday to be known as "Filipino Day of Goodwill" or "Boxing Day") introduced by Senator Marcos;
 - Senate Bill No. 418 (moving the observance of Rizal Day from December 30 to June 19, amending for the purpose Section 26, Chapter 7, Book I of Executive Order No. 292) introduced by Senator Marcos;
 - Senate Bill No. 438 (amending Republic Act No. 8491, the Flag and Heraldic Code of the Philippines) introduced by Senator Escudero;
 - Senate Bill No. 551 (enforcing the constitutional right to the free exercise of religion by students of public schools) introduced by Senator Ejercito Estrada;
 - Senate Bill No. 868 (declaring July 27 of every year a special national holiday in observance of the founding anniversary of the Iglesia ni Cristo) introduced by Senator Estrada;
 - Senate Bill No. 1016 (declaring July 27 of every year a national holiday to commemorate the founding anniversary of the Iglesia ni Cristo) introduced by Senator Revilla; and

• Senate Bill No. 1106 (declaring the Chinese New Year as a special non-working holiday) introduced by Senator Legarda.
