EXPLANATORY NOTE

Because times are difficult, price oftentimes becomes the determining factor when groups of people go out and eat in restaurants. Sometimes, however, people get shocked when the time comes for them to settle the bill - the price is markedly different from what was advertised because of unexpected additional charges. However, as the food has already been eaten and the service has already been performed, customers have no option but to pay to save face.

This bill seeks to protect people from having to pay unexpected prices by requiring restaurants to conspicuously post menus including the prices of all food available therein and all additional charges of whatever nature the establishment seeks to impose.^{*}

	Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:	
4	SECTION 1. Short Title This Act shall be known as "Restaurant Menu and Prices	4

5 Posting Act."

6 SECTION 2. *Declaration of Policy*. - It is the policy of the State to promote the general 7 welfare of the people. Pursuant to this policy, this Act seeks to protect people from having to pay . 8 unexpected prices by requiring restaurants to conspicuously post menus including the prices of 9 all food available therein.

10 SECTION 3. *Posting of Menus; Prices.* - Any restaurant selling food to the public for 11 consumption on the premises, except those exempt pursuant to Section 4 of this Act, shall cause 12 a menu including the prices of all food available therein to be conspicuously posted within 13 fifteen (15) feet of the main entrance thereto.

No restaurant shall be required to post a menu more than two pages in length; however, if such menu so posted is less than the complete menu, it shall be representative of the food sold in such restaurant; *Provided, however*, that in the case of certain dishes, the prices of which fluctuate widely in the restaurant, the restaurant may post a notice to the effect that the price will vary according to availability rather than posting the price.

Any menu posted pursuant to this Act shall include entertainment costs, cover charges,
 service charges, minimum permissible expenditures, any other special pricing policies and

charges and which credit cards or what other forms of payment are acceptable in lieu of cash;
 Provided, however, that no portion of this Section shall in any way limit a restaurant from
 providing its customers with unannounced specials the price of which is disclosed to the
 customer at the time said customer is made aware of the special.

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5 SECTION 4. *Exempt Food Sales; Exempt Establishments.* - This Act shall not apply to
6 food vended by coin-operated machines.

Restaurants which do not supply table service with waiters and/or waitresses who serve
food to the public or which provide counter service exclusively shall likewise not be subject to
the provisions of this Act.

10 SECTION 5. *Penalties.* - A violation of any of the provisions of this Act shall be 11 punishable by a fine not exceeding Five Thousand Pesos (P 5,000.00) for each violation.

12 SECTION 6. *Separability Clause.* - If any provision or part thereof is held invalid or 13 unconstitutional, the remainder of the law or the provision not otherwise affected shall remain 14 valid and subsisting.

15 SECTION 7. *Repealing Clause.* - Any law, presidential decree or issuance, executive 16 order, letter of instruction, administrative order, rule, or regulation contrary to or inconsistent 17 with the provisions of this Act is hereby repealed, modified, or amended accordingly.

18 SECTION 8. *Effectivity Clause.* - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its 19 publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
