EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Constitution, Article 11, Section 17, provides:

The State shall give priority to education, science and technology, arts, culture, and sports to foster patriotism and nationalism, accelerate social progress, and promote total human liberation and development.

Low salaries and the declining status of the teaching profession have reduced the quantity and quality of individuals entering the teaching profession. The government must expend efforts to address the existing and impending teaching shortage in the country. Bringing talented individuals into the teaching profession will greatly enhance the quality of our education, achieving success in adding the traditional education of students.

Hence, this bill seeks to establish national teacher academies in order to encourage and facilitate entry into the teaching profession.*

- SECTION 16. Separability Clause. If any provision or part thereof is held invalid or unconstitutional, the remainder of the law or the provision not otherwise affected shall remain
- 9 SECTION 17. Repealing Clause. Any law, presidential decree or issuance, executive 10 order, letter of instruction, administrative order, rule, or regulation contrary to or inconsistent 11 with the provisions of this Act is hereby repealed, modified, or amended accordingly.
- SECTION 18. *Effectivity Clause*. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
