AN ACT DECLARING THE SECOND DISTRICT OF SORSOGON A MINING-FREE ZONE AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF
Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:
SECTION 1. Declaration of Policy. The Second District of Sorsogor
is hereby declared a mining-free zone and all mining operations therein are
hereby prohibited.
SEC. 2. Coverage As used in this Act, mining refers to the
extraction of valuable minerals or other geological materials, excluding grave
and sand. This shall include small-scale and large-scale mining activities
involving exploration, feasibility studies and development, utilization, and
processing of materials.
SEC. 3. Prohibition and Penalties It shall be unlawful for any
person to mine or continue to mine or engage in any mining operation in the
Second District of Sorsogon: <i>Provided</i> , That the State shall be allowed to
undertake mineral exploration activities in the area for research and data
gathering purposes.

Any person violating the provisions of this section shall be penalized
with imprisonment of at least three (3) years but not more than six (6) years
and a fine of at least two hundred fifty thousand pesos (P250,000.00) but not
more than five hundred thousand pesos (P500,000.00).

If the offender is a corporation, firm, partnership or association, the penalty shall be imposed upon the officer or officers of the corporation, firm, partnership or association responsible for the violation thereof.

If the offender is an alien, after service of sentence and payment of fine, the person shall be deported immediately without further proceedings.

- SEC. 4. Transitory Provision. Upon approval of this Act, the Provincial Government of Sorsogon, in coordination with the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR), shall review the contracts, agreements and permits entered into and/or issued to all existing mining operations and determine those to be terminated and those to be allowed to continue until such period that their contracts, agreements or permits may allow.
- SEC. 5. Implementing Rules and Regulations. Within one (1) month after the effectivity of this Act, the Secretary of the DENR shall promulgate the necessary rules and regulations for its effective implementation.
- SEC. 6. Repealing Clause. All laws, decrees, orders, rules and regulations or parts thereof that are inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.
- SEC. 7. Effectivity. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.
