TO IMPROVE THE EFFICIENCY OF NATIONAL RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Constitution, Article 14, Section 10 provides:

SEC. 10. Science and Technology are essential for national development and progress. The State shall give priority to research and development, invention, innovation, and their utilization; and to science and technology education, training, and services. It shall support indigenous, appropriate, and self-reliant scientific and technological capabilities, and their application to the country's productive systems and national life.

Research and development is an essential part of science and technology. It is important not only for our collective intellectual growth but also for our progress as a nation. As such, we need to ensure that bureaucratic processes will not hinder our efforts and simplify the government requirements to allow the people behind the research and development activities to focus on their studies.

This bill seeks to establish under the Office of the President a Research and Development Support Committee (RDSC) who shall be responsible for reviewing regulations affecting research and research universities.





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Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

4 5	SECTION 1. Short Title – This Act shall be known as "Research and
6	Development Efficiency Act'."
7	SECTION 2. Declaration of Policy. – It shall be the policy of the state
8	to ensure that all efforts towards research and development shall be efficient
9	and effective.
10	SECTION 3. Research and Development Audit Committee. – There
11	shall be established under the Office of the President a Research and
12	Development Support Committee (RDSC) who shall be responsible for
13	reviewing regulations affecting research and research universities and
14	making recommendations on how to:
15	a. harmonize, streamline, and eliminate duplicative regulations and
16 [.]	reporting requirements; and
17	b. minimize the regulatory burden on institutions of higher education
18	performing government funded research while maintaining
19	accountability for expenditures.
20	SECTION 4. Stakeholder Input. – In carrying out the responsibilities
21	under Section 3, the RDSC shall take into account input and
22	recommendations from stakeholders, including national and local

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government funded researchers, institutions of higher education, scientific
disciplinary societies and associations, nonprofit research institutions,
industry, including small businesses, government funded research and
development centers, and others with a stake in ensuring effectiveness,
efficiency, and accountability in the performance of scientific research.

6 SECTION 5. *Report.* – Not later than 1 year after the date of 7 enactment of this Act, and annually thereafter for 3 years, the Director shall 8 report to the appropriate committees in the Senate and the House of 9 Representatives on what steps have been taken to carry out the 10 recommendations of the working group established under Section 3.

11 SECTION 6. *Term.* – The term of RDSC shall be three (3) years.

12 SECTION 7. *Repealing Clause.* – Any law, presidential decree or 13 issuance, executive order, letter of instruction, administrative order, rule or 14 regulation contrary to or inconsistent with this Act is hereby repealed, 15 modified, or amended accordingly.

16 SECTION 8. *Effectivity Clause.* – This Act shall take effect fifteen 17 (15) days after its publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general 18 circulation.
