## A RESOLUTION

DIRECTING THE SENATE COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC SERVICES TO CONDUCT AN INQUIRY AND ASSESSMENT, IN AID OF LEGISLATION, TOWARDS CRAFTING A COMPREHENSIVE, INTEGRATED AND INTERDISCIPLINARY APPROACH IN ROAD MANAGEMENT WITH THE END IN VIEW OF ENACTING A LEGISLATION THAT WILL ADDRESS ROAD PROBLEMS

- Whereas, in a study conducted by the Japan International Cooperation Agency, it was revealed that the Metro Manila's congestion problem is costing the economy P2.4-Billion a day in 2012, and will rise to P6-Billion a day if we fail to address this problem of traffic in the Metro;
- Whereas, not only money is lost due to traffic problems. There is a corresponding health risk in the steadily increasing number of vehicles plying along our highways. Time and energy are also wasted because of the hassle brought about by the congestion problem;
- Whereas, it can be said that the traffic problem in the country has now reached critical levels in the sense that movement of people and goods has become limited, inefficient and unsafe;
- Whereas, travelling in our major thoroughfares has become a bane that adversely affect the economy, and more importantly the general well-being of Filipinos;
- Whereas, it becomes imperative that we come up with a comprehensive, integrated and interdisciplinary approach to road management;
- Whereas, government efforts should be harmonized towards achieving a traffic decongestion roadmap that will ease the people's everyday travel burden.

*Be it resolved*, as it is hereby resolved, to direct the Senate Committee on Public Services to conduct and inquiry and assessment, in aid of legislation, towards crafting a comprehensive, integrated and interdisciplinary approach in road management with the end in view of enacting a legislation that will address road problems.
