

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR A SYSTEM OF ABSENTEE VOTING FOR QUALIFIED MEMBERS OF THE ELECTORAL STAFF OF NATIONAL CANDIDATES AND ACCREDITED NATIONAL POLITICAL PARTIES AND PARTY-LISTS, AND ELECTION LAWYERS

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Declaration of Policy. – It is the policy of the State to ensure the free exercise of the right of suffrage by all citizens of the Philippines not otherwise disqualified by law.

SECTION 2. Local Absentee Voting for the Electoral Staff of National
Candidates and Accredited National Political Parties. — The Commission on
Elections (COMELEC) shall extend the right to vote under the local absentee
voting system provided under existing laws and executive orders, to the

electoral staff of national candidates, except candidates for

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district

representative, and accredited national political parties and party-lists, who are 1 duly registered voters, and who, on election day, may not be able to vote due to 2 the performance of their functions as electoral staff in the conduct, monitoring, 3 and ensuring the integrity of election-related activities.

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For purposes of this Act, the number of electoral staff of a national candidate, an accredited national political party, or an accredited party-list that may avail of the right to vote under the local absentee voting system shall be limited to the total number of provinces, highly urbanized cities, and independent component cities.

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SECTION 3. Local Absentee Voting for Election Lawyers. – The COMELEC shall extend the right to vote under the local absentee voting system provided under existing laws and executive orders to members of the Integrated Bar of the Philippines, who are duly registered voters, and who, on election day, may not be able to vote due to the performance of their functions in monitoring the observance of laws during the elections.

For purposes of this Act only, a maximum of three (3) election lawyers per candidate, accredited national political party, or accredited party-list shall be allowed to avail of the right to vote under the local absentee voting system.

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SECTION 4. Limitations. – Persons covered by this Act shall only be allowed to vote for the positions of President, Vice-President, Senators, and Party-List Representative.

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SECTION 5. Implementing Rules and Regulations. - The COMELEC shall, within thirty (30) days from the effectivity of this Act, promulgate the implementing rules and regulations which shall include a system of

1	accreditation and verification of the electoral staff of national candidates and
2	accredited national political parties and party-lists, and of election lawyers, who
3	are qualified to avail of local absentee voting.
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5	SECTION 6. Appropriations The amount necessary for the
6	implementation and enforcement of this Act shall be charged against the current
7	year's appropriations or from any available savings of the COMELEC.
8	Thereafter, such amount as may be necessary for the continued implementation

of this Act shall be included in the General Appropriations Act.

SECTION 7. Repealing Clause. – All laws, decrees, orders, and issuances, or portions thereof, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, are hereby repealed, amended, or modified accordingly.

SECTION 8. Separability Clause. – Should any provision of this Act or part hereof be declared unconstitutional, the other provisions or parts not affected thereby shall remain valid and effective.

SECTION 9. Effectivity. – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
