#### AN ACT

#### PROVIDING FOR AFFORDABLE DRUG REHABILITATION TREATMENT FOR PHILIPPINE HEALTH INSURANCE CORPORATION (PHIC) BENEFICIARIES, FURTHER AMENDING REPUBLIC ACT 7875, AS AMENDED

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

**SECTION 1.** Declaration of Policy. It is a declared policy of the State to adopt an integrated and comprehensive approach to health development including the rehabilitation treatment of drug dependents and individuals victimized by the menace of drug abuse. With the alarming and continuously increasing drug addiction in the country, a faceless enemy that ruins countless lives and cripples the potentials of our youth, the State affirms a policy of society against drugs and for the purpose, provides affordable drug rehabilitation treatment for Philippine Health Insurance Corporation beneficiaries.

SEC. 2. Section 4 of Republic Act No. 7875, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as
follows:

- 9 "Section 4. Definition of Terms. For the purpose of this Act, the following terms shall
  10 be defined as follows:
- 11 XXX

ZZ) DRUG DEPENDENT - AS DEFINED UNDER RA 9165 12 (COMPREHENSIVE DANGEROUS DRUGS ACT OF 2002), A PERSON 13 EXHIBITING A CLUSTER OF PHYSIOLOGICAL, BEHAVIORAL AND 14 COGNITIVE PHENOMENA OF VARIABLE INTENSITY, IN WHICH THE 15 USE OF PSYCHOACTIVE DRUG TAKES ON A HIGH PRIORITY THEREBY 16 INVOLVING, AMONG OTHERS, A STRONG DESIRE OR A SENSE OF 17 COMPULSION TO TAKE THE SUBSTANCE AND THE DIFFICULTIES IN 18 CONTROLLING SUBSTANCE-TAKING BEHAVIOR IN TERMS OF ITS 19 ONSET, TERMINATION, OR LEVELS OF USE. 20

- 21 SEC. 3. Section 10 of the same Act is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 22 "Section10. Benefit Package.-
- 23 Members and their dependents are entitled to the following minimum services, subject 24 to the limitations specified in this Act and as may be determined by the Corporation"

26 d) Such other health care services that the Corporation and the DOH shall determine to27 be appropriate and cost-effective.

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2	These services and packages shall be reviewed annually to determine their financial
3	sustainability and relevance to health innovations, with the end in view of quality
4	assurance, increased benefits and reduced out- of- pocket expenditures[-]; AND

6	E) REHABILITATION TREATMENT OF DRUG DEPENDENTS
7	(1) ROOM AND BOARD;
8	(2) SERVICES OF HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONALS
9	(3) PRESCRIPTION DRUGS AND BIOLOGICALS, SUBJECT TO THE

16	<b>SEC. 4.</b> Implementing Rules and Regulations. The Philippine Health Insurance Corporation
17	(PHIC) shall issue the necessary implementing rules and regulations in consultation with the Dangerous
18	Drugs Board and relevant sectors for the effective implementation of this Act.
19	SEC. 5. Repealing Clause. All laws, issuances, or parts thereof inconsistent with this Act are
20	hereby repealed or modified accordingly.
21	SEC. 6. Effectivity. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the Official
22	Gazette or in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation, whichever comes earlier.
