REQUIRING A VEHICLE PROCEEDING UPON A HIGHWAY AT A SPEED LESS THAN THE NORMAL SPEED OF TRAFFIC TO DRIVE IN THE RIGHT-HAND LANE FOR TRAFFIC OR AS CLOSE AS PRACTICABLE TO THE RIGHT-HAND EDGE OR CURB

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Slow-moving vehicles in the highway usually impede the flow of traffic or cause traffic hazards.

The proposed bill states that any vehicle proceeding upon a highway at a speed less than the normal speed of traffic moving in the same direction at such time shall be driven in the right-hand lane for traffic or as close as practicable to the right-hand edge or curb, except when overtaking and passing another vehicle proceeding in the same direction or when preparing for a left turn at an intersection or into a private road or driveway.

The purpose of the proposed bill is to help limit the number of traffic hazards and unnecessary traffic delays on the public roadways. When a vehicle is moving significantly slower than the posted speed limit, it causes other vehicles to have to pass them. When driving on a two lane road, these passing vehicles are by necessity having to travel in the same lane that oncoming traffic is driving in, increasing the chance of an accident.¹

REQUIRING A VEHICLE PROCEEDING UPON A HIGHWAY AT A SPEED LESS THAN THE NORMAL SPEED OF TRAFFIC TO DRIVE IN THE RIGHT-HAND LANE FOR TRAFFIC OR AS CLOSE AS PRACTICABLE TO THE RIGHT-HAND EDGE OR CURB

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- 1 SECTION 1. Title. - This Act shall otherwise be known as the "Slow-moving 2 Vehicles Act".
- 3 SECTION 2. Mandate. - Any vehicle proceeding upon a highway at a speed less than the normal speed of traffic moving in the same direction at such time shall be driven 4 5 in the right-hand lane for traffic or as close as practicable to the right-hand edge or curb, 6 except when overtaking and passing another vehicle proceeding in the same direction or 7 when preparing for a left turn at an intersection or into a private road or driveway.
- 8 SECTION 3. Penalty. – If a vehicle is being driven at a speed less than the normal 9 speed of traffic moving in the same direction at such time, and is not being driven in the 10 right-hand lane for traffic or as close as practicable to the right-hand edge or curb, the 11 driver of the said vehicle shall suffer the penalty of a fine in the amount of Ten Thousand 12 Pesos (₱10,000.00) or the suspension of his Driver's License for a period of three (3) 13 months.

1 SECTION 4. Traffic Signs. - The Department of Transportation and

2 Communications (DOTC), with respect to highways under their jurisdiction, may place

3 and maintain upon highways official signs directing slow-moving traffic to use the right-

4 hand traffic lane except when overtaking and passing another vehicle or preparing for a

5 left turn.

6 SECTION 5. Appropriations. – To carry out the provisions of this Act, such

amount as hereby necessary is hereby authorized to be appropriated from the National

8 Treasury.

9 SECTION 6. Separability Clause. – If any provision of this Act is held invalid or

unconstitutional, the same shall not affect the validity and effectivity of the other

provisions hereof.

12 SECTION 7. Repealing Clause. - All laws, decrees, orders, and issuances, or

portions thereof, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, are hereby

repealed, amended or modified accordingly.

SECTION 8. Effectivity Clause. – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after

its publication in the Official Gazette or in two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
