

Recommending its approval with amendments.

Sponsor: Senator Marcos, Jr.

MR. PRESIDENT:

The Committees on Local Government; Agriculture and Food; and Finance to which was referred Senate Bill No. 2093, introduced by Senator Manuel "Lito" M. Lapid, entitled:

"AN ACT

MANDATING THE APPOINTMENT OF MUNICIPAL AGRICULTURISTS IN MUNICIPALITIES WHERE AGRICULTURE IS A SIGNIFICANT INDUSTRY, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE SECTIONS 443 AND 482 (A) OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7160, AS AMENDED, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE OF 1991"

have considered the same and have the honor to report it back to the Senate with the recommendation that it be approved with the following amendments:

- 1. On page 1, line 11, after the word "officer" delete the conjunction "and" and in lieu thereof insert the punctuation mark comma "(,)";
- On the same page and line, after the word "registrar" insert the phrase "AND A MUNICIPAL AGRICULTURIST":
- 3. On the same page, line 14, after the word "officer" delete the phrase "a municipal agriculturist";

- 4. On the same page, line 17, after the word "officer" delete the punctuation mark colon "(:)" and in lieu thereof insert the punctuation mark period "(.)";
- 5. On the same page and line, delete the proposed proviso "provided that insofar as municipalities where agriculture is a significant industry or where the main livelihood is agricultural in nature, the appointment of a municipal agriculturist shall be mandatory";
- 6. On page 2, line 11, after the word "provincial" insert the phrase "AND MUNICIPAL"
- 7. On the same page and line, put a letter "s" in the word "government" to make it plural;
- 8. On the same page and line, after the word "city" put a punctuation mark period "(.);
- 9. On the same page and line, delete the following " and municipal governments: Provided, that insofar as municipalities where agriculture is a significant industry or where the main livelihood is agricultural in nature, the appointment of a municipal agriculturist shall be mandatory."
- 10. On the same page, delete lines 18 to 25 and renumber the succeeding sections accordingly;
- 11. The title of the bill should now read as follows:

"AN ACT

MANDATING THE APPOINTMENT OF AGRICULTURISTS IN MUNICIPALITIES, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSES SECTIONS 443 AND 482 (A) OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7160, AS AMENDED, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE OF 1991"



EXPLANATORY NOTE

At present, only provincial governments are mandated to appoint agriculturists in order to ensure effective representation of the agricultural sector in local government planning and coordination. The law permits the appointment of agriculturists by city and municipality governments but does not require the same.

The mandatory appointment of agriculturists at the level of the provincial government reflects the importance vested by the State in the agricultural sector. It likewise reflects recognition that the Philippines remains a largely agricultural country with many citizens dependent on farming, fishing, or husbandry as sources of livelihood.

In light thereof, the optional appointment of agriculturists at the level of smaller local government units, particularly municipalities, should be reviewed. In municipalities where the main industry is agriculture, the appointment of agriculturists to the local government unit should no longer be an option but a necessary prerequisite for local government growth. In such municipalities the interest and voice of the agricultural sector should be of paramount importance in the determination of local planning and development measures. Hence, a qualified expert in the field should be available to address constituent concerns as well as to aid in government decision-making.

The proposed measure will mandate the appointment of municipal agriculturists in municipalities where agriculture is a significant industry.

In view of the foregoing, the passage of this bill is earnestly sought.

AN ACT

MANDATING THE APPOINTMENT OF MUNICIPAL AGRICULTURISTS IN MUNICIPALITIES WHERE AGRICULTURE IS A SIGNIFICANT INDUSTRY, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE SECTIONS 443 AND 482(A) OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 7160, AS AMENDED, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE OF 1991

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Section 443 of Republic Act No. 7160, as amended, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, is hereby amended to read as follows:

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"Section 443. Officials of the Municipal Government. -

(a) There shall be in each municipality a municipal mayor, a municipal vice-mayor, sangguniang bayan members, a secretary to the sangguniang bayan, a municipal treasurer, a municipal assessor, a municipal accountant, a municipal budget officer, a municipal planning and development coordinator, a municipal engineer/building official, a municipal health officer and a municipal civil registrar.

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(b) In addition thereto, the mayor may appoint a municipal administrator, a municipal legal officer, a municipal agriculturist, a municipal environment and natural resources officer, a municipal social welfare and development officer, a municipal architect, and a municipal information officer: PROVIDED, THAT **INSOFAR** MUNICIPALITIES WHERE AGRICULTURE IS A SIGNIFICANT WHERE INDUSTRY OR THE MAIN LIVELIHOOD IS AGRICULTURAL IN NATURE, THE APPOINTMENT MUNICIPAL AGRICULTURIST SHALL BE MANDATORY."

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- **SEC. 2.** Section 482(a) of R.A. No. 7160, as amended, is hereby amended to read as follows:
 - "Section 482. Qualifications, Powers and Duties.

(a) No person shall be appointed agriculturist unless he is a citizen of the Philippines, a resident of the local government unit concerned, of good moral character, a holder of a college degree in agriculture or any related course from a recognized college or university and a first grade civil service eligible or its equivalent. He must have practiced his profession in agriculture or acquired experience in a related field for at least five (5) years in the case of the provincial and city agriculturist, and three (3) years in the case of the municipal agriculturist.

The position of the agriculturist shall be mandatory for the provincial government and optional for the city and municipal governments: PROVIDED, THAT INSOFAR AS MUNICIPALITIES WHERE AGRICULTURE IS A SIGNIFICANT INDUSTRY OR WHERE THE MAIN LIVELIHOOD IS AGRICULTURAL IN NATURE, THE APPOINTMENT OF A MUNICIPAL AGRICULTURIST SHALL BE MANDATORY."

SEC. 3. Implementing Agency. - The Department of Interior and Local Governance (DILG) and the Department of Agriculture (DA), in coordination with local government units, shall promulgate the rules and regulations necessary for the effective implementation of this Act.

SEC. 4. Appropriations Clause. ~ The amount necessary for the effective implementation of this Act shall be included in the general appropriations Act of the year following its enactment.

SEC. 5. Repealing Clause. - Other relevant provisions of the R.A. No. 7160, insofar as the appointment of agriculturists is concerned, and any law, decree, executive order, and rules and regulations, or portions thereof not consistent with this Act are hereby amended accordingly.

SEC. 6. Separability Clause. - Should any part or provision of this Act be declared unconstitutional or invalid, the remaining parts or provisions not affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.

SEC. 7. Effectivity Clause. - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
