AN ACT PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES OR FINES AGAINST ERRING PUBLIC TELECOMMUNICATIONS ENTITIES FOR VIOLATION OF THE TERMS OR CONDITIONS OF ANY CERTIFICATE, AUTHORITY, ORDER, DECISION, RESOLUTION OR REGULATION OF THE NATIONAL TELECOMMUNICATIONS COMMISSION (NTC), AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE SECTIONS 21 AND 23 OF COMMONWEALTH ACT NO. 146

Explanatory Note

For years, Filipinos have been suffering from slow and expensive Internet as they struggle to communicate with loved ones living abroad, forge deals with potential business partners and clients around the world, or simply get work done and sent quickly and efficiently.

Our collective frustrations over our country's Internet quality has been justified by studies on Internet speed and cost per country, putting the Philippines as slowest and most expensive in the region.

Being the fastest growing economy in the ASEAN, this is clearly unacceptable and measures to Improve our Internet quality while driving down its cost must be prioritized.

One of the many steps we must take is to update current policies to ensure that Internet providers are held accountable for their activities.

Thus, this measure seeks to empower the National Telecommunications Commission (NTC) by increasing the penalties and fines for violations against the authority of the NTC and Its released certificates, orders, decisions, resolutions, or regulations. With heavier penalties, NTC can expect greater compliance from Internet providers to standards and regulations that have been set to advance Internet quality in the Philippines.

Now, with the promise and potential of Innovations coming from all corners of the world, we must band together to create a framework for the constant improvement of our Internet services for the benefit of all Filipinos, especially those engaged in commerce.

When it comes to public services, we must do more than just keep up with the development of our neighbors, but exceed them. Let us band together to significantly Improve our Internet services In the Philippines.

In view of the foregoing, the passage of this measure is earnestly sought.

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Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. On Section 21 of Commonwealth Act No. 146, after the second
 paragraph, the following paragraphs shall be inserted to read as follows:

"PUBLIC TELECOMMUNICATIONS ENTITIES VIOLATING OR FAILING TO 3 COMPLY WITH THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF ANY CERTIFICATE, 4 5 AUTHORITY, ORDER, DECISION, RESOLUTION OR REGULATION OF THE NATIONAL TELECOMMUNICATIONS COMMISSION (NTC), SHALL BE 6 7 SUBJECT TO FINES AND PENALTIES OF THREE HUNDRED THOUSAND 8 PESOS (PHP 300,000.00) BUT NOT EXCEEDING FIVE MILLION PESOS (PHP 9 5,000,000.00) FOR EVERY DAY, PER VIOLATION DURING WHICH SUCH 10 DEFAULT OF VIOLATION CONTINUES; AND THE NTC IS HEREBY 11 AUTHORIZED AND EMPOWERED TO IMPOSE SUCH FINE, AFTER DUE 12 **NOTICE AND HEARING."**

13"THE FINES OR PENALTIES IMPOSED SHALL BE PAID TO THE14GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF THE PHILIPPINES THROUGH THE NTC.15FAILURE TO PAY THE FINES OR PENALTIES IN ANY CASE WITHIN THE TIME16SPECIFIED IN THE ORDER OR DECISION OF THE NTC SHALL BE DEEMED17GOOD AND SUFFICIENT REASON FOR THE SUSPENSION OF THE18CERTIFICATE OF SAID PUBLIC TELECOMMUNICATIONS ENTITY UNTIL19PAYMENT THEREOF SHALL HAVE BEEN MADE."

20 "THE NTC SHALL INCREASE THE AMOUNT OF THE FINE EVERY FIVE (5)
 21 YEARS SUBJECT TO A CERTIFICATION FROM THE NATIONAL ECONOMIC

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1DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY (NEDA) ON THE COMPUTATION OF COST OF2MONEY BASED ON THE CURRENT CONSUMER PRICE INDEX."

3 SEC. 2. On Section 23 of Commonwealth Act No. 146, a second paragraph shall
4 be inserted to read as follows:

5 "PUBLIC TELECOMMUNICATIONS ENTITIES THAT SHALL PERFORM, 6 COMMIT, OR DO ANY ACT OR THING HEREIN FORBIDDEN OR PROHIBITED 7 OR SHALL NEGLECT, FAIL, OR OMIT TO DO OR PERFORM ANY ACT OR 8 THING HEREIN REQUIRED TO BE DONE OR PERFORMED, SHALL BE 9 PUNISHED BY A FINE NOT EXCEEDING THREE HUNDRED MILLION PESOS 10 (PHP 300,000,000.00)."

SEC. 3. Separability Clause. - If any provision or part hereof is held invalid or unconstitutional, the remainder of the law or the provision not otherwise affected shall remain valid.

SEC. 4. Repealing Clause. - Section 21 and 23 of Commonwealth Act No. 146 and all other laws, decrees, orders, rules and regulations or parts thereof inconsistent with any provision of this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SEC. 5. *Effectivity.* - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after publication
in the Official Gazette or two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
