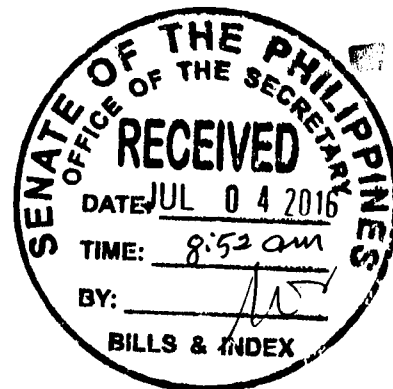

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#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

The State recognizes the role of *punong barangay* or barangay chairmen as the chief executive of the Barangay government mandated to exercise efficient, effective and economical governance and maintain peace and order for the general welfare of its barangay constituents.

Inherent to the roles of *punong barangay* are to keep peace by organizing foot patrols, arbitrate in differences between community members, assist in the conduct of elections, and facilitate the evacuation of communities in disaster-hit areas brought by natural and man-made calamities.

In the conduct of these functions, especially during emergencies and calamities, barangay chief executives are the front-liners, putting their lives at risk in the service of their respective constituents.

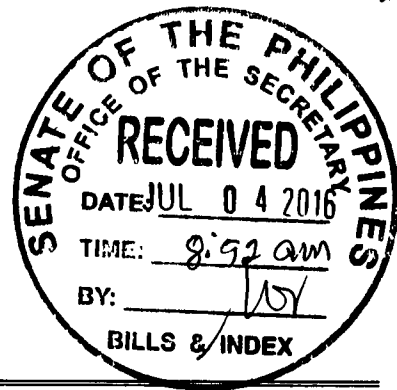
However, the State recognizes that the mandated duties of the barangay chairmen are not commensurate to their meager honoraria, allowances and other emoluments. Similarly, barangay chief executives are not entitled with hazard duty pay.

The associated risks of their functions also place higher premium to their insurance coverage. Most importantly, the present insurance benefits provided to all government officials, including all *punong barangay*, pursuant to Republic Act. No. 8291 (An Act Amending Presidential Decree 1146 as amended, expanding and increasing the coverage and benefits of Government Services and Insurance System (GSIS), instituting reforms therein, and for other purposes) is construed inadequate with regard to the payment of medical, death and burial expenses.

Hence, this bill seeks to provide additional insurance benefits to barangay chief executives over and above what they are currently receiving from GSIS in recognition of their contribution to the community and in advancing their welfare as public servants.

In view of the foregoing, immediate approval of this bill is earnestly requested.

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AN ACT  
GRANTING ADDITIONAL INSURANCE BENEFITS TO BARANGAY  
CHAIRMEN, PROVIDING FUNDS FOR THE PAYMENT OF ITS  
PREMIUMS, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines  
in Congress assembled:*

1 SECTION 1. *Short Title.* - This Act shall be known as the "Additional  
2 Barangay Captains' Insurance Act of 2016".

3 SEC. 2. *Additional Insurance Benefits for Barangay Captains.* - In addition  
4 to the insurance benefits given to the Barangay Captains by the Government Service  
5 Insurance System (GSIS) under Republic Act No. 8291, a term insurance coverage  
6 to all barangay captains providing the following benefits shall be granted:

7 1. Death Benefits P200,000.00

8 (a) due to assassination or ambush

9 (b) due to accidents and other similar

10 circumstances while in the discharge

11 of their official functions

12 2. Burial Expenses P 50,000.00

13 3. Reimbursement of Actual Medical

14 Expenses not to exceed P100,000.00

15 on ambushes, attempted assassinations not resulting in death,

1 accidents and other similar circumstances while in the discharge  
2 of their official functions

3 SEC. 3. *Disqualification from benefits.* - No benefits shall be given to any  
4 barangay captain or his/her beneficiaries when the injury, sickness or death was  
5 occasioned or caused by any of the following:

6 (a) habitual drunkenness or intoxication;

7 (b) willful intention to injure or kill oneself;

8 (c) notorious negligence;

9 (d) unauthorized absence or abandonment of office for at least one (1) month  
10 prior to death or accident.

11 SEC. 4. *Actuarial Study.* - The GSIS shall, within sixty (60) days from the  
12 effectivity of this Act, conduct an actuarial study to determine the premiums to be  
13 paid corresponding to the benefits to be granted to barangay captains in accordance  
14 with the schedule provided in Section 2.

15 SEC. 5. *Appropriation.* - The National Government shall appropriate  
16 annually and include in the General Appropriations Act an amount corresponding to  
17 the total annual insurance premiums of the barangay captains based on the actuarial  
18 study under Section 4 hereof.

19 SEC. 6. *Implementing Rules and Regulations.* - The GSIS, in coordination  
20 with the Department of Interior and Local Government, shall promulgate the rules  
21 and regulations necessary to implement the provisions of this Act.

22 SEC. 7. *Separability Clause.* - If for any reason any provision or section of  
23 this Act is declared unconstitutional, such portions not affected thereby shall remain  
24 in full force and effect.

1           SEC. 8. *Repealing Clause.* - All laws, decrees, executive orders, rules and  
2 regulations inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed or  
3 modified accordingly.

4           SEC. 9. *Effectivity.* - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its  
5 complete publication in the Official Gazette or in at least two (2) newspapers of  
6 general circulation.
