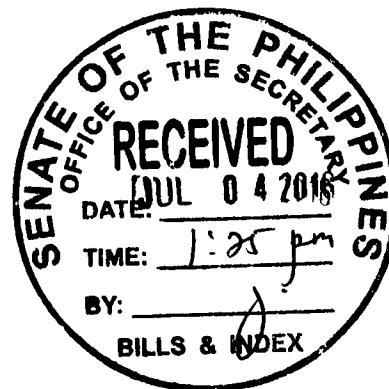

**AN ACT ESTABLISHING A NATIONAL PROGRAM FOR THE MALUNGGAY
INDUSTRY, APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES**

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Moringa oleifera, or most commonly known as Malunggay, is usually, found in the backyards of most Filipino homes. Grown, with little to no maintenance, has taken the moniker, "The Miracle Tree", because all of its parts including leaves, pods, bark, seeds, fruits and roots have nutritional and healing properties.

Nearly all may assume that Malunggay is not at par with other vegetables, but many will be surprised of its versatility and capacity to contribute not only in feeding hungry mouths but also in revitalizing and strengthening people's physical well-being and socio-economic development.

Malunggay is a source of vitamins A and C, calcium, potassium, protein, and zinc, needed by children and adults alike. In the Philippines, Malunggay's leaves are customarily used in chicken soup and fish courses. Nowadays, Filipinos venture into the practice of adding these leaves to pastries and pasta dishes. Even its roots and seeds are used as seasoning.

Malunggay is further known to produce the most natural oil and is used in cooking and making salad. Its quality is being compared with olive oil.

Long used as traditional medicine, the Moringga plant has been acclaimed for its medicinal value. It is used to treat wounds, skin infections, cough, fever and respiratory ailments and improve lactation experienced by pregnant mothers.

It also has antioxidants properties and has been used by beauty and cosmetic companies in manufacturing skin care products. Additionally, it is also proven to have anti-aging, anti-diabetic, anti-tumor, and anti-microbial properties.

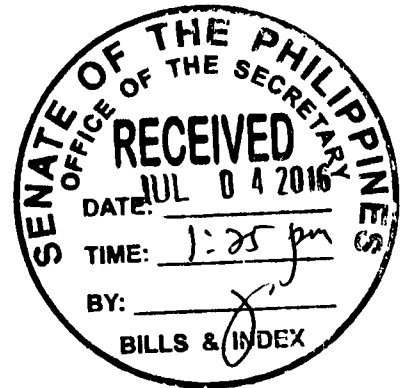
Malunggay, has also been a very profitable source of livelihood for the marginalized sector. The plant has been processed into noodles, cookies, pretzels, and pan de sal. AN ACT ESTABLISHING A NATIONAL PROGRAM FOR THE MALUNGGAY INDUSTRY, APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- 1 SECTION 1. Title - This act shall be known as the "Malunggay Development Act of
2 2016."
- 3 SECTION 2. Declaration of Policy. - It is hereby declared the policy of the State to
4 continuously develop the promising industry of Malunggay as an agribusiness and a
5 major source of pharmaceutic properties through improvement of research and
6 development, promote it as a means of livelihood for poverty alleviation, maximize its
7 utilization for health and nutrition, and discover its other potential co-products.
- 8 SECTION 3. Development of the Malunggay Industry. - The Department of Agriculture
9 (DA), in consultation with the Department of Science and Technology, state
10 universities and colleges, farmer groups, local government units, and the private
11 sector, shall formulate necessary measures, programs and projects for the
12 advancement and industry-wide development of Malunggay, as follows:

1 Industry-wide development

2
3 1. Appropriate land usage for Malunggay to increase and sustain its productivity
4 and agricultural output.

5
6 2. Organize systematic programs that could improve production of Malunggay
7 through its seeding, cultivation, harvesting, and proper processing.

8
9 3. Augment intensive scientific research and studies over the propagation of
10 Moringa oleifera to maximize and verify its nutritional and medicinal properties,
11 and to diversify its other possible uses.

12
13 4. Disseminate Malunggay's uses and benefits, along with its products, to stir
14 awareness through the public by the use of advertising, mass media, and
15 information tools.

16
17 a. Share information on agricultural and manufacturing practice to determine
18 market opportunities for potential stakeholders.

19 b. Collaborate with different organizations whose incorporators are concerned
20 with promotion of information and statistics on Malunggay industry.

21
22 5. Explore possibility of Malunggay as a useful agricultural input (fertilizer) and
23 animal feed to the farming sector, which can lessen their expenses over
24 commercialized ones.

25 6. Survey Malunggay's potential as an organic wonder in the international
26 markets and prepare it as one of Philippines' major commercial products.

27
28 7. Develop the Malunggay food industry and incorporate its different parts
29 through food preparation, various recipes and diet because of its healthy
30 contribution to the people's well-being.

31
32 8. Create Malunggay communal fields and gardens for those in the marginalized
33 or rural areas as to address their problems in food and health care and to
34 somehow attain self-sufficiency in the rising needs of today's populace.

35
36 9. Initiate alternative livelihood projects involving Malunggay for poverty
37 alleviation and development of new products derived from them.

38
39 SECTION 4. Malunggay's energy potential. - Invest on the biofuel potential of
40 Malunggay oil as a sustainable alternative to fossil fuel for the country's power
41 generation.

42
43 SECTION 5. National Malunggay Month. - In recognition and providing importance
44 to the the health, social, agricultural, and environmental value of the Malunggay plant,
45 the month of November will be declared as the National Malunggay Month.

1 SECTION 6. Malunggay Development Fund (MDF). - To provide for the funding
2 requirements for the production, marketing, and processing of malunggay, there is
3 hereby created a Malunggay Development Fund (MDF), with an initial amount of Fifty
4 Million Pesos (P50, 000, 000.00) to be taken from the existing budget of the
5 Department of Agriculture. Thereafter, the MDF shall be sourced from the amounts be
6 appropriated in the General Appropriations Act in the year following its enactment into
7 law.

8
9 SECTION 7. Repealing Clause. - All laws, orders, decrees, rules and regulations, or any
10 part thereof, which are inconsistent with this Act are hereby amended, repealed or
11 modified accordingly.

12
13 SECTION 8. Effectivity Clause. - This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after
14 its publication in any newspaper of general circulation in the Philippines.
