

AN ACT RECOGNIZING SERIOUS PHYSICAL AND SEXUAL ABUSE AS GROUND FOR LEGAL SEPARATION, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE ARTICLE 55 (1) OF THE FAMILY CODE OF THE PHILIPPINES

Explanatory Note

This measure seeks to recognize serious physical and sexual abuse as additional ground for legal separation under Article 55(1) of the Family Code of the Philippines. Our current law considers only "repeated physical violence or grossly abusive conduct" as ground for legal separation.

To improve the plight of battered wives and help them avoid further abuse, immediate passage of this bill is requested.

AN ACT RECOGNIZING SERIOUS PHYSICAL AND SEXUAL ABUSE AS GROUND FOR LEGAL SEPARATION, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE ARTICLE 55 (1) OF THE FAMILY CODE OF THE PHILIPPINES

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Article 55 Section 1 is hereby amended to read as follows:

- "(1) **SERIOUS PHYSICAL OR SEXUAL VIOLENCE,** repeated physical violence or grossly abusive conduct directed against the petitioner, a common child, or a child of the petitioner;"
- **SEC. 2. Separability Clause.** If any provision of this Act is declared unconstitutional, the same shall not affect the validity and effectivity of other provisions thereof.
- **SEC. 3. Effectivity.** This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days following its publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
