AN ACT SUPPORTING THE PRODUCTION OF PHILIPPINE INDEPENDENT FILMS BY PROVIDING INCENTIVES TO FILMMAKERS WHO ARE GIVEN HONORS IN NOTABLE INTERNATIONAL FILM COMPETITIONS

Explanatory Note

Independent Filipino filmmakers usually work on a tight budget and seek support from various institutions that believe in the message and the social impact of the films that they produce. Despite meager resources, these filmmakers are not only able to participate but also receive major awards and special citations in various prestigious international film festivals such as the Cannes International Film Festival, British Independent Film Awards, Venice International Film Awards, and the San Sebastian International Film Festival, among many others. These independent filmmakers bring honor and recognition to the country even with little support from the government.

This bill seeks to acknowledge the efforts of these world-class independent Filipino filmmakers and to further promote the production of Filipino independent films by providing financial grants and incentives to independent movie and documentary producers who are recognized in notable international film competitions.

In view of the foregoing, early passage of this bill is requested.

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Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

- SEC. 1. Short Title. This Act shall be known as "The Philippine Independent Film Incentives Act."
 - **SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy.** It is the policy of the State to promote and support the development and growth of the local film industry, in general, and the production of independent films, in particular. The State shall endeavor to discover, encourage, and honor the cinematic works of Filipino filmmakers that boldly articulate and freely interpret the Filipino experience with fresh insight and artistic integrity.
 - **SEC. 3. Grants for Award-Winning Films.** Philippine independent films that have been awarded the Best Film prize or its equivalent, or merited recognition for technical excellence, in international film competitions or cinema festivals shall be given the following incentives:
 - 3.1. A grant of Five Million Pesos (P5,000,000.00) to the producer of an award-winning full-length feature or documentary film;
 - 3.2. A grant of Three Million Pesos (P3,000,000.00), to the producer of an award-winning short feature or documentary film; and
 - 3.3. Full exemption from taxes pertaining to the screening of the film and its commercial exhibition, including those levied by the local government units (LGUs);

SEC. 4. Eligibility for Grants

4.1. To be eligible for a grant under Section 3.1, the film must be made by a Filipino filmmaker who has not yet directed more than three (3) full-length commercial feature films. The total production budget for the full-length feature or documentary should not exceed Three Million Pesos (P3,000,000.00). The film length should be at least 90 minutes;

4.2. To be eligible for a grant under Section 3.2., the film must be made by a Filipino filmmaker. The total production budget for the short feature or documentary film should not exceed One Million Pesos (P1,000,000.00). The film length should not be more than 20 minutes.

All films should not have been produced by commercial producers to guarantee the filmmakers' creative control over the film.

SEC. 5. Implementing Agency. – The National Commission for Culture and the Arts (NCCA) is hereby mandated as the implementing agency of this Act. The NCCA, shall, within sixty (60) days from the effectivity of this Act, promulgate rules and regulations to implement this Act, which shall include a listing of the recognized international film competitions or cinema festivals for which a grant under Sec. 3 shall be allowed.

SEC. 6. Appropriations. – A special fund amounting to Fifty Million Pesos (P50,000,000.00) which shall be sourced from the funds of the Philippine Amusement and Gaming Corporation (PAGCOR) is hereby created. Other amounts as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this Act, are hereby authorized to be appropriated from the National Treasury.

SEC. 7. Separability Clause. – If any provision or part hereof is held invalid or unconstitutional, the remainder of the Act or the provision not otherwise affected shall remain valid and subsisting.

SEC. 8. Repealing Clause. – All laws, decrees, orders, and issuances, or portions thereof, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.

SEC. 9. Effectivity. – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the *Official Gazette* or in two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
