AN ACT ESTABLISHING CANCER CARE CENTERS AND A CANCER ASSISTANCE FUND FOR INDIGENTS, PROVIDING FUNDS THEREFOR AND OTHER PURPOSES

Explanatory Note

Cancer has been one of the leading causes of death in the Philippines, after communicable and cardiovascular diseases. Many Filipino families, who have been affected by cancer, understand the financial and emotional burden that the disease entails.

This bill thus seeks to establish regional centers that would promote cancer awareness and prevention. It also aims to establish a Cancer Assistance Fund that will assist indigent families of cancer patients.

Immediate passage of this measure is thus earnestly requested.

AN ACT ESTABLISHING CANCER CARE CENTERS AND A CANCER ASSISTANCE FUND FOR INDIGENTS, PROVIDING FUNDS THEREFOR AND OTHER PURPOSES

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representative of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Title. – This Act shall be known as the "Cancer Care Center Act."

SEC. 2. Declaration of Policy. – It is hereby declared the policy of the State to protect and promote the right of the people.

SEC. 3. Research, Demonstration Projects, Education and Training. – With respect to the prevention, control, and elimination of cancer, the Secretary of Health shall, directly or through grants to public or non-profit private entities, carry out the following:

1. Research, with priority given to research concerning:

- (a) Diagnosis and treatment of cancer;
- (b) Strains of cancer resistant to drugs;
- (c) Cases of cancer that affect certain populations; and
- (d) Clinical trial

 2. Public information and education programs;

- 3. Education, training and clinical skills improvement activities for health professional;
- 4. Support of model centers to carry out activities under paragraphs (1) through (3);
- 5. Collaboration with international organizations and foreign countries in carrying out such activities; and
- 6. Enhancement of basic and clinical research on cancer and its relation to other diseases.
- **SEC. 4. Establishment of Regional Centers.** The Secretary of Health shall establish regional centers for cancer care prevention and treatment.

- **SEC. 5. Education Programs.** The Secretary of Health, in coordination with the Commission on Higher Education, shall encourage faculty of schools of medicine, nursing or osteopathic medicine to intensify their program for information and education programs, including the development of curricula, to significantly increase the opportunities for students and for practicing providers to learn the principles and practices of preventing, managing, and treatment cancer.
- **SEC. 6. Cancer Assistance Fund.** To provide indigent cancer patients and families with premium assistance, a Cancer Assistance Fund is hereby established to be administered by the Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth). Indigents are prioritized to access the said fund, to be identified by Philhealth and the Department of Social Welfare and Development.
- SEC. 7. Separability Clause. If any provision or part hereof, is held invalid or unconstitutional, the remainder of the law of the provision not otherwise affected shall remain valid and subsisting.
- SEC. 8. Repealing Clause. Any law, presidential decree or issuance, executive order, letter of instruction, administrative order, rule or regulation contrary to or inconsistent with the provision of this Act is hereby repealed, modified or amended accordingly.
- SEC. 9. Effectivity Clause. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
